Financial summary:	The creation of ARP at Clockhouse Primary School is expected to cost in the region of £300,000, funded from the Phase 3 school expansion programme. Revenue implications for the school will be funded from DSG.

#### Part A – Report seeking decision

#### DETAIL OF THE DECISION REQUESTED AND RECOMMENDED ACTION

To approve the statutory proposal to add Additional Resourced Provision at Clockhouse Primary School

#### Recommendation

To make a decision on the addition of an Additional Resourced Provision at Clockhouse Primary School as set out in the Decision –maker guidance – Appendix 1 and to include this scheme within the 16/17 Capital Programme.

#### **AUTHORITY UNDER WHICH DECISION IS MADE**

Cabinet agreed, at its meeting on 4 November 2015, to delegate the power to take further decisions regarding the approval of which settings/schools should be expanded (subject to the appropriate statutory processes) for Phase 3 of the Expansion Programme to the Cabinet Member for Children & Learning and Cabinet Member for Value, following consideration of the above, subject to budgetary provision being confirmed.

#### STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR THE DECISION

Following the Cabinet decision of 4 November 2015 and subsequent informal consultation with schools, officers have identified outline proposals for increasing the number of SEN places as from January 2017 onwards.

Informal consultation on the Programme of additionally resourced provision (ARP) for 2016/17 took place from the 12 May 2016 to 10 June 2016.

Following the informal consultation process above, the Assistant Director for Learning and Achievement signed the (Non key) Executive Decision on 22/06/2016 to proceed to the representation stage.

The LA is required to follow a statutory process to establish / remove / alter SEN provision in a mainstream school.

A Statutory Notice, that included details of the proposal, was published in the Romford Recorder on 24 June 2016, the notice was also fixed to the entrance gate of the school and published on the Council's website with a link to further information about the

proposal.

During the representation period, one comment was received in support of the proposal.

The comment received is attached as Appendix 2

#### OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED

Pupils with complex SEN could also be educated within special schools. Expansion of existing special schools is not feasible within the required timeframe due to space constraints. Development of a new special school is extremely costly and has a long lead in time and as such is not an option in the short term.

The Council is therefore looking to increasing capacity within its existing resources and is focusing on developing new provision within its own schools. It is therefore proposing to create a number of Additionally Resourced Provision in the mainstream schools (ARPs), particularly in the areas where there are shortages of provision.

#### Part B - Assessment of implications and risks

#### LEGAL IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

In relation to provision for special educational needs in a mainstream school, the LA has to follow a statutory process including consultation for –

- (a) The establishment of a provision that is recognised by the local authority as reserved for children with special educational needs;
- (b) A change in the type, or types of special educational provision that is recognised by the local authority as reserved for children with special educational needs; or
- (c) The discontinuance of provision which is recognised by the local authority as reserved for children with special educational needs

Regulation 5 School Organisation (Prescribed Alterations to Maintained Schools) (England) Regulations 2013/3110

The proposals are in line with these statutory requirements.

With any consultation process the decision maker must conscientiously take into consideration any responses, although in this case the only representation is a comment in support and therefore there are minimal risks in adopting this proposal.

#### Revenue Implications for schools

Funding to LAs for pupils with behavioural or special educational needs is allocated to LAs through the High Needs Block of the Dedicated Schools Grant (DSG). The Additional Resource Provision at Clockhouse will be funded at £10,000 per place from the High Needs Block as required by the Schools and Early Years Finance Regulations (England) 2015. The Additional Resourced Provisions will help increase capacity and ultimately

reduce the costs of expensive out of borough provision.

Funding will be allocated as follows:

Clockhouse Primary 12 places @ £10,000 per place = £120,000

#### Risks

As with most capital schemes, there is a risk that the schemes could overspend due to issues arising during the build process, however given the size of the works any significant overspend is unlikely. Any small issues arising can be funded from the remaining budget within the school expansion programme.

The human resources implications for the schools to be proposed for creating Additionally Resourced Provision will be managed by the schools themselves. There is likely to be a need to recruit additional teaching and support staff and the relevant schools will undertake the recruitment and selection process in accordance with the appropriate policies and procedures. There are growing difficulties in recruiting to teaching posts and therefore schools will need to consider that additional resources and a longer recruitment timescale may be required to fill vacancies. The Havering Education HR service will provide support as appropriate and required to all schools, academies or free schools that purchase relevant services.

In Havering we are committed to developing the most inclusive communities which are welcoming and supportive of all. Our aspiration for all our children and young people are the same and this is that they should all have the best opportunities to achieve and fulfil their potential.
