This application for a premises licence is made by Shell UK Oil Products Limited under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003. The application was received by Havering's Licensing Authority on 22nd March 2018.

This is a well-established convenience store which is due to be refurbished later this year. The site trades under Shell UK Oil Products Limited and is operated by Elanganathapillai Vaasavan. A jet wash is located on site. There are no facilities on site for the maintenance and/or sale of motor vehicles. The convenience store has a retail area of approximately 440 sq ft. The purpose built store has been designed to serve both the local community along with passing trade. The convenience store operates 24 hours per day, seven days per week under the company's own format. The store stocks a range of fresh foods and dairy produce, groceries and other domestic products and will also offer 'express' lunch facilities. In addition dry fuel products such as BBQ charcoal/kindling/logs will be available. Off sales are a standard and expected feature of the convenience store service. The internal and external digital CCTV system will benefit from a recorder and recordings can be made available to Police and other enforcement agencies as needed. The convenience store will be operated by the Manager assisted by a team of full and part time staff. The Designated Premises Supervisor, is trained and certified through an accredited scheme and is responsible for training all staff- utilising the Lockett & Co Due Diligence package-and keeping complete training records. The Challenge 25 trading initiative will be used supported by the refusals system with records kept in the Refusals Log. An overview of the content of the Lockett & Co Due Diligence package has been sent to the Licensing Authority today via separate email for reference.

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NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- oces not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the following documents (which do not need to be certified).

Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is A British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A **current** Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A **current** passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A **current** Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in the UK, **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A full birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK which includes the name(s) of at least one of the holder's
 parents or adoptive parents, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's
 permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A **current** passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

- A **current** Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A **current** Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A **current** Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, **less than 6 months old**, issued by the Home Office under regulation 17(3) or 18A (2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2006, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
 - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
 - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
 - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
 - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
 - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities. If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

(i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;

(ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;

(iii) any page containing the holder's signature;

(iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and

(v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work.

If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.

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NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.



Dear Sir/Madam Licence Act 2003 – Premises Licence Application Shell Service Station 168-170 St Mary's Lane, Upminster.

I make an objection to this licence application on the grounds of:

- 1. The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- 2. Public Safety
- 3. The Prevention of public nuisance

My specific comments are listed below.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

That the applicant and licensees have not shown that they are taking a proactive approach to prevent conflict and anti-social behaviour within the surrounding area, and to make an important difference to the level of alcohol related crime within the residential area.

No account has been taken that, with late night take-away premises in close vicinity, such sales could contribute to anti-social behaviour and disorder, where alcohol bought after normal pub hours is consumed on the street by people using the take-away premises.

Public Safety:

No dedicated parking spaces for off sales only have been designated.

No measures to stop street drinkers congregating on forecourt or blocking public highways.

Prevention of Public Nuisance:

The applicant and licensees have not shown that they are taking a proactive approach to put measures in place to prevent and manage excessive noise and nuisance coming from the premises, which is in a residential area. No account has been taken to ensure that no disturbance to residents occurs during the night due to an increase in customers arriving and leaving the premises.

No measures are shown as to how to restrict street drinkers congregating on the forecourt causing a nuisance.

The granting of this application would add to the disturbance from external lighting, odours and noise from plant during longer opening hours.

There are currently no late-night alcohol sales within close proximity to this residential area. There are two late-night take-away outlets in close proximity to the Shell Service Station. The granting of this licence will add to the existing problem of late-night noise and anti-social behaviour by drawing people into the area from elsewhere to access the late-night refreshments and buy alcohol to consume with the food on the street.

In closing the applicant indicates under general description of premises, that the Shell Service Station has 24-hour opening. This is not the case, the last application for 24-hour opening in 2001 was refused.
