

SUMMARY

This report recommends that junction improvement works at Dagnam Park Drive/Whitchurch Road are approved for implementation to support the Sustrans Connect 2 scheme, following the completion of public consultation.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. That the Committee having considered the representations made recommends to the Cabinet Member for Community Empowerment that the improvements to the junction of Dagnam Park Drive/ Whitchurch Road as detailed in this report and shown on Drawing QH013/OF/107 be implemented, including the adjustment of the Whitchurch Road refuge.
- 2. That it be noted that the estimated cost of the whole Sustrans Connect2 scheme is estimated to be £1,558,000 and will be delivered in three phases.
- 3. That it be noted that the estimated cost of this discrete element of the scheme is £45,000 and can be funded through the 2010/11 Transport for London Local Implementation Plan.

REPORT DETAIL

1.0 Background

- 1.1 At its meeting of 15th July 2009, the Council's Cabinet approved the Sustrans Connect2 scheme for the Ingrebourne Valley in principle. This approval is subject to funding (with Cabinet Member for Regeneration approvals for each phase) and various consents being in place.
- 1.2 The Council is working with Sustrans, the sustainable transport charity on the Connect2 Scheme in Havering. The scheme is supported with £700,000 of Big Lottery grant funding through Sustrans and additional Council capital funding, grants via the Transport for London Local Implementation Plan and other smaller grants and contributions.
- 1.3 The scheme's overarching aims is to improve local travel in 79 communities around the UK by creating new walking and cycling networks for everyday journeys.
- 1.4 By means of bridges, tunnels and other crossings, barriers such as busy roads, rivers and railways can be overcome to make travelling on foot or bike easier and more direct. With each new crossing linking to a local network of walking and cycling routes, there will be direct access to local schools, shops and workplaces, as well as green spaces.

- 1.5 In terms of design, the route is being designed for pedestrians, both the experienced and inexperienced cyclist and equestrian riders where possible.
- 1.6 Sustrans and the Council are promoting a scheme for the Ingrebourne Valley which will build on, connect to and improve existing routes, some of which have been in place for some time.
- 1.7 The 13 mile Ingrebourne Valley Connect2 routes starts in Noak Hill and ends at Rainham Marshes, running through Harold Hill, Harold Wood, Harold Park, Cranham, Upminster, Hornchurch, Elm Park and South Hornchurch.
- 1.7 The project is split into three phases and Phase 1 (Noak Hill to Hall Lane) is the current focus of activity.
- 1.8 There are several locations where existing roads need to be crossed, where crossing facilities need improvement, where shared-use cycletracks are required and where on-street cycling provision needs to be supported.
- 1.9 As well as any statutory consultation processes, the project is overseen by the Connect2 Steering Group which seeks to engage various stakeholders in the development of the route. The group includes Council Staff, Sustrans, local walking and cycling groups, Forestry Commission, Biodiversity groups and others as required.
- 1.10 Prior to the establishment of the Highways Advisory Committee and associated processes, some parts of the highway elements of the scheme have been approved and some elements completed.
- 1.11 One element of Phase 1 is improvement of the junction of Dagnam Park Drive and Whitchurch Road, the consultation for which was approved by the Regulatory Services Committee at its meeting of 10th December 2009.
- 1.12 The improvements are required to connect a new section of route which runs through Hatters Wood to the northeast of the junction to a new route through Central Park to the southwest of the junction. Planning consent for the route in Hatters Wood and Central Park has been granted (P0373.10).
- 1.13 The decision to implement this element was delegated to the Head of StreetCare in Consultation with the Chairman of the Regulatory Services Committee, but the establishment of the Highways Advisory Committee now requires a decision through the new process.

2.0 Consulted Proposals

2.1 Drawing QH13/OF/107A gives details of the proposals for improvements at the junction of Dagnam Park Drive and Whitchurch Road. The works would

entail local road widening at the junction to permit wider pedestrian/ cyclist refuges in Whitchurch Road and the western arm of Dagnam Park Drive and a new refuge for pedestrians and cyclists on the eastern arm of Dagnam Park Drive.

- 2.2 In addition, the proposals included footway works around the junction so that it is suitable for use as a shared facility for pedestrians and cyclists moving between Hatters Wood and Central Park and for users to join the Sustrans Connect2 route from the local area.
- 2.3 Finally, it was proposed that double yellow line parking restrictions be introduced at the junction along with Bus Stop Clearways at the three bus stops closely associated with the junction.
- 2.4 In terms of consultation, letters were hand delivered to residents potentially affected by the scheme (mainly in terms of parking restrictions). Letters were delivered on or just after 23rd April 2010, with a closing date of 21st May 2010 for any comments. Additionally, the statutory elements of the restriction element of the scheme were advertised on 8th February 2010, this element included the emergency services and other statutory consultees.
- 2.5 In response to the letters to local people and the advertisement, the emergency services and London Buses responded;
 - London Fire Brigade considered the proposals did not raise any issues for them.
 - London Ambulance Service considered the proposals did not raise any issues for them,
 - Metropolitan Police Traffic Unit supported the proposals,
 - London Buses supported the proposals, but requested the refuge in Whitchurch Road be moved north slightly to help buses turn left from Dagnam Park Drive into Whitchurch Road.

3.0 Staff Comments

3.1 The improvements to the junction are key in connecting Hatters Wood and Dagnam Park Drive in support of the overall Sustrans Connect2 scheme. The refuge highlighted by London Buses can easily be relocated north approximately 2 metres and with the road widening, will make the left turn easier. Staff therefore recommend that this element of the scheme by approved for implementation, subject to the adjustment of the refuge.

IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

Financial implications and risks:

The costs of implementing the whole scheme is estimated to be £1,558,000, delivered in three phases as set out in the Cabinet Report of 15th July 2009.

For Phase 1 the following funding is secured;

- £153,000 TfL Cycling on Greenways 09/10
- £51,500, TfL Non LCN Local Implementation Plan 09/10
- £41,000 TfL Local Implementation Plan walking 09/10
- £10,000 LBH Capital)
- £100,000 Veolia ES Cleanaway Havering Riverside Trust
- £100,000 TfL Local Implementation Plan 10/11 corridors
- £125.000 Sustrans Connect 2

The Dagnam Park Drive/ Whitchurch Road improvements are estimated to be £45,000 and this element will be funded through the TfL LIP 2010/11 funding stream.

Legal implications and risks:

Waiting restrictions require consultation and the advertisement of proposals before a decision can be taken on their introduction.

The Council may convert existing footways into cycle tracks, by technically "removing" the footway under Section 66(4) of the Highways Act 1980 as amended and "constructing" the cycle track under Section 65(1) of the Highways Act 1980 as amended.

Other issues are set out in the Cabinet Report of 15th July 2009.

Human Resources implications and risks:

None.

Equalities implications and risks:

Parking restrictions have the potential to displace parking to adjacent areas, which may be detrimental to others, but those proposed for this scheme are in the interests of maintaining the safety of those using the Connect2 route.

Blue-badge holders are able to park for up to three hours on restricted areas (unless a loading ban is in force).

Safer road crossings within the scheme will allow all sections of the community to access the Connect2 route over the existing roads.

Shared pedestrian and cycle facilities are not always seen by interest groups as desirable, but given the highway and land space available and the more leisure route it serves, it is appropriate to allow cyclists to legally use an off-carriageway section of the highway to more safely access the Connect2 route.

There will be some visual impact, due to the required signing and road markings

Other issues are set out in the Cabinet Report of 15th July 2009.



SUMMARY

This report recommends that Bus Stop Clearways be implemented in four locations on Upper Rainham Road and that the Committee decides whether or not to proceed with double yellow line parking restrictions through the same section of the street.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- That the Committee having considered the representations made recommends to the Cabinet Member for Community Empowerment that the bus stop clearways detailed in this report and shown on Drawings QG111/101A to 105A be implemented.
- 2. That the Committee having considered the representations made decides whether to recommend to the Cabinet Member for Community Empowerment that the double yellow line parking restrictions detailed in this report and shown on Drawings QG111/101A to 105A be implemented and the necessary traffic order made..
- 2. That it be noted that the estimated cost of £2,500 will be met from the Council's Minor Parking Schemes budget.

REPORT DETAIL

1.0 Background

- 1.1 At its meeting of 7th July 2009, the Elm Park & Hylands Area Committee considered proposals for the introduction of Bus Stop Clearways and "At Any Time" parking restrictions (double yellow lines) along Upper Rainham Road between Bancroft Chase and The Chase.
- 1.2 The report followed a review of the bus stops by Staff from the Traffic & Engineering Section of StreetCare, Transport for London and London Buses for possible accessibility improvements.
- 1.3 The following proposals were agreed in principle and Staff were authorised to advertise and consult on the scheme
 - Outside 255 to 265, Upper Rainham Road (Drawing QG111-01-A)
 - Opposite 241 to 25, Upper Rainham Road (Drawing QG111-02-A)
 - Outside 167 to 179, Upper Rainham Road(Drawing QG111-03-A)
 - Opposite 151 to 157, Upper Rainham Road (Drawing QG111-04-A)
 - Outside 197 to 213, Upper Rainham Road (Drawing QG111-05-A)

1.4 Approximately 80 letters were hand-delivered to the residents and businesses along the section of street potentially affected by the scheme on or just after 5th November 2009, with a closing date of 27th November 2009. In addition, the proposals were advertised.

2.0 Outcome of Public Consultation

- 2.1 By the close of consultation, 10 responses were received and are summarised in Appendix I of this report.
- 2.2 Those responding were generally in objection because of the impact on parking and reference was made about the length of the proposed bus stop clearways.
- 2.3 In addition, there were concerns that the restrictions would enable traffic to travel faster and comments were made about issues not related to the scheme.
- 2.4 Due to the level and nature of objections, the former Chairman of the Elm Park and Hylands Area Committee wished the decision for the implementation of the scheme to be referred back to committee.

3.0 Staff Comments

- 3.1 Staff remain of the view that the Bus Stop Clearways are vital to ensure that bus services are fully accessible to passengers and as a transport provider (Highway Authority), it is within the Council's authority to help make the stops accessible. Drawing QB109/01A shows the relationship between clearway length and bus geometry.
- 3.2 With regard to the double yellow line proposals, Staff originally suggested them to keep the areas either side of the pedestrian refuges on Upper Rainham Road free from parked vehicles to aid traffic flow. Clearly, residents have raised concerns with the scheme and the Committee could recommend that the double yellow line element of the scheme be deferred and for staff to monitor the situation in terms of complaints about obstruction and traffic flow.

IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

Financial implications and risks:

The estimated cost of £2,500 can be met from the Council's Minor Parking Schemes budget.

Legal implications and risks:

Bus Stop Clearways do not require traffic orders, but current guidance suggests that local consultations should take place.

Waiting restrictions require a traffic order, consultation and the advertisement of proposals before a decision can be taken on their introduction.

Human Resources implications and risks:

None.

Equalities Implications and Risks:

The provision of fully accessible bus stops assists with making public transport more inclusive to all sectors of the community and therefore provides an alternative to the private motor car, which can help to reduce traffic congestion and pollution.

Bus Stop Clearways (used as part of making bus stops accessible) can displace on-street parking, but buses need sufficient space to pull into the kerb to make them fully accessible.

229 Warren Drive	Objects to proposals.
	Unrelated comments regarding accident problems.
	Comment about old bus stop markings not being reinstated when road was last resurfaced.
	Bus stop markings appear too long which would restrict onstreet parking.




