The applicant had also applied to permit the licensable activities detailed to be provided from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.

The application also sought to remove the following conditions from the licence:

Private entertainment condition (alcohol)

No restriction on hours for pre-booked private events limited to the provision of music and dance for pre booked invited guests.

3. Promotion of the Licensing Objectives

The applicant acted in accordance with regulations 25 and 26 of The Licensing Act 2003 (Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates) Regulations 2005 relating to the advertising of the application. The required public notice was placed in the Yellow Advertiser on 8 December 2010.

4. Details of Representations

Valid representations may only address the four licensing objectives.

There was one representation against this application from an interested party. The interested party's representation against the application was based on the prevention of public nuisance licensing objective. The representation alleged that noise pollution emanated from the premises.

Since the Licensing Act 2003 came into force in November 2005, the Havering Noise team had received no complaint with regard to noise nuisance at the premises. Condition 5 on the current premise licence addresses the requirement of the licence holder to monitor noise levels at the premises.

5. Determination of Application

Decision

Consequent upon the hearing held on 25 January 2011, the Sub-Committee's decision regarding the application to vary a Premises Licence for the Fatling & Firkin was as set out below, for the reasons shown:

The Sub-Committee was obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives, which are:

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety

- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

In making its decision, the Sub-Committee also had regard to the Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and Havering's Licensing Policy.

In addition, the Sub-Committee took account of its obligations under s17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998, and Articles 1 and 8 of the First Protocol of the Human Rights Act 1998.

Facts/Issues	
	Whether the granting of the premises licence would undermine the licensing objectives.
	<p>The written representation by the resident detailed that she had resided at the address for almost 5 years and the noise pollution from the premises had become increasingly worse to the extent that on most nights it was intolerable. That during the summer it was a nightmare as windows were opened to increase ventilation which led to an increase in noise level. That the noise was as a direct result of the music and associated drinking, smoking and fighting outside of the premises and on the pavement. The representation also included information that 2 children aged 13 years and 15 months were both becoming increasingly sensitive to the noise from the premises which was situated across the road to her flat approximately 15 yards.</p> <p>In reply the applicant's representative made the following submissions to the sub committee:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ That Ms Castle was BII qualified and had been in the trade for about 21 years of which the last 13 years had been managing this premises. ▪ That she resided 2 nights on the premises in the above flat. ▪ That training of staff was documented, and regularly carried out at the premises. ▪ The premises had no record of any complaint in the last four and half years, it was also mentioned that the premises had a contact phone number for any noise complaints well displayed outside the premises. ▪ That Ms Castle chaired the Hornchurch Pub watch which was highly regarded in Essex. ▪ That the premises operated a Challenge 25 policy, had a non-competitive pricing scheme on drinks. Vertical drinking was not encouraged, and the premises employ door staff. ▪ That Ms Castle made contact with the objector to resolve the issues raised in the representations but this was not conclusive. ▪ That this application was a minor application to bring the Sunday operation in line with Friday and Saturday. The premises had previously operated these hours on Sunday by

	<p>way of non-standard timings, without complaint.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ The variation application largely dealt with extra hours in the morning. The representation focussed on nights, so was largely unrelated.▪ There are conditions on the license dealing with public safety and the protection of children.
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Having considered the written representations and oral responses, the Sub-Committee was **satisfied** that the applicant had addressed all the issues raised.

The Sub-Committee stated that in arriving at this decision, it took into consideration the licensing objectives as contained in the Licensing Act 2003, the Licensing Guidelines as well as Havering Council's Licensing Policy.

The Sub-Committee **granted** the application in full.

REPORT OF THE CLERK

PROCEDURE FOR THE HEARING: LICENSING ACT 2003

Members are advised that, when considering application for a premises licence, the following options are available to them by virtue of the Licensing Act 2003, Part 3, section 35, paragraphs 3 and 4:

"Where relevant representations are made, the authority must

- (a) hold a hearing to consider them, unless the authority, the applicant and each person who has made such representations agree that a hearing is unnecessary, and
- (b) having regard to the representations, take such steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

The steps are:

- a) modify the conditions of the licence
- b) reject the whole or part of the application

and for this purpose, the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added."

The Sub-Committee will also wish to note that, if none of these steps is required, the application must be granted.

Assuming that the Sub-Committee is satisfied that a hearing is required, then the following procedural steps are recommended. The Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 will govern the arrangements for the hearing of the application now under consideration. This report accords with the requirements of that Act and the Regulations, and in particular Regulations 21-25 (procedure at the hearing).

1. Membership of the Sub-Committee:

The Sub-Committee comprises three members of the Licensing Committee, with a quorum of two members. **Unless there are objections, in the absence of three members, the hearing shall proceed with the quorum of two.**

A members of the Licensing Committee will be excluded from hearing an application where he or she:

has considered an application in respect of the premises in the previous 12 months as a Member of the Regulatory Services Committee; or

is a Ward Councillor for the Ward in which the premises, subject to the application, are located; or

is a Ward Councillor for a Ward which is likely to be affected by the application or;

has a personal interest in the application.

2. Roles of other participants:

2.1 The Legal Advisor is not a party to the hearing. The role of the Legal Advisor is to provide legal advice relating to the application and submissions.

2.2 The Clerk is not a party to the hearing. The role of the Clerk is to record the hearing and the decisions of the Sub-Committee, and ensure efficient administration

3. Representation validation meeting:

3.1 Prior to this hearing, the Sub-Committee Chairman will have met the Legal Advisor and/or Clerk to determine whether further clarification is required of any issues contained in the application or any representation.

3.2 During this preliminary meeting no decision will have been made or discussion held regarding the substantive merits of the application or representations.

4. Location and facilities:

4.1 All hearings will be heard at the Havering Town Hall unless otherwise directed.

4.2 Interpreters will be provided by the Council on request, provided notice is given at least five working days before the hearing.

5. Notification of attendance:

- 5.1 The Chairman will enquire of the parties who is in attendance and the parties will indicate their names (and, where relevant, whom they represent). A register will be circulated before the commencement of the hearing on which the applicant, his/her advisers and companions and all interested parties (and/or their representatives) will be asked to record their attendance.

6. Procedural matters:

- 6.1 Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Chairman of the Sub-Committee will orally inform the parties whether their applications to have certain people attend the hearing (e.g. witnesses) have been granted or refused. Note this relates to people other than those attending on behalf of a party in the capacity as a representative of the party.
- 6.2 Prior to the commencement of the hearing the Chairman of the Sub-Committee will outline the procedure to be followed at the hearing. This will normally be as follows:

Introduction of the application:

The Licensing officer will outline:

- details of the application and relevant representations received from the parties;
- relevant legislation ;
- relevant Licensing Policy; and
- the time limit in which the Council must reach a determination.

Documentary evidence:

- Documentary or other information in support of applications, representations or notices should be provided to the Clerk of the Sub-Committee at least 7 clear working days before the hearing. If this information is produced at the hearing it will only be taken into account by the Sub-Committee if the Sub-Committee and all the parties consent to its submission. Permission to have this information included in the hearing should be requested at the beginning of the hearing before any oral submissions have been made.
- Statements made by people in support of a party's representation who are not present at the hearing, must be signed by the maker, dated and witnessed by another person. The statement must also contain the witness's full name and occupation.

Representations:

- The chairman will invite each of the parties at the hearing or their representative sequentially to address the Sub-Committee and call any person/s to whom permission has been granted to appear. Each party will be allowed a maximum period of 10 minutes in which to address the Sub-Committee and call persons on his/her behalf.
- This 10 minute period is where each party has the opportunity to orally address the Sub-Committee and clarify any points in which the Sub-Committee has sought clarification prior to the hearing. This 10 minute period should be uninterrupted unless a member of the Sub-Committee or Legal Advisor considers that the speaker is making submissions that are irrelevant, frivolous or vexatious.
- Members of the Sub-Committee may ask questions of any party, at any time during the proceedings. Time taken in dealing with a Member's question will not be taken into account in determining the length of time available to the party in question to make their representation.

The sequence in which each of the parties will be invited to address the Sub-Committee will normally be in the order of:

- the Chief Officer of Police;
- the Fire Authority;
- the Health and Safety at Work Enforcing Authority;
- the Local Planning Authority;
- the Local environmental Health Authority;
- the Local Weights and Measures Authority;
- the Authority Responsible for the Protection of Children from Harm;
- a navigation or other authority responsible for waterways; and
- any other party that has submitted representations in respect of the application, certificate, notice or other matter appearing before the Sub-Committee;
- the party that has submitted the application, certificate, notice or other matter appearing before the Sub-Committee.

At the discretion of the Sub-Committee the above order may be varied.

Cross-Examination:

Where witnesses have been permitted by the Sub-Committee to speak at the hearing on behalf of a party, permission must be sought from the Sub-Committee before another party can ask the witness questions. This process of questioning is normally referred to as cross-examination. The Sub-Committee will allow cross-examination only

where it is necessary to assist it in considering the representations or application.

Relevance:

Information submitted at the hearing must be relevant to the applications, representations, or notice and the promotion of the licensing objectives. The Chairman of the Sub-Committee is entitled to exclude any information it considers to be irrelevant whether presented in written or oral form. The licensing objectives are:

- The prevention of crime and disorder;**
- Public safety;**
- The prevention of public nuisance; and**
- The protection of children from harm.**

7. Failure of parties to attend the hearing:

- 7.1 If a party, who has not given prior notice of his/her intention not to attend the hearing, is absent from the hearing the Sub-Committee may either adjourn the hearing or hold the hearing in the party's absence. Where the hearing is held in the absence of a party, the Sub-Committee will still consider the application, representation or notice submitted by that party.

8. Adjournments and extension of time:

- 8.1 The Sub-Committee may adjourn a hearing to a specified date or extend a notice period except where it must make a determination within certain time limits in the following specific applications:
- Applications for conversion of existing licences where the Sub-Committee must make a determination within 2 months of the application first being received. In default of a decision being made the application will be treated as being granted;
 - Applications for variation of existing licences where the Sub-Committee must make a determination within 2 months of the application first being received. In default of a decision being made the application will be treated as being rejected;
 - Applications for conversion of existing club certificates where the Sub-Committee must make a determination within 2 months of the application being first received. In default of a decision being made the application will be treated as being granted;
 - Applications for variation of existing club certificates where the Sub-Committee must make a determination within 2 months of the application being first received. In default of a decision being made the application will be treated as being rejected;

- Applications made by holders of justices' licences for personal licences must be determined within 3 months of the application first being received. In default of a decision not being made within this period the application will be treated as being granted;
- Review of premises licences following closure orders where the Sub-committee must make a determination within 28 days of receiving notice of the closure order.

9. Sub-Committee's determination of the hearing:

- 9.1 At the conclusion of the hearing the Sub-Committee will deliberate in private accompanied by the Clerk and the Legal Advisor who will be available to assist the Sub-Committee with any legal problems but will not participate in any decision making of the Sub-Committee.
- 9.2 The Sub-Committee will normally make its determination and announce its decision at the end of the hearing.
- 9.3 Where all parties have notified the Sub-Committee that a hearing is not required the Sub-Committee must make its determination within 10 working days of being given notice that the hearing is not required.

10. Power to exclude people from hearing:

- 10.1 The public are entitled to attend the hearing as spectators. However, the Sub-Committee may exclude any person from the hearing including any person assisting or representing a party where:
- it considers that the public interest would be best served by excluding the public or the individual person from the hearing; or
 - that person is behaving in a disruptive manner. This may include a party who is seeking to be heard at the hearing. In the case where a party is to be excluded, the party may submit to the Sub-Committee in writing any information which they would have been entitled to give orally had they not been required to leave the hearing.

11. Recording of proceedings:

- 11.1 A written record of the hearing will be produced and kept for 6 years from the date of the determination of the hearing.

12. Power to vary procedure:

- 12.1 The Sub-committee may depart from following any of the procedures set out in this document if it considers the departure to be necessary in order to consider an application, notice or representation.



 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
4. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

6. The responsible person shall ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.
7. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

Door Supervision

8. If at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

Private Entertainment Condition. (Alcohol)

No restrictions on hours for pre-booked private events limited to the provision of music and dance for pre-booked invited guests.

The Prevention of crime and disorder

- 1) The licensee shall maintain a policy of zero tolerance to use of illegal drugs ensuring staff are aware of and react to the policy, recording each incidence in the incident book and reporting facts to the appropriate authority.
- 2) The licensee shall maintain a permanent written record of each incident of crime or disorder, including the complainant's name and location, the date and time the information is received, the action taken and when. The record shall be kept on the premises for readily available for inspection at all reasonable times by an officer from the Council's licensing division.

Public safety

- 3) The management shall fully brief and train all staff on the contents of the health and safety policy, and review the policy when such incidents that occur show up a deficiency in such a policy.
- 4) Free drinking water shall be available at all times.

The prevention of public nuisance

- 5) The licensee shall ensure noise levels are monitored by regular patrols both internally and on the exterior of the premises so not to annoy residents.
- 6) Signs shall be displayed in the premises and frontage instructing patrons to recognise the residential nature of the area and conduct their behaviour courteous manner. With a notice, clearly visible from outside the premises showing the telephone number where to make complaints.

The protection of children from harm

- 7) Children shall not be allowed on the premises unless accompanied and supervised by an adult.
- 8) The licensee shall not permit or supply alcohol to persons who appear under age without confirming they are over that age applicable for the beverage supplied by inspecting a recognised form of photographic identification.
- 9) The premises shall be cleared of customers and closed 30 minutes after the conclusion of the last licensed activity.
- 10) No persons under 16 shall be admitted to or allowed to remain on the public areas of the premises after 18:00 hours.
- 11) The current CCTV system shall be maintained and to be kept in good working order, with recordings kept for 31 days for the use of any criminal investigations which may arise within the premises, to the satisfaction of the police.
- 12) SIA approved door supervisors shall, be employed if the DPS deems this necessary.

Non Standard timings

In addition to the use of Temporary Event Notices allowed under the Licensing Act 2003, the premises may open on 12 non-standard occasions, in line with the Association of Chief Police Officers guidelines; subject to a minimum of 10 working days' notice being given to the licensing authority and the Police for each occasion. The prior written consent of the Police shall be obtained and the police shall have absolute right to refuse any occasion. A register shall be kept at the premises in the manner required by the Police and the Licensing Authority and available for inspection by the police or an Authorised Officer of the Licensing Authority and details of each occasion shall be recorded in it including the written consent of the police.

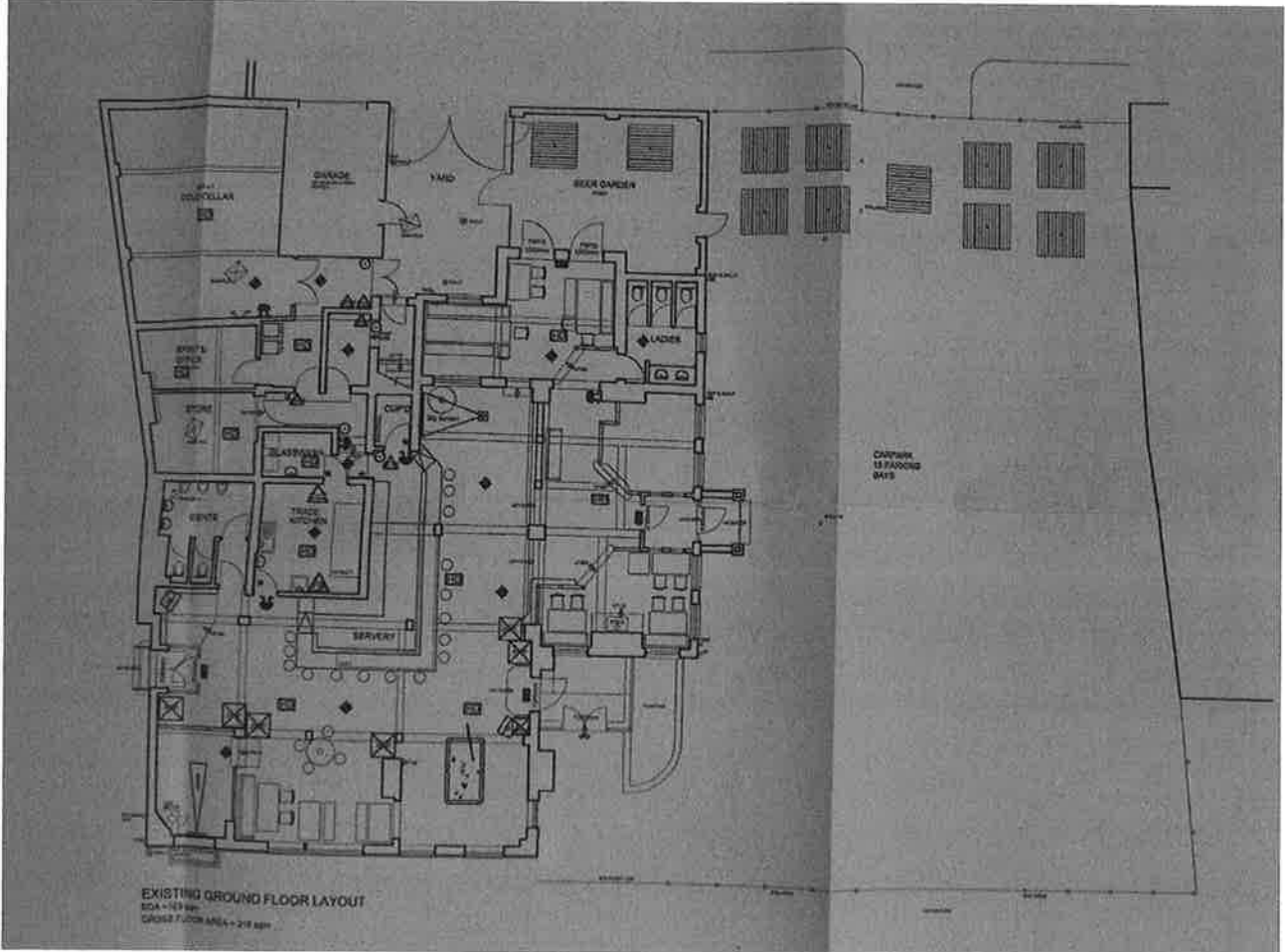

Your letter dated 6th December 2010 refers [copy attached for ease of reference].

I have resided at the above address for almost five years now and the noise pollution from this Public House, The Fatling & Firkin has become increasingly worse in this time - to the extent that on most nights it is intolerable and particularly on **Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday nights throughout the year.**

The summer months are a particular nightmare as obviously when one would normally try to increase ventilation by way of open windows this simply cannot happen as the level of noise is far too much to sleep.

The noise pollution comes about as a direct result of the music and associated drinking, smoking and fighting outside of the Public House including on the pavement.

Kindly note that I have two children; my son who is 13 years of age and studying very hard at School [Sanders Draper], whilst my daughter is only 15 months of age and both of them are becoming increasingly sensitive to the noise from this Public House establishment - which is situate directly across the road to our flat at approximately 15 yards or say away - in very close proximity.

This letter represents my specific comments upon the above referred application. I seek that this my objection to the Application is fully considered in light of (i) the actual Licensing Policy of this Authority and (ii) especially in the circumstances of Public safety and the ongoing protection of children from harm.
