## **REPORT OF THE CABINET**

### **CAPITAL PROGRAMME PROVISION FOR THE NEW RAINHAM LIBRARY DEVELOPMENT**

Cabinet received a report at its July 2012 meeting, which set out a proposal to allocate supplementary capital funding of up to £1.8m to secure development of the residential element of the scheme to construct a new Rainham Library. Cabinet agreed to recommend to the Council that the Capital budget be increased by £1.8m, funded through capital receipts, to secure this development.

The report also set out the background to the Rainham Library development, including that the residential element of the scheme (16 two-bedroom flats) was essential to the viability of the development as a whole. The library project was also considered as key to the wider Rainham Compass Regeneration scheme.

The report advised that the GLA had recently agreed to provide £2.2m grant funding specifically for the purpose of progressing the construction. The additional £1.8m investment from the Council would cover the remaining funding gap. This would be an addition to the Capital Programme and therefore required full Council approval.

**Cabinet accordingly recommends the approval of the addition of £1.8m Capital Budget to the Council's Capital Programme, for the new Rainham Library development.**
