This method statement sets out the procedures to be adopted, during the erection, operation and dismantling of a Mobile Stage, for the following operations and hazards:

- · Transportation to and from site
- · Erection
- · Dismantle

#### **Procedure**

#### **Site Access and Plant Movements**

Vehicles travelling through the site are to observe the site speed limits and to be aware of other vehicles using same route. Vehicles to not travel in excess of 5mph. Drivers to be aware of overhead obstructions such as power lines, bridges and low tree branches.

#### **Erection**

Erection to be carried out by competent trained personnel only.

Firstly ensure that area for the stage is clear of obstruction and secured off from other traffic.

Ensure overhead space is clear and free of obstuctions.

Ensure minimum 6m Clearence from nearby power lines.

#### Dismantling

After Event barrier\cordon off the area

Take down in a safe manner

Suitable trained and competent person(s) (To Be Advised on Arrival)

**Event Equipment Hire supervision** 

All operatives shall be suitably experienced, trained in the duties they are to carry out and have the necessary information to carry out those duties in a safe and proper manner.

#### 6. Plant & Equipment

All plant used shall comply with the Provision and Use of Work Equipment Regulations 1998 (P.U.W.E.R) and all lifting equipment shall comply with the Lifting Operation and Lifting Equipment Regulations 1998 (L.O.L.E.R.)

#### 7. Safety

Ensure an ample amount of time is allowed for the journey to and from the venue.

Staff must use appropriate safety equipment and PPE. (E.g. ear defenders)

Frequent reversing vehicles must be accompanied by a banksman otherwise personnel on foot to keep well clear of operational plant. Unless otherwise agreed, the banksman should be provided by the client and have suitable knowledge of the site. Don't walk behind plant; ensure the operator has acknowledged your presence before crossing its path.

This method statement and attached risk assessment to be communicated to all operatives involved in or likely to be affected by the activities detailed in same, and written proof of communication to be held in site offices.

Be aware of live traffic

All plant operators will be CPCS/ CTA trained. (Not Relevant on This Project)

Only use approved site access routes, observe speed limits.

#### Security operational plan & details for "Stubbers" Festival event

Date - 31<sup>st</sup> August - 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2012

On site duty security manager John Fawcett S.I.A. Licence number 0130 0149 1670 6449

The Security contingency is a minimum three female operatives and seventeen male security operatives, all fully licensed and registered with the S.I.A. There will be an additional 10 stewards to support the Security staff at point of entry for search procedures and giving assistance to attendees of the event.

Security personnel will begin each shift by checking in with the security manager and signing on. The security personnel will then be paired up, issued one communication radio between them and be assigned with their call sign name which ranges from Sierra 1 -10. All security personnel will be fully briefed prior to the start of the event and fully debriefed at the end of each day's activities, with a full debrief on completion of the event, and final report to the organisers by the security manager.

#### Stage 1 of daily procedures

Prior to the festival being mad eopen to the public, a minimum of 4 security operatives will be positioned in the entry zone to carry our visual assessments and searching of attendees, assisted by the 10 stewards. This number to include two female security operatives. A metal detector wand will be used for external searches of person's entering, and full searches will be carried out on all bags and vehicles entering the event area. Any person/s found attempting to enter with any form of contraband or demonstrating unsociable behaviour will be denied entry. Any seizures of drugs found during search or surrendered, will be recorded and sealed in drug bags and the person in possession refused entry. There will notices displayed to the public at point of entry giving clear direction that entry is conditional on consent to search and those persons refusing to undergo a search will be refused entry.

In addition to the security personnel conducting searches at point of entry, there will be two members of security at each entry point to each stage area. These stage areas will be roped off to minimise movement of attendees between stages and to monitor capacities for each area to a maximum of 499 persons.

Also a priority for security, at this time, will be the monitoring and safe keeping of any cash/tills/deposits until such tenders are secured to the organisers satisfaction.

#### Stage 2 of daily procedures

Once the majority of attendees have been filtered through and are on site, the security operatives will begin to disperse and patrol each zone, (leaving a minimal number of operatives to maintain supervision at point of entry and continue search procedures, suggested 4 in number), the remaining 6 operatives giving extra attention to the program of events so that a larger presence of security can be in place where a zone is active i.e a band is playing. The role of the security operatives, at this time, will be public safety, crowd control and the overseeing of agreed regulations/conditions that are attached to Temporary Events Notices, should they be granted.

As each zone/Stage Area finishes and another begins, security operatives will relocate and assess the specific requirements of that zone to ensure that at all times public safety remains priority.

All security operatives will have information from the initial briefing as to actions/directions and locations of first aid/ St. John's ambulance staff and lost children procedures, along with a designated collection point to re-unite parent and child.

#### Stage 3 of daily procedures

Once the last zone has finished and activities ended, all security operatives will politely and persistently encourage the departing of all attendees. Security operatives will confirm all zones are clear and also check that those individuals remaining are authorised to do so. (Staff, stewards, technicians etc,.)

All security staff will return to the main entrance meet point and submit the day's reports and hand security radios to the duty security manager. A role call will be completed and day security operatives will sign off shift once the manager is satisfied all incidents/information and staff are accounted for.

#### Stage 4 of daily procedures

At 01:00 hrs Saturday and Sunday mornings, five security operatives will sign on and check in with the duty security manager. Each officer will collect one communication radio.

At the organisers request, two zones are requiring constant supervision throughout the night to secure expensive and delicate equipment. Hence one security operative will be placed in each zone for a micro patrol, which leaves three operatives to patrol the entire site checking for intruders, undesirables or any situation requiring emergency assistance. These duties will be on hourly rotation between the security operatives.

At 06:00 hrs Saturday and Sunday mornings the night shift security operatives will return to the main site entrance, submit any night reports, return communication radio and after a role call will sign off shift.
