Procedure for the Hearing: Licensing Act 2003

Members are advised that, when considering an application to vary a premises licence, the following options are available to them by virtue of the Licensing Act 2003, Part 3, section 35, paragraphs 3 and 4:

"Where relevant representations are made, the authority must

- (a) hold a hearing to consider them, unless the authority, the applicant and each person who has made such representations agree that a hearing is unnecessary, and
- (b) having regard to the representations, take such steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

The steps are:

- a) modify the conditions of the licence
- b) reject the whole or part of the application

and for this purpose, the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added."

The Sub-Committee will also wish to note that, if none of these steps is required, the application must be granted.

Assuming that the Sub-Committee is satisfied that a hearing is required, then the following procedural steps are recommended. The Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 will govern the arrangements for the hearing of the application now under consideration. This report accords with the requirements of that Act and the Regulations, and in particular Regulations 21-25 (procedure at the hearing).

1. Membership of the Sub-Committee:

- 1.1 The Sub-Committee comprises three members of the Licensing Committee, with a quorum of two members. Unless there are objections, in the absence of three members, the hearing shall proceed with the quorum of two.
- 1.2 A members of the Licensing Committee will be excluded from hearing an application where he or she:
 - 1.2.1 has considered an application in respect of the premises in the previous 12 months as a Member of the Regulatory Services Committee; or
 - 1.2.2 is a Ward Councillor for the Ward in which the premises, subject to the application, are located; or
 - 1.2.3 is a Ward Councillor for a Ward which is likely to be affected by the application or;
 - 1.2.4 has a personal interest in the application.

2. Roles of other participants:

- 2.1 The Legal Advisor is not a party to the hearing. The role of the Legal Advisor is to provide legal advice relating to the application and submissions.
- 2.2 The Clerk is not a party to the hearing. The role of the Clerk is to record the hearing and the decisions of the Sub-Committee, and ensure efficient administration

3. Representation validation meeting:

- 3.1 Prior to this hearing, the Sub-Committee Chairman will have met the Legal Advisor and/or Clerk to determine whether further clarification is required of any issues contained in the application or any representation.
- 3.2 During this preliminary meeting no decision will have been made or discussion held regarding the substantive merits of the application or representations.

4. Location and facilities:

- 4.1 All hearings will be heard at the Havering Town Hall unless otherwise directed.
- 4.2 Interpreters will be provided by the Council on request, provided notice is given at least five working days before the hearing.

5. Notification of attendance:

5.1 The Chairman will enquire of the parties who is in attendance and the parties will indicate their names (and, where relevant, whom they represent). A register will be circulated before the commencement of the hearing on which the applicant, his/her advisers and companions and all interested parties (and/or their representatives) will be asked to record their attendance.

6. Procedural matters:

- 6.1 Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Chairman of the Sub-Committee will orally inform the parties whether their applications to have certain people attend the hearing (e.g. witnesses) have been granted or refused. Note this relates to people other than those attending on behalf of a party in the capacity as a representative of the party.
- 6.2 Prior to the commencement of the hearing the Chairman of the Sub-Committee will outline the procedure to be followed at the hearing. This will normally be as follows:

Introduction of the application:

The Licensing officer will outline:

- details of the application and relevant representations received from the parties;
- relevant legislation ;
- relevant Licensing Policy; and
- the time limit in which the Council must reach a determination.

Documentary evidence:

- Documentary or other information in support of applications, representations or notices should be provided to the Clerk of the Sub-Committee at least 7 clear working days before the hearing. If this information is produced at the hearing it will only be taken into account by the Sub-Committee if the Sub-Committee and all the parties consent to its submission. Permission to have this information included in the hearing should be requested at the beginning of the hearing before any oral submissions have been made.
- Statements made by people in support of a party's representation who are not present at the hearing, must be signed by the maker, dated and witnessed by another person. The statement must also contain the witness's full name and occupation.

Representations:

- The chairman will invite each of the parties at the hearing or their representative sequentially to address the Sub-Committee and call any person/s to whom permission has been granted to appear. Each party will be allowed a maximum period of 10 minutes in which to address the Sub-Committee and call persons on his/her behalf.
- This 10 minute period is where each party has the opportunity to orally address the Sub-Committee and clarify any points in which the Sub-Committee has sought clarification prior to the hearing. This 10 minute period should be uninterrupted unless a member of the Sub-Committee or Legal Advisor considers that the speaker is making submissions that are irrelevant, frivolous or vexatious.
- Members of the Sub-Committee may ask questions of any party, at any time during the proceedings. Time taken in dealing with a Member's question will not be taken into account in determining the length of time available to the party in question to make their representation.

The sequence in which each of the parties will be invited to address the Sub-Committee will normally be in the order of:

- the Chief Officer of Police;
- the Fire Authority;
- the Health and Safety at Work Enforcing Authority;
- the Local Planning Authority;
- the Local environmental Health Authority;
- the Local Weights and Measures Authority;
- the Authority Responsible for the Protection of Children from Harm;
- a navigation or other authority responsible for waterways; and
- any other party that has submitted representations in respect of the application, certificate, notice or other matter appearing before the Sub-Committee;
- the party that has submitted the application, certificate, notice or other matter appearing before the Sub-Committee.

At the discretion of the Sub-Committee the above order may be varied.

Cross-Examination:

Where witnesses have been permitted by the Sub-Committee to speak at the hearing on behalf of a party, permission must be sought from the Sub-Committee before another party can ask the witness questions. This process of questioning is normally referred to as cross-examination. The Sub-Committee will allow cross-examination only where it is necessary to assist it in considering the representations or application.

Relevance:

Information submitted at the hearing must be relevant to the applications, representations, or notice and the promotion of the licensing objectives. The Chairman of the Sub-Committee is entitled to exclude any information it considers to be irrelevant whether presented in written or oral form. The licensing objectives are:

The prevention of crime and disorder;

Public safety;

The prevention of public nuisance; and

The protection of children from harm.

7. Failure of parties to attend the hearing:

7.1 If a party, who has not given prior notice of his/her intention not to attend the hearing, is absent from the hearing the Sub-Committee may either adjourn the hearing or hold the hearing in the party's absence. Where the hearing is held in the absence of a party, the Sub-Committee will still consider the application, representation or notice submitted by that party.

8. Adjournments and extension of time:

- 8.1 The Sub-Committee may adjourn a hearing to a specified date or extend a notice period except where it must make a determination within certain time limits in the following specific applications:
 - Applications for conversion of existing licences where the Sub-Committee must make a determination within 2 months of the application first being received. In default of a decision being made the application will be treated as being granted;
 - Applications for variation of existing licences where the Sub-Committee must make a determination within 2 months of the application first being received. In default of a decision being made the application will be treated as being rejected;
 - Applications for conversion of existing club certificates where the Sub-Committee must make a determination within 2 months of the application being first received. In default of a decision being made the application will be treated as being granted;
 - Applications for variation of existing club certificates where the Sub-Committee must make a determination within 2 months of the application being first received. In default of a decision being made the application will be treated as being rejected;
 - Applications made by holders of justices' licences for personal licences must be determined within 3 months of the application first being

received. In default of a decision not being made within this period the application will be treated as being granted;

• Review of premises licences following closure orders where the Subcommittee must make a determination within 28 days of receiving notice of the closure order.

9. Sub-Committee's determination of the hearing:

- 9.1 At the conclusion of the hearing the Sub-Committee will deliberate in private accompanied by the Clerk and the Legal Advisor who will be available to assist the Sub-Committee with any legal problems but will not participate in any decision making of the Sub-Committee.
- 9.2 The Sub-Committee will normally make its determination and announce its decision at the end of the hearing.
- 9.3 Where all parties have notified the Sub-Committee that a hearing is not required the Sub-Committee must make its determination within 10 working days of being given notice that the hearing is not required.

10. Power to exclude people from hearing:

- 10.1 The public are entitled to attend the hearing as spectators. However, the Sub-Committee may exclude any person from the hearing including any person assisting or representing a party where:
 - it considers that the public interest would be best served by excluding the public or the individual person from the hearing; or
 - that person is behaving in a disruptive manner. This may include a party who is seeking to be heard at the hearing. In the case where a party is to be excluded, the party may submit to the Sub-Committee in writing any information which they would have been entitled to give orally had they not been required to leave the hearing.

11. Recording of proceedings:

11.1 A written record of the hearing will be produced and kept for 6 years from the date of the determination of the hearing.

12. Power to vary procedure:

12.1 The Sub-committee may depart from following any of the procedures set out in this document if it considers the departure to be necessary in order to consider an application, notice or representation.

This application for a variation to a premises licence is made by Mr Colin Eric Siddle under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003. The application was received by Havering's Licensing Authority on 15th December 2011.

Geographical description of the area and description of the building

OJ's is located in Hornchurch's town centre at the junction of High Street and Billet Lane. The area is predominantly commercial, however there are residential properties located above the town centre shops in the vicinity. A map of the area is attached.

Details of the application

The premises licence currently permits the provision of the following licensable activities:

The applicant has also applied to modify/remove the following conditions:

- Annex 2 condition 7 and Annex 3 condition 3 to be removed and replaced with: No person under 18 shall be on the premises during hours of permitted licensable activity unless by residential qualification or attending a pre-booked event and accompanied by a responsible person.
- Annex 3 condition 13 to be removed.
- To Annex 2 condition 9 add: Within 'Olivers' venue polycarbonates will be used at all times during times of permitted licensable activities.

• A new condition to be added:

The designated premises supervisor or premises licence holder shall supply an appropriate number of SIA registered door supervisors for the maximum occupancy figure state. There shall be a minimum of one female supervisor included in this figure.

• A new condition to be added:

A drugs log book shall be at the premises and monitored by the designated premises supervisor. All drugs seized during searches shall be recorded in a book by the appropriate SIA door supervisor. Police shall be notified when a collection is required.

The applicant has also applied to modify the premises plans. Plan A attached is the current premises plans for the first floor area of the premises which appears on the current version of the premises licence. Plan C is the version the applicant intends to be the modified version.

Comments and observations on the application

The applicant acted in accordance with regulations 25 and 26 of *The Licensing Act* 2003 (*Premises licences and club premises certificates*) Regulations 2005 relating to the advertising of the application. The required public notice was installed in the 21st December 2011 edition of the Yellow Advertiser.

OJ's is located in the St Andrews ward. This ward is subject to a cumulative impact policy with regard to licensed premises. Policy 017 states:

It is the LLA's policy to refuse applications in the St Andrews ward area for pubs and bars; late night refreshment premises offering hot food and drink to take away; off licences; and premises offering facilities for music and dancing other than applications to vary hours with regard to Licensing policy 012.

Policy 012 states:

The LLA is committed to protecting the amenity of residents and businesses in the vicinity of licensed premises. Applications for hours set out below in this policy will generally be granted subject to not being contrary to other policies in the statement of licensing policy. Applications for hours outside the hours listed will be considered on their merits.

Regulated Activities will normally be permitted:

- until 11.30 pm in residential areas
- *until 00.30 am in mixed use areas*
- no limits in leisure areas

<u>Summary</u>

Seven letters of representation against this application, signed by eleven individuals, were received from interested parties.

Two ward councillors made representation against this application.

There were two representations against this application from responsible authorities, namely the Police and Havering's Noise Specialist.

Details of representations

Valid representations may only address the following licensing objectives:

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm
- Public safety

Interested parties' representations

Cllr Wood and Cllr Mylod make representation against this application. Their joint representation makes reference to three licensing objectives.

The interested parties' representations are based upon the prevention of public nuisance.

Responsible authorities' representations

Mr Marc Gasson, Havering's Noise Specialist, makes representation against this application on behalf of Havering's Public Protection function. Mr Gasson's representation is based upon the prevention of public nuisance licensing objective.

PC David Fern makes representation against this application on behalf of the Metropolitan Police. PC Fern's representation is based upon the licensing objectives relating to the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance.

There was no representation from any other responsible authority.

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-

- 4. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that -
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures
 - (i) beer or cider: ¹/₂ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.
- 7. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

8. - 1. Door supervisors shall remain on duty during the extended evening hours including Sundays until the premises is closed. Additional door supervisors shall be employed at the wine bar.
- 2. Regulated entertainment shall stop an hour before closing time.
- 3. Fire safety and health and safety risk assessments shall be in place at the premises and reviewed regularly or when an incident occurs that is not covered by the policies.
- 4. The premises licence holder shall ensure noise levels are monitored by regular patrols both internally and on the exterior of the premises so not to annoy residents.

- 8. A CCTV system shall be installed and operated at all times throughout the premises whilst it is open for trading. The images should be of an identification standard, the cameras located in the premises as agreed with the Police. Images retained shall be kept and stored for a minimum of one month and will be made available to Police or other such authorised officers upon formal request in a downloadable format such as CD, DVD or other such removable storage device.
- 9. Polycarbonate drinkware in the premises named OJ's shall be used from 20:00 to the close of the premises on all Thursdays to Sundays inclusive.

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Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the Licensing Authority

- 1. All staff shall be suitably trained for their job functions for the premises. Training shall be written into a programme ongoing and under constant review and must be made available to a relevant responsible authority when called upon.
- 2. The premises licence holder shall implement a written children's policy.
- 3. Where the supply of alcohol is a licensed activity no persons under 18 shall be admitted to or allowed to remain on the premises between 21:00 and 06:00 unless specifically covered in the children's policy. The policy shall be approved in writing by Havering Police.
- 4. All door supervisors shall enter their full details in the premises daily register at the commencement of work. This shall record their full name, home address, contact telephone number, SIA registration number and the time they commenced and concluded working. If the door supervisor was supplied by an agency details of that agency shall also be recorded including name of agency, registered business address and contact telephone number.
- 5. The premises shall be cleared of customers and closed 30 minutes after the conclusion of the last licensable activity.
- 6. The premises licence holder shall implement a written crime prevention policy aimed to reduce crime within the premises. The policy shall be approved in writing by Havering Police.
- 7. The premises licence holder shall implement a written responsible drinking policy to be agreed in writing by Havering Police.
- 8. All members of staff at the premises shall seek 'credible photographic proof of age evidence' from any person who appears to be under the age of 18 years and who is seeking access to the premises or is seeking to purchase or consume alcohol on the premises. Such credible evidence which shall include a photograph of the customer shall include a passport, photographic driving licence or proof of age card carrying a "PASS" logo.
- 9. Prominent clear notices shall be displayed at the point of entry to the premises and in a suitable location at any points of sale advising customers that they may be asked to produce evidence of their age.
- 10. Prominent clear notices shall be displayed at every public entrance stating the actual operating hours of the premises.
- 11. Prominent clear notices shall be displayed at every public entrance stating any restrictions relating to the admission of children to the premises or other admission restrictions.
- 12. When operating drinks promotions on any day of the week a written policy shall be produced. The policy shall detail the extra measures in place to deal with departing patrons both throughout and at the end of the promotion. It shall include the policy for refusing to serve persons who are drunk. The policy shall be agreed in writing by Havering Police.
- 13. Alcoholic drinks shall not be supplied in such a way which will enable persons to consume unlimited quantities of alcoholic drinks on production of a single payment.

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

- 14. The premises licence holder shall implement a written drugs policy. This shall detail the strategies to minimise the use and supply of illegal drugs within the premises. The drugs policy shall include a structured training programme covering the issues relevant to the misuse of drugs in relation to licensed premises which shall be delivered to all staff. This policy shall be approved in writing by Havering Police.
- 15. All staff shall be trained in dealing with persons who are incapacitated through the use of drugs and alcohol.
- 16. In addition to the use of temporary event notices allowed under the Licensing Act 2003 the premises may open on 12 non-standard occasions in line with the Association of Chief Police Officers' guidelines subject to a minimum of 10 working days' notice being given to the Licensing Authority and the Police for each occasion. The prior written consent of the Police shall be obtained and the Police shall have absolute right to refuse any occasion. 

The Metropolitan Police wish to make representation against the application to vary the premises licence know as OJ's incorporating Olivers. 64 - 68 High Street, Hornchurch, RM12.

- The premises are located within the saturation area of St Andrews Ward; full details can be found in the London borough of Havering licensing policy.
- It is high lighted within the report that violent crime involving alcohol is predominantly seen between the hours of 2000 0200, Friday and Saturday evenings. This particularly increase that can not be seen in any other part of the borough, with recorded offences around the High Street, within the proximity of the premises.

It has been discussed with the premise licence holder about changing the premise licence held at premises. At present both venues operate on one licence it would be beneficial to have two separate premises licences to ensure flexibility in conditions, and operating schedules are tailor made to reflect the business in each venue. Venues have their own entry point and accessibility is not linked to both by patrons.

This suggestion was put to the applicant and, at this time I can only judge the variation based on the current premises licence for both venues.

OLIVERS

- The crime figures over the last 24 months show 18 offences 12 are for an assault, these include ABH, GBH, and Common assault.
- This application includes plans to increase capacity of this venue, and to add an additional bar, making the availability of alcohol easier.

OJ's/ CRICKETERS.

- The crime figures for the last 24 months are 6 offences, 5 relating of assaults. These include ABH, GBH, and Common assault.
- The overall crime figures for 24 months at the premises are 24 offences reported and 17 are for assaults. This would show to be consistent with the licensing policy of violent crime within the saturation area.

The police also hold information to suggest drugs are being dealt with and taken at the premises. The premises licence holder agreed to some sample testing at the location last year and within the previous year. The results suggested that drugs had been used on the premises; again different figures were produced in each venue.

It should be noted by the committee that's this is a machine that indicates contamination on surfaces, to various levels. It is used has a guidance indicator to the police and premise licence holder. This matter was discussed with the premise licence holder.

• I would also like to inform the committee that following a recent meeting the Premises licence holder is working with police in order to deal with the drugs issues and has volunteered some additional conditions.

The premises are located within a mixed use area and are within the vicinity of other licensed premises, Moons, Bar 44, Firkin, all located on Hornchurch High street, none of these Establishments are open any later then the current premises licence.

There is no provision for food at the premises thus creating a large vertical drinking establishment in two venues, in hand with being the only place open to such hours would create a magnet to the premises.

The council states in the licence policy it is its vision to provide residents with the highest quality of life in London.

- There have been incidents of violent crime at this location and the Police object to the premises being open any later then the current hours, allowing this will impact the licensing objective under prevention of crime and disorder and public Nuisance.
- The saturation policy is in place to protect the amenity of residents and business in the vicinity of the licensed premises.

Allowing these premises to be open later would also have a cumulative impact on the area. The potential for 494 patrons to remain in the premises up to 0300 hours on the days requested, then to be in the High Street, potentially at Fast food premises, bus stops, taxi stands and loitering causing noise and nuisance.

This would certainly contribute to Anti social behaviour and public nuisance, leading to a rise in crime and disorder.

Summary of the variation and timings requested.

The premises have requested to open for longer and also to grant the additional hour as requested at the end of licensable activity for Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

Times below are a summary of what has been request to vary the premises licence; this is for both OJ's and Olivers. This summary gives an idea of the impact times in the area if this license was granted. Maximum capacity 494, figurers from London fire Brigade.

• Planning permission has also been granted to extend the ground floor to increase the capacity of the whole venue to 600 patrons again figures provided by London fire Brigade.

Monday through to Wednesday	- licensed up to 2300 - premises closed by 2330
Thursday - into Friday Morning Friday - into Saturday Morning Saturday - into Sunday Morning Sunday - into Monday Morning	 licensed up to 0130 - premises closed by 0230 licensed up to 0200 - premises closed by 0300 licensed up to 0200 - premises closed by 0300 licensed up to 0130 - premises closed by 0230

• The additional hour requested instead of the current 30 minutes to clear the premises of customers on Thursday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday evenings will only prolong the potential for crime and disorder along with anti social behaviour and public nuisance.

Police are against the premises being granted this hour, the hour would normally be considered for a night club or premises with a large capacity, including venues situation in predominately commercial areas.

The police are against the application when considering the following bullet points and the impact they would have on the licensing objectives.

- Location within the Saturation area, high lighted as been stressed, related issues of crime and disorder present, particularly Violence against the person. (Assault)
- The two venues are primarily vertical drinking premises with no provision for food and are within Proximity of residential areas, and other licensed premises.
- Past compliance, issues relating to serious Violence at the location, drugs analysis results and recent issues relating to noise and nuisance.

- Proposed hours would have a Cumulative impact on the area, businesses and residents along with the future growth of the High Street.
- <u>The applicant has failed to address in the operating schedule what additional</u> <u>steps they intend to apply to eliminate the issues raised above, also how they</u> <u>intend to work with the community which it affects.</u>

The variations to the conditions of the licence requested.

***These matters were raised with the applicant and all variations to the conditions have been agreed, except those marked with double **in bold ink. See attached document relating to agreed conditions with the police.

Annex 2 - condition 7 - it is proposed by Police that this condition shall remain; Police aim to protect children from harm. There have been previous issues relating violent crime and drugs at the premises. It would be irresponsible to expose a person under 18 to this.

The only exception the police would consider is for a private party pre booked. The police would also consider allowing under 18's to work at the premises during non licensable activity, e.g., Prior to opening.

The police would allow a person under 18 on the premises if they reside.

Annex 3 - condition 3 - this conflicts the above condition, providing a solution is made to above Annex 2 - condition 7 the Police would be happy for this condition to be removed.

**Annex 3 - condition 5 - this condition shall remain in place. The police are against the premises being allowed to remain open one (1) hour after licensable activity. This would have an impact on the prevention of crime and disorder objective and Public Nuisance.

Annex 3 - condition 13 - this can be removed; Police wish to make no objection this is covered in mandatory conditions.

**Further variation to regulated entertainment, will remain as per condition 2 listed in annex 2. Police are against the premises being licensed any later then as per the current licence. If the committee were to grant a later licence all the regulated entertainment extensions should be reviewed and not granted as a matter of course.

If the committee feel this application is exceptional and grant the additional licensable activity along with the extra hour requested, police would seek further conditions to be imposed.

Dispersal conditions

- Immediately following the cessation of the sale of alcohol the playing of music is wound down with lower tempo music and decreased volume.
- In the period between the cessation of the sale of alcohol and the closing of the premises the lighting to the premises is gradually increased.
- Once all music ceases, an announcement asking all patrons to leave in an orderly manner and to have consideration for local residents will be made.
- Door staff will observe leaving patrons and remove all drinking vessels from them.
- Door staff and management will ensure that patrons do not cause any disturbance or nuisance within the vicinity of the premises, any patrons causing a disturbance or nuisance will be moved on.
- Door staff will remain outside until all patrons have left the vicinity of the premises.

The police will continue to work with the applicant and their representative in an effort to develop the business and the community.

The noise problems centred around two issues:-

- 2. Noise from patrons using the beer garden to the rear of the premises.

Both Cllr John Mylod and myself would like to object to the Olivers application for change of hours for the following reasons.

Public Safety and Public Nuisance

Currently there is only one licence for both Olivers(the night club) and OJs (the pub next door) and when the new rear extension to Olivers is built that means there could be nearly 500/600 customers from both Olivers and OJs on the premises and all trying to exit the same premises at the same time, (4.00am). This is certainly got to be a recipe for disaster.

The frontage of Olivers is a very small area and this will certainly be to the detriment of all the local residents because of the amount of noise and general disruption together with the comings and goings of the increased traffic especially at such early hur of the morning.

Prevention of any Crime and Disorder

We are particularly concerned that ASB will rise due to the large number of customers leaving the premises at the front entrance of both the club/pub at such a late hour because there will be no public transport available and most of the 500/600 customers will just be milling around the Hornchurch Town Centre completely at a lost where to go, what to do and all the worse for wear due to the large amount of alcohol consumed throughout the evening. This is just a disaster waiting to happen!

The late closing will almost certainly attract customers from far and wide especially once the local pubs and restaurants have closed and they are looking to continue the consuming of alcohol well into the early hours of the morning. Extra police will almost certainly need to be available to cope with the 500/600 that will all be exiting the premises at such a late hour and to ensure that they are all moved on quickly, this will not be an easy task! Nearly all of the shops in the Town Centre do not have any sort of protection to their windows or doorways

Hornchurch Town Centre is a local town centre and a nightclub/ pub staying open to the very early hours(4.00am) is really out of place and not in keeping with the local area. Hornchurch itself does have a saturation policy in place by Havering Council which states that in order to be granted this application must not only satisfy all the four main licensing objective but there must also be extenuating circumstances.

In our view this application has definitely not shown to the council that there are any extenuating circumstances, as stated in the councils own saturation policy, in order for this application to be granted.

We therefore vigorously object to this application be granted.






