Apologies were received for the absence of Councillors Damian White and Lynden Thorpe. Substitute Members: Councillors Wendy Brice-Thompson (for Lynden Thorpe) and Garry Pain (for Damian White).

Councillors Linda Hawthorn and Dennis Bull were present for parts of the meeting.

There were eight members of the public present at the meeting.

There were no declarations of interest.

Unless the record of voting indicates otherwise all decisions were taken with no votes against.

The Chairman reminded Members of the action to be taken in an emergency

#### 91 **MINUTES**

The minutes of the meetings of the Committee held on 20 March 2012 and 29 March 2012 were agreed as a correct record and signed by the Chairman subject to the addition of the request by Councillor Wood for an amendment to the Minor Traffic and Parking Scheme Request (Reference TPC204) for the implementation of a loading ban on Elm Park Avenue / Broadway to refer to the fact that the applicant resident would be meeting with ward Councillors and Tesco representatives to discuss options.

The minutes of the meetings of the Committee held on 17 April 2012, were agreed as a correct record and signed by the Chairman subject to an

amendment to include the addition of the request by Councillor Eagling for Officers to provide the Committee with a report with an updated list of minor traffic schemes that has been approved by the Committee but were yet to be implemented.

## 92 AIRFIELD WAY PEDESTRIAN REFUGE - OUTCOME OF PUBLIC CONSULTATION

The Committee considered the report and without debate, RESOLVED

- 1. To recommend to the Cabinet Member for Community Empowerment that the highway improvement works on Airfield Way as detailed in the report and shown on drawing QB035/01/01 be approved for implementation.
- 2. That it be noted that the estimated cost of the highway improvement works set out within this report is £18,000 would be funded by the developer under a Section 278/38 (Highway Act 1980) Agreement for the scheme.

### 93 GIDEA PARK CONTROLLED PARKING ZONE - COMMENTS TO ADVERTISED PROPOSALS

The report before the Committee outlined the responses received to the following advertised proposals for amendments to the waiting restrictions, disc parking bays and the inclusion of resident parking provision within the Gidea Park Controlled Parking Zone.

#### 1. Edward Close - Plan No. EDW/01/01

The proposals were to introduce 'At any time' waiting restrictions for 10 metres on the north to south and east to west arms of the junction of Edward Close, also covering the remainder of the northern side of the east to west arm with 'At any time' waiting restrictions.

#### 2. Station Lane - Plan No. BLGRS/01/03

The proposal was to introduce a Pay & Display parking bay, on the southern side of Station Lane, fronting the Post Office. It was proposed that the bay would be operational from 8.00am to 6.30pm Monday to Saturday inclusive, with a maximum stay period of two hours (due to the proposed bay being located on a bus route).

The proposal would provide a much need parking facility for the Post Office and other local retailers.

# **3. Durham and Elvet Avenues** Plan Nos. - DHA/01/01, 02 and DHA/01/01, 03

The proposals were to introduce a residents permit scheme in both roads operational from 8.00am to 10.00am Monday to Friday inclusive. The scheme would be operational in the location of the existing lay-bys, Free Parking Bays and footway parking bays, whilst retaining the existing 'At any time', 8.00am to 6.30pm Monday to Saturday and 8.00am to 10.00am Monday to Friday waiting restrictions throughout the estate.

#### 4. Chalforde Gardens - Plan Nos. CHLG/01/01, 02

The proposals were to introduce a residents permit scheme in the road operational from 8.00am to 6.30pm Monday to Saturday inclusive. The implementation of a Saturday restriction was considered necessary due to the proximity of the road to local shops. Under the proposal the remainder of the road would be restricted with an 'At any time' waiting restrictions, to ensure emergency and service access.

5. The Main Consultation Area (including Crossways, Wallenger Avenue and Compton Avenue) - Plan No. BLGRS/01/02; GPS10/01/01; BALGRS/01/04; BLGRS/01/05

#### The proposals were:

- To convert and extend the existing Free Parking bay on the south-eastern side of Crossways to a Pay & Display parking bay operational from 8.00am to 6.30pm Monday to Saturday inclusive, with a maximum stay period of two hours.
- 2) To implement 'At any time' waiting restrictions in Crossways, fronting no. 76, from a point opposite the western boundary to a point opposite the northern boundary.
- 3) To implement 8.00am to 6.30pm Monday to Saturday waiting restrictions on the western side of Crossways, from the common boundary of nos. 72 and 76 to the common boundary of nos. 58 and 60.
- 4) To implement 8.00am to 6.30pm Monday to Saturday waiting restrictions on the eastern and south-eastern sides of Crossways, between a point 15 metres south of the southern kerb-line of Wallenger Avenue and the existing Taxi Rank to the rear of Gidea Park Station.
- 5) To implement 'At any time' waiting restrictions at the Crossways junction with Wallenger Avenue, in Crossways, on its eastern side, from the common boundary of nos. 73 and 75, to a point 15 metres south of the southern kerb-line of Wallenger Avenue. To extend 'At any time' waiting restrictions into Wallenger Avenue on its southern side to a point 15 metres north-east of the north-

- eastern kerb-line of Cranbrook Drive and on its northern side, to a point 10 metres north-east of the eastern kerb-line of Crossways.
- 6) To implement 'At any time' waiting restrictions in Wallenger Avenue, on its western and north-western sides, from the common boundary of nos. 58 and 60 to the existing Free Parking bay along the flank wall of no. 75 Crossways.
- 7) To implement 8.00am to 6.30pm Monday to Saturday waiting restrictions on the eastern side of Wallenger Avenue, from a point 15 metres north-east of the north-eastern kerb-line of Cranbrook Drive, to a point 15 metres south of the southern kerb-line of Compton Avenue.
- 8) To implement 8.00am to 6.30pm Monday to Saturday waiting restrictions on the western side of Wallenger Avenue, from the common boundary of nos. 48 and 50 to the common boundary of nos. 58 and 60.
- 9) To implement 'At any time' waiting restrictions in Wallenger Avenue, on its eastern side, from a point 10 metres north-west of the northern kerb-line of Compton Avenue to a point 15 metres south of the southern kerb-line of Compton Avenue, extending into Compton Avenue on its northern side for 10 metres and on its southern side for 15 metres
- 10) To implement 'At any time' waiting restrictions for 10 metres on all arms of the Compton Avenue and Pemberton Avenue junction.
- 11) To implement 'At any time' waiting restrictions for 10 metres on all arms of the Cranbrook Drive and Eyre Close junction.
- 12) To implement 'At any time' waiting restrictions in Cranbrook Drive, on its northern side, from its junction with Wallenger Avenue, to the common boundary of nos. 1 and 3 and on its southern side from its junction with Wallenger Avenue, to the common boundary of nos. 2 and 4.
- 13) To implement 'At any time' waiting restrictions in Balgores Lane on its north-eastern side, from a point opposite the north-western building line of no.81, extending north-westwards and north-eastwards into Crossways, to a point opposite the north-easternmost kerb-line of Balgores Square.
- 14) To implement 12.00pm to 1.00pm Monday to Friday waiting restriction in Squirrels Heath Avenue, between the common of Nos.36 and 38 to a point 10 metres south-east of the south-eastern kerbline of Balgores Crescent, in Crossways from the

northern boundary of No.1 to the extent of the proposed restrictions north of Wallenger Avenue and in Wallenger Avenue, from the northern boundary of No.2 to the extent of the proposed restrictions north of Compton Avenue.

- 15) To implement 'At any time' waiting restrictions for 10 metres on all arms of the Balgores Crescent and Squirrels Heath Avenue junction.
- 16) To convert the existing Disc Parking Bay on the western side of Heath Drive and the eastern side of Crossways to a Pay & Display parking bay operational from 8.00am to 6.30pm Monday to Saturday inclusive, with a maximum stay period of two hours.
- 17) To convert the existing Disc Parking Bay on the north-eastern side of Balgores Crescent to a Pay & Display parking bay operational from 8.00am to 5.00pm Monday to Saturday inclusive, with a maximum stay period of two hours. (This will provide further free parking for the residents of the maisonettes fronting this area in the early evening, encourage parental usage when dropping off and picking up children attending Gidea Park College and provide a more convenient parking facility for users of local retailers and banks).
- 18) To extend the existing residents parking scheme for the GP1 area to the common boundary of nos. 36 and 38 and to introduce a Resident Parking bays directly in front of nos. 31, 34 and 36. To implement 'At any time' waiting restrictions on the approach and exits of the central island area, and to extend the associated waiting restrictions throughout the remainder of the road.

In accordance with the public participation arrangements the Committee was addressed by a speaker who expressed her views and concerns over parking issues in Balgores Lane.

Each element of the Scheme was presented to the Committee and voted on as a separate item.

#### 1 Edward Close

The Committee considered the report and after a short debate RESOLVED to recommend to the Cabinet Member for Community Empowerment implementation of Part 1 of the scheme and that the effects of implementation be monitored.

#### 2 Station Lane

The Committee considered the report and after a short debate RESOLVED to recommend to the Cabinet Member for Community Empowerment the implementation of Part 2 of the scheme and that the effects of implementation be monitored.

3 Durham Avenue and Elvet Avenue

The Committee considered the report and after a short debate RESOLVED to recommend to the Cabinet Member for Community Empowerment the implementation of Part 3 of the scheme and that the effects of implementation be monitored.

4 Chalforde Gardens

The Committee considered the report and after a short debate RESOLVED to recommend to the Cabinet Member for Community Empowerment the implementation of Proposal 4 of the scheme and that the effects of implementation be monitored. In addition consideration is to be given to the extension of the Proposal 4 to include maisonettes No's 107 to 113 Balgores Lane following public consultation.

- The Main Consultation Area (including Crossways, Wallenger Avenue and Compton Avenue) the Committee considered the report and after the debate RESOLVED to recommend to the Cabinet Member for Community Empowerment the implementation of Proposal 5 of the scheme with the effects of implementation to be monitored subject to the following amendments (the amendments were voted on as individual items):
  - 5.1 the proposed 8.00am to 6.30pm Monday to Saturday restrictions in Wallenger Avenue, between Cranbrook Drive and Compton Avenue, reduced to operate from 12.00pm to 1.00pm Monday to Friday.

The Committee RESOLVED to approve the amendment unanimously.

5.2 proceed with design and public advertisement of further changes to the 8.00am to 10.00am Monday to Friday restrictions in Cranbrook Drive and Eyre Close to operate 12.00pm to 1.00pm Monday to Friday;

The Committee RESOLVED to approve the amendment unanimously.

5.38.00am to 6.30pm Monday to Saturday restrictions in Crossways, behind the station to remain unchanged.

The Committee RESOLVED to approve the amendment by 8 votes in favour to 1 vote against.

5.4 proceed with design and public advertisement of proposals to restrict the free parking bays in Repton Avenue, Stanley Avenue and Woodfield Drive, at there junctions with Balgores Lane, with a maximum stay period of 4 hours, operational 8.00am to 6.30pm Monday to Saturday

The Committee RESOLVED to approve the amendment by 8 votes in favour with one abstention.

5.5 the extension of the 12.00 pm to 1.00 pm restriction in the area of Pemberton Avenue and Hall Road.

The Committee RESOLVED to approve the amendment by 8 votes in favour with one abstention.

**SUMMARY** 

This report re-presents and recommends proposals to provide a bus stop clearway near Rainham Village Primary School, originally submitted to HAC on 21<sup>st</sup> February 2012.

This scheme is within Rainham and Wennington ward.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

1. That the Committee having considered the information set out in this report recommends to the Cabinet Member for Community Empowerment that the bus stop clearway outside Rainham Health Centre is approved for implementation as detailed in this report and shown on the following drawing:

#### QK009/NC/41.D

2. That it be noted that the estimated cost of the scheme will be £200 which will be met from the 2012/13 Transport for London Local Implementation Plan allocation for School Travel Plans Implementation.

#### REPORT DETAIL

#### 1.0 Background

- 1.1 Rainham Village Primary School fronts Upminster Road South, and lies within a 20mph zone. Traffic cushions have been installed within the vicinity of the school and a Puffin crossing facility with a school crossing patrol serves the school.
- 1.2 At the 21<sup>st</sup> February HAC proposals were reported to improve the parking situation and the school crossing patrol outside Rainham Village Primary School following a request from the school.
- 1.3 The proposals were as follows:
  - a. extend the Puffin crossing zigzags by 4 markings on both sides;
  - b. place a 37.56m school keep clear marking outside the school; and
  - c. Bus stop clearways opposite the school and outside Rainham Health Centre east of the school.
- 1.4 The Committee approved all except the bus stop clearway outside the Health Centre.
- 1.5 The Committee requested that Staff revisit the proposed bus stop clearway outside the Health Centre to investigate the possibility of providing a space for a vehicle to stop and drop-off next outside the Health Centre along with the bus stop clearway.
- 1.6 Transport for London Bus Infrastructure (TfL) was consulted for its view on moving the proposed bus stop clearway to provide a dropping-off parking bay.

#### 2.0 Proposed Bus Stop Clearway Outside Rainham Health Centre

- 2.1 Rainham Health Centre frontage has a patient car park enough for approximately ten cars plus space at the rear for two 'doctor' vehicles. Glenwood Avenue, east of the Centre is a cul-de-sac with footway bays enough for eight cars.
- 2.2 The clearway implemented under the 21<sup>st</sup> February HAC is 10m away from the proposed clearway outside the centre, tail to tail. A clearway length of 27m allows enough room for a vehicle to be parked at either end and for the bus to pull in and pull out.
- 2.3 It is proposed to move the bus stop flag (at TfL's expense) as this indicates to the driver where to align the doors, ensuring passengers do not encounter dropped kerbs when alighting and boarding the bus. The flag will be between the two drop kerbs for the Health Centre car park.

#### 3.0 Transport for London Comments

- 3.1 TfL confirmed that moving the clearway further west would put it too close to the newly installed clearway opposite and mean the drop kerbs for the Centre car park would be in the way. This would also put the clearway on the speed table and across the entrance to the neighbouring property. Moving the clearway further east would put the clearway too close to Glenwood Avenue, obscuring visibility at the junction.
- 3.2 TfL acknowledged that as there are no 'at any time' parking restrictions around the junction of Glenwood Avenue, a vehicle could drop-off between the Glenwood Avenue and the bus stop; this would not hinder the bus exiting the stop.
- 3.3 There is no proposal to install 'at any time' parking restrictions around Glenwood Avenue as this goes beyond the original remit of improving pedestrian safety outside Rainham Village Primary School.

#### 4.0 Staff Comments

4.1 There is parking provision in and around the Health Centre and room for dropping off passengers outside the Centre without affecting the original proposal for the bus stop clearway. Hence the proposal being presented in this report remains unchanged from the 21<sup>st</sup> February report.

#### **IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS**

#### Financial implications and risks:

That it be noted that the estimated cost of the scheme will be £200 which will be met from the 2012/13 Transport for London Local Implementation Plan allocation for School Travel Plans Implementation.

#### Legal implications and risks:

Bus Stop Clearways do not require traffic orders, but Department for Transport guidance suggests that local consultations should take place. This Bus Stop Clearway went to public consultation as part of the 21<sup>st</sup> February HAC.

#### **Human Resources implications and risks:**

None.

#### **Equalities Implications and Risks:**

Bus stop facilities should improve flow of buses and the safety of all boarding and alighting passengers.

**SUMMARY**

#### **REPORT DETAIL**

#### 1.0 Background

- 1.1 At a meeting of this Committee on 25<sup>th</sup> February 2011, a request was put forward to implement restrictions at the junction of Wingletye Lane and Essex Gardens to keep the highway clear at school times. This Committee recommended the scheme to go forward for public consultation.
- 1.2 However, the scheme was inadvertently placed on the Schemes works programme deferral list and as a result, not progressed. Following an enquiry from a resident via Cllr Roger Ramsey in February 2012, the matter was investigated, the scheme subsequently designed by staff and publicly advertised on 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2012. This report outlines the responses received arising out of the public consultation.

#### 2.0 Proposed Scheme

#### 2.1 Essex Gardens / Wingletye Lane – Drawing No. WLER/01/01

The scheme is within the <u>Emerson Park Ward</u> and was recommended for consultation by Committee on 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2011.

The scheme proposes to introduce 'At any time' waiting restrictions at the junction of Essex Gardens and Wingletye Lane, on the eastern side of Wingletye Lane from a point 15 metres south of the southern kerb-line of Essex Gardens, to a point 15 metres north of the northern kerb-line of Essex Gardens. It is further proposed to introduce 'At any time' waiting restrictions on the northern side of Essex Gardens from the eastern kerb-line of Wingletye Lane to the eastern boundary of No. 392 Wingletye Lane and on the southern side from the eastern kerb-line of Wingletye Lane, eastwards for a distance of 15 metres.

#### Outcome of Public consultation - Responses received

#### **Highways Advisory Committee, 19 June 2012**

At the close of public consultation on 16<sup>th</sup> April 2012, no responses were received to the proposals.

The proposals were advertised in the Romford Recorder and London Gazette. In addition, 18 statutory bodies and 44 residents were consulted on the proposals.

#### Staff comments

Whilst no responses were received to the public consultation, it is clear from correspondence received by officers via Councillor Ramsey in February 2012 that obstructive and dangerous parking is regularly taking place at this location.

#### **Recommended Action**

That the proposals be implemented as advertised and the effects be monitored.

**IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS** 

#### Financial implications and risks:

The estimated cost of this scheme as set out in this report is £500 and can be funded from the 2012/13 Minor Parking Schemes budget.

The costs shown are an estimate of the full costs to implement the proposed schemes. It should be noted that the Cabinet Member approval process will be completed where a scheme is recommended for implementation.

Overall costs will need to be contained within the overall revenue budget.

#### Legal implications and risks:

Waiting restrictions and parking bays require consultation and the advertisement of proposals before a decision can be taken on their introduction.

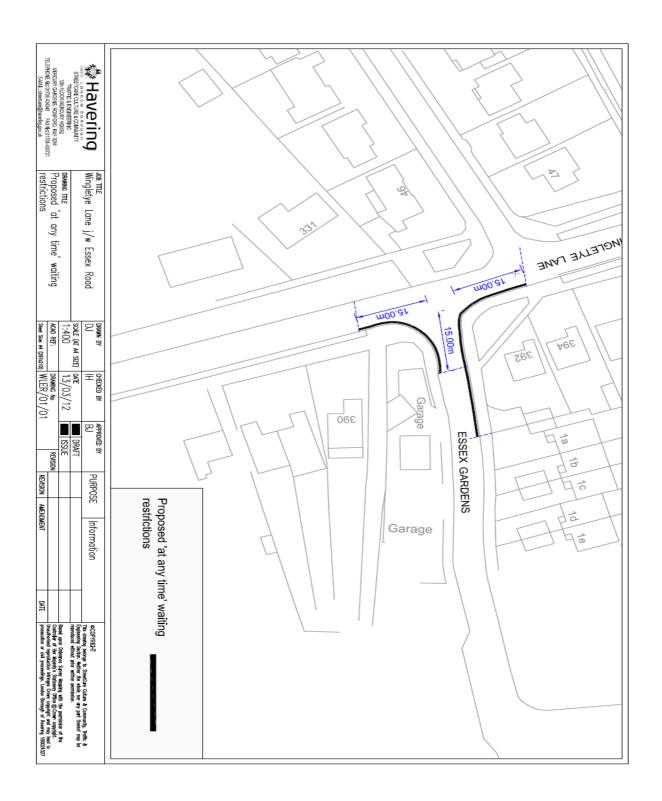

#### REPORT DETAIL

#### 1.0 Background

At its meeting on 24<sup>th</sup>January 2012, this Committee considered a report on the responses received to the public advertisement of proposed waiting and loading restrictions in the unnamed road leading off of Bridge Close. As a result of a representation received to these proposals, this Committee agreed in principle to the introduction of a loading bay, in the turning head at the northern end of the road.

1.1 This report outlines the one response received to the proposals and recommends a further course of action.

#### 2.0 Proposed Scheme

#### 2.1 Bridge Close Loading Bay – Drawing No. QJ077-OF-05

The scheme is within the <u>Romford Town Ward</u> and was recommended for consultation by Committee on 24<sup>th</sup>January 2012.

The scheme proposes to introduce a loading bay, operational 6am to 9pm throughout the week, situated on the south-eastern kerbline of the northwesternmost south-west to north-east arm of the unnamed road leading off of Bridge Close.

#### Outcome of Public consultation - Responses received

The proposals were advertised in the Romford Recorder and London Gazette. In addition, 18 statutory bodies and 20 residents and businesses were also consulted on the proposals.

At the close of public consultation on 16<sup>th</sup> April 2012, one response had been received to the proposals. This was from the company who the loading bay was intended to assist. This response outlined the company's agreement to the proposals.

#### Staff comments

This proposal was created as a result of the previous proposals to introduce waiting and loading restrictions in this section of the road and was designed to overcome the loading issue related to this business.

#### **Recommended Action**

That the proposals be implemented as advertised and the effects be monitored.

The estimated cost of this scheme as set out in this report is £600 and can be funded from the 2012/13 Minor Parking Schemes budget.

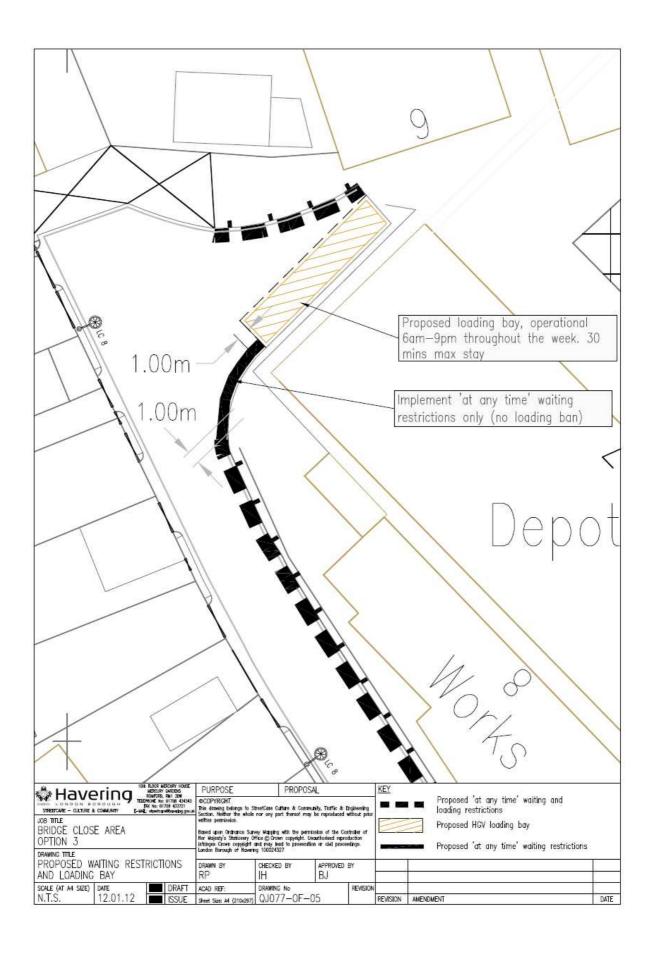

- 1.6 The schedule contains information on funding source, likely budget (as a self-contained scheme, including staff design costs), the request originator, date placed on the schedule and a contact point so that Staff may inform the person requesting the scheme the outcome of the Committee decision.
