Members are advised that, when considering an application to vary a premises licence, the following options are available to them by virtue of the Licensing Act 2003, Part 3, section 35, paragraphs 3 and 4:

"Where relevant representations are made, the authority must

- (a) hold a hearing to consider them, unless the authority, the applicant and each person who has made such representations agree that a hearing is unnecessary, and
- (b) having regard to the representations, take such steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

#### The steps are:

- a) modify the conditions of the licence
- b) reject the whole or part of the application

and for this purpose, the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added."

The Sub-Committee will also wish to note that, if none of these steps is required, the application must be granted.

Assuming that the Sub-Committee is satisfied that a hearing is required, then the following procedural steps are recommended. The Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 will govern the arrangements for the hearing of the application now under consideration. This report accords with the requirements of that Act and the Regulations, and in particular Regulations 21-25 (procedure at the hearing).

#### 1. Membership of the Sub-Committee:

- 1.1 The Sub-Committee comprises three members of the Licensing Committee, with a quorum of two members. Unless there are objections, in the absence of three members, the hearing shall proceed with the quorum of two.
- 1.2 A members of the Licensing Committee will be excluded from hearing an application where he or she:
  - 1.2.1 has considered an application in respect of the premises in the previous 12 months as a Member of the Regulatory Services Committee: or
  - 1.2.2 is a Ward Councillor for the Ward in which the premises, subject to the application, are located; or
  - 1.2.3 is a Ward Councillor for a Ward which is likely to be affected by the application or;
  - 1.2.4 has a personal interest in the application.

#### 2. Roles of other participants:

- 2.1 The Legal Advisor is not a party to the hearing. The role of the Legal Advisor is to provide legal advice relating to the application and submissions.
- 2.2 The Clerk is not a party to the hearing. The role of the Clerk is to record the hearing and the decisions of the Sub-Committee, and ensure efficient administration

#### 3. Representation validation meeting:

- 3.1 Prior to this hearing, the Sub-Committee Chairman will have met the Legal Advisor and/or Clerk to determine whether further clarification is required of any issues contained in the application or any representation.
- 3.2 During this preliminary meeting no decision will have been made or discussion held regarding the substantive merits of the application or representations.

#### 4. Location and facilities:

- 4.1 All hearings will be heard at the Havering Town Hall unless otherwise directed.
- 4.2 Interpreters will be provided by the Council on request, provided notice is given at least five working days before the hearing.

#### 5. Notification of attendance:

5.1 The Chairman will enquire of the parties who is in attendance and the parties will indicate their names (and, where relevant, whom they represent). A register will be circulated before the commencement of the hearing on which the applicant, his/her advisers and companions and all interested parties (and/or their representatives) will be asked to record their attendance.

#### 6. Procedural matters:

- 6.1 Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Chairman of the Sub-Committee will orally inform the parties whether their applications to have certain people attend the hearing (e.g. witnesses) have been granted or refused. Note this relates to people other than those attending on behalf of a party in the capacity as a representative of the party.
- 6.2 Prior to the commencement of the hearing the Chairman of the Sub-Committee will outline the procedure to be followed at the hearing. This will normally be as follows:

#### Introduction of the application:

The Licensing officer will outline:

- details of the application and relevant representations received from the parties;
- relevant legislation;
- relevant Licensing Policy; and
- the time limit in which the Council must reach a determination.

#### **Documentary evidence:**

- Documentary or other information in support of applications, representations or notices should be provided to the Clerk of the Sub-Committee at least 5 clear working days before the hearing. If this information is produced at the hearing it will only be taken into account by the Sub-Committee if the Sub-Committee and all the parties consent to its submission. Permission to have this information included in the hearing should be requested at the beginning of the hearing before any oral submissions have been made.
- Statements made by people in support of a party's representation who are not present at the hearing, must be signed by the maker, dated and witnessed by another person. The statement must also contain the witness's full name and occupation.

#### Representations:

- The chairman will invite each of the parties at the hearing or their representative sequentially to address the Sub-Committee and call any person/s to whom permission has been granted to appear. Each party will be allowed a maximum period of 10 minutes in which to address the Sub-Committee and call persons on his/her behalf.
- This 10 minute period is where each party has the opportunity to orally address the Sub-Committee and clarify any points in which the Sub-Committee has sought clarification prior to the hearing. This 10 minute period should be uninterrupted unless a member of the Sub-Committee or Legal Advisor considers that the speaker is making submissions that are irrelevant, frivolous or vexatious.
- Members of the Sub-Committee may ask questions of any party, at any time during the proceedings. Time taken in dealing with a Member's question will not be taken into account in determining the length of time available to the party in question to make their representation.

The sequence in which each of the parties will be invited to address the Sub-Committee will normally be in the order of:

- the Chief Officer of Police;
- the Fire Authority;
- the Health and Safety at Work Enforcing Authority;
- the Local Planning Authority;
- the Local environmental Health Authority;
- the Local Weights and Measures Authority;
- the Authority Responsible for the Protection of Children from Harm:
- a navigation or other authority responsible for waterways; and
- any other party that has submitted representations in respect of the application, certificate, notice or other matter appearing before the Sub-Committee;
- the party that has submitted the application, certificate, notice or other matter appearing before the Sub-Committee.

At the discretion of the Sub-Committee the above order may be varied.

#### **Cross-Examination:**

Where witnesses have been permitted by the Sub-Committee to speak at the hearing on behalf of a party, permission must be sought from the Sub-Committee before another party can ask the witness questions. This process of questioning is normally referred to as cross-examination. The Sub-Committee will allow cross-examination only

where it is necessary to assist it in considering the representations or application.

#### Relevance:

Information submitted at the hearing must be relevant to the applications, representations, or notice and the promotion of the licensing objectives. The Chairman of the Sub-Committee is entitled to exclude any information it considers to be irrelevant whether presented in written or oral form. The licensing objectives are:

The prevention of crime and disorder;
Public safety;
The prevention of public nuisance; and
The protection of children from harm.

#### 7. Failure of parties to attend the hearing:

7.1 If a party, who has not given prior notice of his/her intention not to attend the hearing, is absent from the hearing the Sub-Committee may either adjourn the hearing or hold the hearing in the party's absence. Where the hearing is held in the absence of a party, the Sub-Committee will still consider the application, representation or notice submitted by that party.

#### 8. Adjournments and extension of time:

- 8.1 The Sub-Committee may adjourn a hearing to a specified date or extend a notice period except where it must make a determination within certain time limits in the following specific applications:
  - Applications for conversion of existing licences where the Sub-Committee must make a determination within 2 months of the application first being received. In default of a decision being made the application will be treated as being granted;
  - Applications for variation of existing licences where the Sub-Committee must make a determination within 2 months of the application first being received. In default of a decision being made the application will be treated as being rejected;
  - Applications for conversion of existing club certificates where the Sub-Committee must make a determination within 2 months of the application being first received. In default of a decision being made the application will be treated as being granted;

- Applications for variation of existing club certificates where the Sub-Committee must make a determination within 2 months of the application being first received. In default of a decision being made the application will be treated as being rejected;
- Applications made by holders of justices' licences for personal licences must be determined within 3 months of the application first being received. In default of a decision not being made within this period the application will be treated as being granted;
- Review of premises licences following closure orders where the Sub-committee must make a determination within 28 days of receiving notice of the closure order.

#### 9. Sub-Committee's determination of the hearing:

- 9.1 At the conclusion of the hearing the Sub-Committee will deliberate in private accompanied by the Clerk and the Legal Advisor who will be available to assist the Sub-Committee with any legal problems but will not participate in any decision making of the Sub-Committee.
- 9.2 The Sub-Committee will normally make its determination and announce its decision at the end of the hearing.
- 9.3 Where all parties have notified the Sub-Committee that a hearing is not required the Sub-Committee must make its determination within 10 working days of being given notice that the hearing is not required.

#### 10. Power to exclude people from hearing:

- 10.1 The public are entitled to attend the hearing as spectators. However, the Sub-Committee may exclude any person from the hearing including any person assisting or representing a party where:
  - it considers that the public interest would be best served by excluding the public or the individual person from the hearing; or
  - that person is behaving in a disruptive manner. This may include a
    party who is seeking to be heard at the hearing. In the case where a
    party is to be excluded, the party may submit to the Sub-Committee
    in writing any information which they would have been entitled to
    give orally had they not been required to leave the hearing.

#### 11. Recording of proceedings:

11.1 A written record of the hearing will be produced and kept for 6 years from the date of the determination of the hearing.

#### 12. Power to vary procedure:

12.1 The Sub-committee may depart from following any of the procedures set out in this document if it considers the departure to be necessary in order to consider an application, notice or representation.

This application for a variation to a premises licence is made by Mr Irshadur Rahman under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003. The application was received by Havering's Licensing Authority on 19<sup>th</sup> December 2012.

#### Geographical description of the area and description of the building

The premises are a single unit mid terrace venue with a restaurant on the ground floor.

The premises are located on the north side of High Street Hornchurch at the junction with Station Lane, all the surrounding premises are shops or businesses on the ground floor many have residential property above. Akash restaurant has a residential flat above it. Most other premises within the area are residential.

There are good public transport links to this part of the borough; there is a mini cab office nearby and the premise is within easy walking distance of Hornchurch Underground station.

The premises are situated in St Andrews Ward and as such is listed in the Havering Licensing Policy cumulative impact area.

A map of the area is attached to assist the committee.

The premises have been of concern to the Licensing Authority in relation to unlicensed activity which resulted in Licensing Officer Paul Jones issuing a warning letter on 12<sup>th</sup> November 2012 (copy attached) and a second on 19<sup>th</sup> November 2012 (copy attached). The premises failed a test purchase selling alcohol and late night refreshment to Mr Jones on 25<sup>th</sup> November at 00.25hrs which has resulted in a pending prosecution of the venue for unlicensed activity.

I would like to lodge my obections to the above application for extended hours, add entertainment, extend opening hourse, add seasonal variations and remove conditions

This venue is in the middle of the town centre, and above are flats, which clearly are occupied by families with young children, if you proceed to the rear of the properties, you will note from the entrances to the flats that there are families accommodating the flats above the shops and this restaurant.

With noise from patrons leaving, not everyon keeps to the rules and this would be difficult for the applicants to police, clearly this is against the protection of young children from harm, they will clearly be distrubed in the early hours of the morning, with school to attend the very next day

Extending hours for alchol Mon-Thurs - 12.30am Sat 1/30am and Sun 11.30 is clearly not acceptable Live music and recorded till 1.30 Fri and Sat, when will these children ever be able to achieve necessary restful periods. Most of the bedrooms if not all face the front onto the High Street. even those opposite will be affected noise and voices carry.

The preventiaon of crime and disorder will be a problem with lound noise, music, patrons leaving the accommdoation at all hours of the early morning, when people drink it is clear they become louder in voice, there may well be banging of car doors, tooting of cabs, and for those who decide to walk home, what route will they take, will be remain calm and quiet, not a chance, so each and every route they take, people will be affected.

Public safety is a concern as often arguments and disagreements follow drinking and we all know many resuult in fights, pushing and shoving. So many stories of groups of people who have been drinking where they have ganged up on lone pedestrians, close by this venue are major bus stops, where at all times of the day and night/evening there are people waiting for transport.

Prevention of pubnlic nuisence is clearly covered in the above three issues, noise of the music, noise of car doors, noise of loud voices, noise of tooting cars, and what are the applicants going to offer that others are not already offering.

There are a large number of licenced venues, restaurants in Hornchurch, why are they trying to delve into the club.bar areas, with music to all hours. A concern is that venues that close earlier will most certainly attract those wishing to continue drinking for longer, will there be any monitoring or policing

internally to ensure that drink is only supplied with food, and does that mean that food will be served until 1.30am which in itself creates another issue that there will continue to be people on the premises for yet another hour to empty the premises and then to clear up

Surely this will create more problems in all areas, what about pay days, will staff not be more vulnerable with money in their pockets, I am sure that in such venues their wages are rarely paid into a bank account. Its very much a cash payment world. Will patrons leaving keep to the rules,.

There are most certainly less police visible in the Hornchurch area, especially if there are problems elsewhere in the borough, so this leaves the area very vulnerable in all manners.

Surely the saturation policy is valid in this area. The policy can be used if an applicant cannot prove with evidence that he or she will be providing something in addition, something extra to what other local suppliers are providing, and in this case this cannot be proved. This a simple restaurant wanting to get in on the act, they providing more and nothing less than other venues in the area, so there is no question that this application for variations and removal of conditions must be refused without a doubt.

Police wish to make representation against the application to vary the premises licence for Akash Tandoori, 185 High Street, Hornchurch, RM11 3XS

The premise falls within the saturation zone of St Andrews ward, police feel that granting of additional hours has requested by the applicant will add to cumulative impact in this ward. This will have a negative effect on the licensing objectives; prevention of crime and disorder along with the prevention of public nuisance.

Allowing the premises to be open Friday and Saturday evenings until 0130 hours for licensable activity and to close by 0200 hours, will impact on an area under stress. This could be by the volume of patron's entering and leaving the premises, additional noise in the street created by people and vehicles, along with the potential for crime both on and off the premise, street urination, criminal damage and disorderly conduct in the streets. All which are seen often within this area at 0100 hours.

The majority of bars and restaurants close at 0100 hours within this area, allowing these premises to remain open will not assist in the dispersal of patrons from the saturation zone. There is no public transport at such hours. There are residential properties around this location and residents should not be subject to further noise and disturbance in the streets until 0200 hours and onwards.

Police would like to purpose the following hours to vary the application for the supply of alcohol, late night refreshment and recorded music.

Monday - Thursday 1000 - 0000

Friday and Saturday from 1000 - 0030

Sunday 1000 - 2330 this takes into account the mixed use within the ward.


The premises to close by: Monday - Thursday 1000 - 0030 Friday and Saturday 1000 - 0100 Sunday 1000 - 0000 Police would like to further purpose a conditional that there will be a last admittance to the restaurant at mid night on Friday and Saturday evenings. This will allow the restaurant sufficient time to serve hot food and alcohol before closure. This will also assist in the dispersal of patrons within the area at 0100 hours. The noise disturbance to residents from patrons will be limited due to other venues also closing at such times and, residents will not be subject to further noise at 0200 hours and onwards.

#### Licensing Act 2003 Akash Tandoori 185 High Street Hornchurch RM11 3XS Premises licence variation application

Further to the above this Licensing Authority makes representation against this application in its role as a responsible authority. Our representation is based upon the Licensing Authority's belief that the applicant will be unable to successfully promote the licensing objectives in relation to the prevention of public nuisance and the prevention of crime and disorder if the application is granted as submitted.

Akash Tandoori is located in Hornchurch's town centre in the St Andrews ward. This ward is subject to a cumulative impact policy in relation to licensed premises; however, restaurants are not included in the ambit of this specific policy. We suggest that there are a number of other policies which should be considered when determining this application.

Havering's licensing policy 012 in relation to the hours during which licensed premises may operate states thus:

The LLA is committed to protecting the amenity of residents and businesses in the vicinity of licensed premises. Applications for hours set out below in this policy will generally be granted subject to not being contrary to other policies in the statement of licensing policy. Applications for hours outside the hours listed will be considered on their merits.

Regulated activities will normally be permitted:

- until 11.30 pm in residential areas
- until 00.30 am in mixed use areas
- no limits in leisure areas

Contd.

This application seeks to permit the provision of licensable activity at the premises until 00:30 during the week and 01:30 at weekends while the premises intends to remain open to customers for an additional half an hour until 01:00 and 02:00 respectively. The extra half an hour is to permit the consumption of food and drink purchased previously. The area contains a mixture of commercial and residential properties and thus the application seeks to go beyond the generally accepted hours of policy 012 at weekends. We suggest that to provide licensable activity beyond the terminal hour of 00:30 for mixed use areas would add to the potential for public nuisance in this area during the provision of licensable activity – live music in particular – and when customers leave the premises.

In relation to the supply of alcohol at the premises the application at section J indicates that the supply of alcohol may be made for consumption *on* the premises only. Section M details the steps which are intended to be taken by the applicant to promote the licensing objectives. Undertakings detailed here in relation to the supply of alcohol include the provision that *no drinks may be taken from the premises*. Additionally, *persons collecting a take away meal shall not be served alcohol*. While these undertakings are commendable we must question the applicant's commitment to their implementation. A take away menu from the restaurant (please see copy included) indicates that various forms of "free" alcohol are delivered to customers' homes with take away set-meal deals. The mobile phone number provided on the menu is that of the applicant.

Supplying alcohol by retail sale requires a licence to authorise it while giving away alcohol does not. Alcohol supplied in such circumstances as detailed on this take away menu constitutes the sale by retail of alcohol as the cost of the so called "free" alcohol is included in the overall cost of the meal. Alcohol may only be considered to be given away free if such a supply is not dependent upon the purchase of some other service or article. Should such alcohol supplies be made it may reasonably be seen to be done so illegally as the premises licence does not permit *off* sales of alcohol. Equally, the applicant has not identified any measures in section M in relation to delivering alcohol to an address whereupon under-18s may be the recipients. Such matters might reasonably be seen to fail to promote the licensing objective in relation to the prevention of crime and disorder. The applicant's apparent failure to recognise these significant issues causes this Licensing Authority some concern.

Additionally, in relation to promoting the prevention of crime and disorder and as a matter of record, we are obliged to draw to the sub-committee's attention the fact that the applicant is currently in the process of being prosecuted by this Licensing Authority for recent licensing offences which took place at this premises. Given that this prosecution is currently *sub judice* we don't propose to detail the matter further suffice to say that this Licensing Authority has concerns that the applicant for this variation is not fully committed to the promotion of the licensing objectives. Therefore we suggest that the sub-committee takes into account the provisions of licensing policy 015 when arriving at a determination of this application, particularly the policy's requirement to consider the *past compliance history of current management*.

To summarise, this Licensing Authority is not opposed in principle to this premises licence being varied. Indeed, restaurants in the St Andrews ward are exempted from licensing policy 017 in relation to cumulative impact in the area. Havering clearly seeks to encourage the establishment of restaurant premises in this zone in line with its overall licensing policy. As a Licensing Authority we fully support this tenet. A desire to encourage such business development, however, must be weighed against any potential impact an expansion to activities at a given premises may generate. We are duty bound to consider those residents and neighbours who may potentially be affected by licensable activity provided at a premises which goes beyond those hours Havering's licensing policy has identified as reasonable in this area. Our duty must be to identify the balance between the needs of the applicant and the needs of his neighbours.

Given the applicant's past compliance history and the application's desire to exceed the bounds of licensing policy 012 we would not be prepared to support this application in its current form. While an application for extended hours may be granted it should be done so only if the merits of the application convincingly demonstrate that an exception to the relevant policies is appropriate. We suggest that the application as submitted does not demonstrate a compelling argument for a relaxation of the provisions of licensing policy 012. Therefore, if the sub-committee is minded to grant the application, we would suggest that it may be appropriate to do so in line with policy 012. Additionally we would not oppose any terminal hour for the provision of late night refreshment which is in line with any alcohol supply terminal hour which may be determined.

I trust that this satisfactorily establishes our position.

Formal Warning

As Havering's Licensing Officer for the Hornchurch area it is my responsibility to ensure that all premises, including currently licensed premises, comply with the provisions of this Act. Your premises detailed above is licensed under this Act and the premises licence is held jointly by you both.

The premises licence for *Akash Tandoori* permits the supply of alcohol to be made at the premises Monday to Saturday 10:00 to 00:00 and Sunday 12:00 to 23:30. Additionally the premises may remain open to patrons during the same hours. This also means that hot food supplies must cease at the premises at 23:00 each night as the licence does not permit the provision of late night refreshment.

Effectively, then, the last hot meal or hot drink may be supplied at 23:00 while alcohol may be supplied until midnight (or 23:30 on a Sunday). At this time the restaurant must be emptied of patrons.

On the evening of Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> November 2012 leading into 10<sup>th</sup> November I conducted a monitoring patrol and noted that your premises was still open at 00:30. Patrons were seen inside the premises eating what may reasonably be assumed to be hot food and drinking what was clearly seen to be alcohol. This is in breach of the permission your premises licence affords and as such constitutes a series of criminal offences contrary to s.136(1) of this Act.

Contd.

Additionally, I noted that a poster in your premises' window indicates that a live music act will be performing at the premises on 21<sup>st</sup> November 2012. You may be aware that the recent *Live Music Act 2012* came into force recently. As such live music is able to be provided without the requirement for a premises licence to authorise its provision as long as certain criteria are met. I have included a briefing note with this letter for your reference. As long as any live music is provided in accordance with the provisions of the *Live Music Act 2012* you will not breach your premises licence conditions. If, however, live music is provided outside its bounds, e.g. after 23:00, you will commit a criminal offence contrary to s.136(1) of this Act and further action will be likely to follow.

Therefore, please accept this letter as a formal warning to cease the illegal provision of licensable activity at your premises. Please familiarise yourself with the terms and conditions of your premises licence and ensure that you are fully compliant with its requirements. A failure to comply with all of its provisions will likely result in criminal offences being committed. For information purposes the maximum penalty which may be imposed upon a summary conviction for such an offence is £20,000 fine and/or six months imprisonment. Therefore, you can see that the law, and hence this Licensing Authority, takes such matters seriously.

If you feel that your premises licence no longer meets the needs of your restaurant you may seek a variation of the licence. Further information regarding this may be found here:

Any repetition of the matters listed above is likely to result in further action being taken against you, the ultimate outcome of which may be for the London Borough of Havering to seek a prosecution against you both as those responsible for the illegal provision of licensable activity at the premises.

#### The Live Music Act 2012

The Live Music Act 2012 passed into law on 8<sup>th</sup> March 2012. It comes into effect from 1<sup>st</sup> October 2012.

The Act disapplies live music related conditions if the following criteria are satisfied:

- There is a premises licence or CPC in place permitting alcohol 'on supplies'
- The premises is open for the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises
- Live music is taking place between 8am and 11pm
- The audience consists of no more than 200 people if the live music is amplified

Live amplified music also ceases to be classed as regulated entertainment if the above criteria are satisfied.

The Act also creates a general exemption that live unamplified music provided anywhere shall not be regarded as the provision of regulated entertainment if it takes place between 8am and 11pm regardless of the number of people in the audience.

There are a number of mechanisms in place for the protection of residents:

- Upon a review of a premises licence the Licensing Authority can determine that conditions on the premises licence relating to live music will apply even between 8am and 11pm
- If the premises licence does not currently authorise live music the Licensing Authority can add conditions to the premises licence as though the live music were regulated entertainment authorised by that licence, again to apply between 8am and 11pm
- The Licensing Authority can determine that live music at the premises is a licensable activity and live music can no longer be provided without permission on the premises licence or a TEN
- Existing noise legislation, e.g. Environmental Protection Act 1990, will continue to apply. The Live Music Act 2012 does not allow licensed premises to cause a noise nuisance

The Act also completely removes the requirement to licence entertainment facilities regardless of audience size. This means that dance floors, pianos made available for use by the public etc, will no longer be licensable come 1<sup>st</sup> October.

Further to my earlier warning letter of 12<sup>th</sup> November 2012 I note that the following issues are still unresolved.

On the morning of 17<sup>th</sup> November 2012 I observed that your premises detailed above was occupied by patrons who clearly had plated meals and alcohol on the table in front of them which they were consuming. As my previous letter indicated hot food and/or drink supplies must cease at your premises at 23:00. There is no provision for the supply of late night refreshment on premises licence no. 2160. The fact that patrons were observed consuming these meals an hour and a half after hot food supplies should have ceased suggests that late night refreshment was supplied after 23:00 and thus supplied illegally.

Equally, alcohol supplies should have ceased at 00:00 which is the time the premises licence requires that all patrons have left the premises. Quite clearly, this was not the case.

If you provide late night refreshment at your premises after 23:00 you will break the law. This will then place your premises licence in breach. Consequently any alcohol supplied between 23:00 and 00:00 will be done so illegally even though alcohol may normally be supplied under the authority of the licence until 00:00: the licence will have already been breached by the illegal late night refreshment supplies, thus negating the authority of the licence.

Contd.

You should be aware that if the matters detailed above recur I shall have no alternative other than to undertake further action against you as premises licence holders. This action will be likely to result in the London Borough of Havering seeking to prosecute you for offences contrary to s.136(1) of the Licensing Act 2003, i.e. knowingly carrying on a licensable activity from a premises otherwise than in an accordance with an authorisation. Please again be advised for information purposes that the maximum penalty for a s.136(1) offence is £20,000 and/or six months' imprisonment. The law, and hence this Licensing Authority, takes such matters seriously.

To confirm, this is Havering's <u>final</u> warning regarding these matters. I am afraid that any further illegal activity observed within your premises will likely proceed straight to prosecution. I therefore urge you to comply fully with all provisions of your premises licence.

# **CER 0911 – Ceredigion Council**

### **Mandatory conditions**

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
  - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following: activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children –
    - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to
      - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
      - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
    - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
    - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
    - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-
      - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
      - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

### Mandatory conditions - contd.

- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 4. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that -
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures
    - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
  - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.
- 7. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

### Annex 2 – conditions consistent with the operating schedule

- 1. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours with the exception of:
  - (a) Good Friday 12:00 to 23:30;
  - (b) Christmas Day 12:00 to 23:30;
  - (c) New Year's Eve except on a Sunday 11:00 to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or if there are no permitted hours on the following day midnight on 31st December);
  - (d) New Year's Eve on a Sunday 12:00 to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or if there are no permitted hours on the following day midnight on 31st December).
- 2. Subject to the following exceptions no person shall except during the permitted hours listed above sell or supply alcohol for consumption on or off the premises or consume in or take from the premises any alcohol. The exceptions are:

Annex 2 – conditions consistent with the operating schedule – contd.

- (a) the consumption of alcohol:
  - (i) during the first twenty minutes after the permitted hours;
  - (ii) during the first thirty minutes after the permitted hours by persons taking meals on the premises provided that the alcohol is provided as ancillary to the meals;
- (b) the taking of alcohol from the premises during the first twenty minutes after the permitted hours provided it is not supplied or taken in an open container;
- (c) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (d) the sale or supply of alcohol to or its consumption by any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (e) the taking of alcohol from the licensed premises by a person residing there;
- (f) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by such person at that person's own expense and consumption by those friends of alcohol so supplied;
- (g) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence or the consumption of liquor so supplied if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises;
- (h) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (i) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces.
- 3. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied unless it is paid for before or at the time when it is sold or supplied, except alcohol sold or supplied:
  - (a) with and for consumption at a meal supplied at the same time, consumed with the meal and paid for together with the meal;
  - (b) for consumption by a person residing in the premises or his guest and paid for together with his accommodation.
- 4. No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:
  - (a) he is the child of the holder of the premises licence;
  - (b) he resides in the premises but is not employed there;
  - (c) he is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress;
  - (d) the bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.


