Members are advised that, when considering an application to vary a premises licence, the following options are available to them by virtue of the Licensing Act 2003, Part 3, section 35, paragraphs 3 and 4:

"Where relevant representations are made, the authority must

- (a) hold a hearing to consider them, unless the authority, the applicant and each person who has made such representations agree that a hearing is unnecessary, and
- (b) having regard to the representations, take such steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

The steps are:

- a) modify the conditions of the licence
- b) reject the whole or part of the application

and for this purpose, the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added."

The Sub-Committee will also wish to note that, if none of these steps is required, the application must be granted.

Assuming that the Sub-Committee is satisfied that a hearing is required, then the following procedural steps are recommended. The Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 will govern the arrangements for the hearing of the application now under consideration. This report accords with the requirements of that Act and the Regulations, and in particular Regulations 21-25 (procedure at the hearing).

1. Membership of the Sub-Committee:

- 1.1 The Sub-Committee comprises three members of the Licensing Committee, with a quorum of two members. **Unless there are objections, in the absence of three members, the hearing shall proceed with the quorum of two**.
- 1.2 A members of the Licensing Committee will be excluded from hearing an application where he or she:
 - 1.2.1 has considered an application in respect of the premises in the previous 12 months as a Member of the Regulatory Services Committee; or
 - 1.2.2 is a Ward Councillor for the Ward in which the premises, subject to the application, are located; or
 - 1.2.3 is a Ward Councillor for a Ward which is likely to be affected by the application or;
 - 1.2.4 has a personal interest in the application.

2. Roles of other participants:

- 2.1 The Legal Advisor is not a party to the hearing. The role of the Legal Advisor is to provide legal advice relating to the application and submissions.
- 2.2 The Clerk is not a party to the hearing. The role of the Clerk is to record the hearing and the decisions of the Sub-Committee, and ensure efficient administration

3. Chairman's Briefing meeting:

- 3.1 Prior to this hearing, the Sub-Committee Chairman will have met the Legal Advisor and/or Clerk to determine whether further clarification is required of any issues contained in the application or any representation.
- 3.2 During this preliminary meeting no decision will have been made or discussion held regarding the substantive merits of the application or representations.

4. Location and facilities:

- 4.1 All hearings will be heard at the Havering Town Hall unless otherwise directed.
- 4.2 Interpreters will be provided by the Council on request, provided notice is given at least five working days before the hearing.

5. Notification of attendance:

5.1 The Chairman will enquire of the parties who is in attendance and the parties will indicate their names (and, where relevant, whom they represent). A register will be circulated before the commencement of the hearing on which the applicant, his/her advisers and companions and all interested parties (and/or their representatives) will be asked to record their attendance.

6. Procedural matters:

- 6.1 Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Chairman of the Sub-Committee will orally inform the parties whether their applications to have certain people attend the hearing (e.g. witnesses) have been granted or refused. Note this relates to people other than those attending on behalf of a party in the capacity as a representative of the party.
- 6.2 Prior to the commencement of the hearing the Chairman of the Sub-Committee will outline the procedure to be followed at the hearing. This will normally be as follows:

Introduction of the application:

The Licensing officer will outline:

- details of the application and relevant representations received from the parties;
- relevant legislation;
- relevant Licensing Policy; and
- the time limit in which the Council must reach a determination.

Documentary evidence:

- Documentary or other information in support of applications, representations or notices should be provided to the Clerk of the Sub-Committee at least 5 clear working days before the hearing. If this information is produced at the hearing it will only be taken into account by the Sub-Committee if the Sub-Committee and all the parties consent to its submission. Permission to have this information included in the hearing should be requested at the beginning of the hearing before any oral submissions have been made.
- Statements made by people in support of a party's representation who are not present at the hearing, must be signed by the maker, dated and witnessed by another person. The statement must also contain the witness's full name and occupation.

Representations:

- The chairman will invite each of the parties at the hearing or their representative sequentially to address the Sub-Committee and call any person/s to whom permission has been granted to appear. Each party will be allowed a maximum period of 10 minutes in which to address the Sub-Committee and call persons on his/her behalf.
- This 10 minute period is where each party has the opportunity to orally address the Sub-Committee and clarify any points in which the Sub-Committee has sought clarification prior to the hearing. This 10 minute period should be uninterrupted unless a member of the Sub-Committee or Legal Advisor considers that the speaker is making submissions that are irrelevant, frivolous or vexatious.
- Members of the Sub-Committee may ask questions of any party, at any time during the proceedings. Time taken in dealing with a Member's question will not be taken into account in determining the length of time available to the party in question to make their representation.

The sequence in which each of the parties will be invited to address the Sub-Committee will normally be in the order of:

- the Chief Officer of Police;
- the Fire Authority;
- the Health and Safety at Work Enforcing Authority;
- the Local Planning Authority;
- the Local environmental Health Authority;
- the Local Weights and Measures Authority;
- the Authority Responsible for the Protection of Children from Harm:
- a navigation or other authority responsible for waterways; and
- any other party that has submitted representations in respect of the application, certificate, notice or other matter appearing before the Sub-Committee;
- the party that has submitted the application, certificate, notice or other matter appearing before the Sub-Committee.

At the discretion of the Sub-Committee the above order may be varied.

Cross-Examination:

Where witnesses have been permitted by the Sub-Committee to speak at the hearing on behalf of a party, permission must be sought from the Sub-Committee before another party can ask the witness questions. This process of questioning is normally referred to as cross-examination. The Sub-Committee will allow cross-examination only

where it is necessary to assist it in considering the representations or application.

Relevance:

Information submitted at the hearing must be relevant to the applications, representations, or notice and the promotion of the licensing objectives. The Chairman of the Sub-Committee is entitled to exclude any information it considers to be irrelevant whether presented in written or oral form. The licensing objectives are:

The prevention of crime and disorder;
Public safety;
The prevention of public nuisance; and
The protection of children from harm.

7. Failure of parties to attend the hearing:

7.1 If a party, who has not given prior notice of his/her intention not to attend the hearing, is absent from the hearing the Sub-Committee may either adjourn the hearing or hold the hearing in the party's absence. Where the hearing is held in the absence of a party, the Sub-Committee will still consider the application, representation or notice submitted by that party.

8. Adjournments and extension of time:

- 8.1 The Sub-Committee may adjourn a hearing to a specified date or extend a notice period except where it must make a determination within certain time limits in the following specific applications:
 - Review of premises licences following closure orders where the Sub-committee must make a determination within 28 days of receiving notice of the closure order.

9. Sub-Committee's determination of the hearing:

- 9.1 At the conclusion of the hearing the Sub-Committee will deliberate in private accompanied by the Clerk and the Legal Advisor who will be available to assist the Sub-Committee with any legal problems but will not participate in any decision making of the Sub-Committee.
- 9.2 The Sub-Committee will normally make its determination and announce its decision at the end of the hearing.

9.3 Where all parties have notified the Sub-Committee that a hearing is not required the Sub-Committee must make its determination within 10 working days of being given notice that the hearing is not required.

10. Power to exclude people from hearing:

- 10.1 The public are entitled to attend the hearing as spectators. However, the Sub-Committee may exclude any person from the hearing including any person assisting or representing a party where:
 - it considers that the public interest would be best served by excluding the public or the individual person from the hearing; or
 - that person is behaving in a disruptive manner. This may include a
 party who is seeking to be heard at the hearing. In the case where a
 party is to be excluded, the party may submit to the Sub-Committee
 in writing any information which they would have been entitled to
 give orally had they not been required to leave the hearing.

11. Recording of proceedings:

11.1 A written record of the hearing will be produced and kept for 6 years from the date of the determination of the hearing.

12. Power to vary procedure:

12.1 The Sub-committee may depart from following any of the procedures set out in this document if it considers the departure to be necessary in order to consider an application, notice or representation.







Thank you for the notification of 14 August 2013 regarding the application to vary the premises licence for the above business.

I strongly object to the variation to the licence being requested by Shell. As a long term sufferer of the existing licence arrangements that Shell have I strongly request that this application be rejected.

I live directly opposite the Shell garage which is located in a residential area. During the hours from 11pm through to 5am I suffer from the public nuisance generated by ignorant people who already frequent the garage while I am trying to sleep. This nuisance comes in the form of:

- car horns being tooted,
- engines being revved,
- light invasion into my house from headlights,
- people shouting and hollering,
- · car stereos pumping out heavy bass music,
- litter from discarded food wrappers, sweets and protective gloves dispensed by the garage for people filling their cars with petrol.

The change to the licence as proposed will only serve to increase this nuisance and put an intolerable strain on me.

I am also extremely concerned about the increased risk of crime and disorder that will be brought into the area directly opposite my house particularly in the early hours of Saturday and Sunday when the regulated areas of Romford are closing. As a local resident I have no

requirement for hot food and alcohol during the hours proposed as I have my own facilities at home. This variation to the existing licence will only serve to bring in undesirable people who do not live in the area and who most likely will already be fuelled up with alcohol and only serve to increase the risk of:

- damage to my fencing and property I have already had to replace my front fence twice in the past few years,
- cars, motorbikes and scooters using the road outside my house as a racetrack a
 problem that already exists and would get worse.

There are already places which offer the services that Shell propose over on the A127 for those people who require it - we do not need these services in Brentwood Road.

Thank you for your letter of 14 August 2013 in respect of the application to vary the premises licence above. As a sufferer of the existing licence arrangements that the Shell garage has, I strongly object to the proposed changes and request that the council reject the application.

During the hours from 11pm through to 5am the garage is a source of many problems for me as a resident trying to sleep. These problems are caused by disrespectful people who use the garage including

- honking of car horns,
- bright headlights flooding light through my windows,
- noisy people shouting,
- loud music being played in cars parked on the garage forecourt,
- litter blown across the road into my front garden.

Relaxation of the licence to allow Shell to offer hot food and alcohol during these hours will make these problems intolerable. I am very concerned that these changes will also lead to public disorder on my doorstep through people congregating across the road consuming alcohol and food. As a local resident, I do not require these services and I am sure none of the other residents require them either in the early hours of the morning. This is a residential area which does not need people coming into it from Romford after closing hours and increasing the risk of crime and anti social behaviour.

I live at 194 Brentwood Rd, Romford, Essex, RM1 2RT (tel no: 01708 730186)

I have the following objections:

As I have two children (age 9 and 12), I am very concerned that youngsters will leave nightclubs in Romford drunk at 2 pm looking for late night food and drink. This will cause an unacceptable level of noise and language and disturb to our sleep and well-being. Also, if there is only minimum night staff on duty (as there is at present) who would stop noise, swearing, anti-social behavior or fights that occur!

It happens already every Friday and Saturday when car users/taxi drivers get late night petrol (drivers even use the car wash). It keeps myself, my husband and 9 year old son awake. The petrol attendant makes NO attempt to keep the users quiet either. We would, in fact, ask that the petrol garage be closed at 10 pm every evening.

People could urinate on public/private property as no toilets will be available. It will also cause rubbish to be left everywhere and will cause vermin and disease. The crime rate (including public nuisance, car theft, antisocial behavior, vandalism, graffiti, fights and burglaries) in the surround area would go up and would cost an significant amount to police.

I would feel worried about my children growing up in such an awful environment. There are lots of late night fast-food retailers in Romford, so why do we need another one in a built up residential area.

The previous application was turned down for the above reasons and I can't understand why I am writing yet another letter of objection.

With regards to the above I can confirm that this Licensing Authority wishes to make representation against this application based upon our concerns in relation to the prevention of public nuisance and prevention of harm to children licensing objectives. If the premises are permitted to open for longer hours the possibility of causing nuisance to the neighbouring residential properties will increase. There is no mention in the operating schedule of measures that the applicant will take bearing in mind its close proximity to a secondary school.

The application

This application seeks overall to extend the hours during which licensable activity may be provided at the premises. Effectively the premises wish to be open 24 hours a day and provide Late Night Refreshment throughout the night i.e. 23:00 to 05:00.

Licensing policy 012 – hours

Havering's licensing policy 012 relates to the hours during which it is felt appropriate to provide licensable activity in given areas of the borough. Policy 012 is as follows:

The LLA is committed to protecting the amenity of residents and businesses in the vicinity of licensed premises. Applications for hours set out below in this policy will generally be granted subject to not being contrary to other policies in the statement of licensing policy. Applications for hours outside the hours listed will be considered on their merits.

Regulated activities will normally be permitted:

- until 11.30 pm in residential areas
- until 00.30 am in mixed use areas
- no limits in leisure areas

This premise is surrounded by residential properties. There is no mention in the submitted operating schedule of how the applicant intends to minimise the inconvenience and nuisance to their residential neighbours with 24 hour trading.

Section 182 guidance to the Act – promoting the licensing objectives

Section 4(3) of the Act requires that a Licensing Authority, when carrying out its functions, has regard to its licensing policy as well as to the guidance issued under s.182 of the Act. This guidance also identifies certain expectations in relation to applicants.

Paragraphs 8.34 to 8.42 of the guidance to the Act address the steps required to promote the licensing objectives. A brief examination of these steps will demonstrate that the applicant has not fully addressed the promotion of the licensing objectives in line with the guidance, thus making it difficult for the Licensing Authority to support the application.

- 8.35 Applicants are, in particular, expected to obtain sufficient information to enable them to demonstrate, when setting out the steps they propose to take to promote the licensing objectives, that they understand:
 - the layout of the local area and physical environment including crime and disorder hotspots, proximity to residential premises and proximity to areas where children may congregate;
 - any risk posed to the local area by the applicants' proposed licensable activities;
 and
 - any local initiatives (for example, local crime reduction initiatives or voluntary schemes including local taxi-marshalling schemes, street pastors and other schemes) which may help to mitigate potential risks.

The premise is within 150 metres of Frances Bardsley School. Therefore this is an area in which children may congregate. It may be that the applicant has failed to identify any risk posed by the application. Equally, it may be that the applicant feels the application poses no risk to the local area. Both of these possibilities cause the Licensing Authority concern.

8.36 Applicants are expected to include positive proposals in their application on how they will manage any potential risks. Where specific policies apply in the area (for example, a cumulative impact policy), applicants are also expected to demonstrate an understanding of how the policy impacts on their application; any measures they will take to mitigate the impact; and why they consider the application should be an exception to the policy.

As mentioned previously the applicants proposed operating hours are addressed by Havering's licensing policy 012. The property is surrounded by residential properties and in line with the policy should only be allowed to operate until 23:30. As a Licensing Authority we might reasonably expect that the applicant would consider "why they

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consider the application should be an exception to the policy", but the applicant does not appear to address this issue.

Based upon our concerns detailed above this Licensing Authority is not in a position to be able to support an application to extend licensable activity at the premises outside those provisions identified in Havering's licensing policy 012.

Licensing Act 2003-Application To Vary Premises Licence Shell Romford, 203 Brentwood Road, Heath Park, Romford, Essex.

I refer to the above application and would advise that for the reasons detailed below I am objecting to any extension of hours for licensable activities beyond their current hours:-

- 1. The Environmental Health Service has historically dealt with noise complaints from nearby residents concerning the noise from patrons attending the site during unsociable hours. Principally the noise is from vehicle engines, doors being slammed, car stereo systems and raised voices from patrons.
- 2. The closest residents are approximately 10 metres from the site with bedrooms of nearby flats overlooking the forecourt of the garage.
- 3. The noise of refridgeration and air conditioning plant is located at the boundary of the site some 15-20 metres from the nearest residential properties.

Any extension of hours would result in an increase in noise disturbance experienced by nearby residents.
