REPORT OF THE CLERK

PROCEDURE FOR THE HEARING: LICENSING ACT 2003 (REVIEW OF LICENCE)

This is a hearing to consider an application for a review of a licence under section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003. The Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 will govern the arrangements for the hearing of the application now under consideration. This report accords with the requirements of that Act and the Regulations, and in particular Regulations 21-25 (procedure at the hearing).

1. Membership of the Sub-Committee:

- 1.1 The Sub-Committee comprises three members of the Licensing Committee, with a quorum of two members. **Unless there are objections, in the absence of three members, the hearing shall proceed with the quorum of two**.
- 1.2 A member of the Licensing Committee will be excluded from hearing an application where he or she:
 - 1.2.1 has considered an application in respect of the premises in the previous 12 months as a Member of the Regulatory Services Committee: or
 - 1.2.2 is a Ward Councillor for the Ward in which the premises, subject to the application, are located; or
 - 1.2.3 is a Ward Councillor for a Ward which is likely to be affected by the application or;

1.2.4 has a personal interest in the application.

2. Roles of other participants:

- 2.1 The Legal Advisor is not a party to the hearing. The role of the Legal Advisor is to provide legal advice relating to the application and submissions.
- 2.2 The Clerk is not a party to the hearing. The role of the Clerk is to record the hearing and the decisions of the Sub-Committee, and ensure efficient administration

3. Location and facilities:

- 3.1 All hearings will be heard at the Havering Town Hall unless otherwise directed.
- 3.2 Interpreters will be provided by the Council on request, provided notice is given at least five working days before the hearing.

4. Notification of attendance:

4.1 The Chairman will enquire of the parties who is in attendance and the parties will indicate their names (and, where relevant, whom they represent). A register will be circulated before the commencement of the hearing on which the applicant, his/her advisers and companions and all interested parties (and/or their representatives) will be asked to record their attendance.

5. Procedural matters:

- 5.1 Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Chairman of the Sub-Committee will orally inform the parties whether their applications to have certain people attend the hearing (e.g. witnesses) have been granted or refused. Note this relates to people other than those attending on behalf of a party in the capacity as a representative of the party.
- 5.2 Prior to the commencement of the hearing the Chairman of the Sub-Committee will outline the procedure to be followed at the hearing. This will normally be as follows:

Introduction of the application:

The party requesting the review will outline:

- details of the application and relevant representations received from the parties;
- relevant legislation;
- · relevant Licensing Policy; and
- the time limit in which the Council must reach a determination.

Documentary evidence:

- Documentary or other information in support of applications, representations or notices should be provided to the Clerk of the Sub-Committee at least 7 clear working days before the hearing. If this information is produced at the hearing it will only be taken into account by the Sub-Committee if the Sub-Committee and all the parties consent to its submission. Permission to have this information included in the hearing should be requested at the beginning of the hearing before any oral submissions have been made.
- Statements made by people in support of a party's representation who are not present at the hearing, must be signed by the maker, dated and witnessed by another person. The statement must also contain the witness's full name and occupation.

Representations:

- The Chairman will invite each of the parties at the hearing or their representative sequentially to address the Sub-Committee and call any person/s to whom permission has been granted to appear. Each party will be allowed a maximum period of 10 minutes in which to address the Sub-Committee and call persons on his/her behalf.
- This 10 minute period is where each party has the opportunity to orally address the Sub-Committee and clarify any points on which the Sub-Committee has sought clarification prior to the hearing. This 10 minute period should be uninterrupted unless a member of the Sub-Committee or Legal Advisor considers that the speaker is making submissions that are irrelevant, frivolous or vexatious.
- Members of the Sub-Committee may ask questions of any party, at any time during the proceedings. Time taken in dealing with a Member's question will not be taken into account in determining the length of time available to the party in question to make their representation.

The sequence in which each of the parties will be invited to address the Sub-Committee will normally be in the order of:

- the party requesting the review of the licence
- the Chief Officer of Police;
- the Fire Authority;
- the Health and Safety at Work Enforcing Authority;
- the Local Planning Authority;
- the Local Environmental Health Authority;
- the Local Weights and Measures Authority;

- the Authority Responsible for the Protection of Children from Harm;
- a navigation or other authority responsible for waterways; and
- any other party that has submitted representations in respect of the application, certificate, notice or other matter appearing before the Sub-Committee;
- the party whose premises is the subject of the licence review.

At the discretion of the Sub-Committee the above order may be varied.

Cross-Examination:

Where witnesses have been permitted by the Sub-Committee to speak at the hearing on behalf of a party, permission must be sought from the Sub-Committee before another party can ask the witness questions. This process of questioning is normally referred to as cross-examination. The Sub-Committee will allow cross-examination only where it is necessary to assist it in considering the representations or application.

Relevance:

Information submitted at the hearing must be relevant to the applications, representations, or notice and the promotion of the licensing objectives. The Chairman of the Sub-Committee is entitled to exclude any information it considers to be irrelevant whether presented in written or oral form. The licensing objectives are:

The prevention of crime and disorder;
Public safety;
The prevention of public nuisance; and
The protection of children from harm.

6. Failure of parties to attend the hearing:

6.1 If a party, who has not given prior notice of his/her intention not to attend the hearing, is absent from the hearing the Sub-Committee may either adjourn the hearing or hold the hearing in the party's absence. Where the hearing is held in the absence of a party, the Sub-Committee will still consider the application, representation or notice submitted by that party.

7. Adjournments and extension of time:

- 7.1 The Sub-Committee may adjourn a hearing to a specified date or extend a notice period except where it must make a determination within certain time limits in the following specific applications:
 - Review of premises licences following closure orders made under the Licensing Act 2003 where the Sub-committee must make a determination within 28 days of receiving notice of the closure order.
 - Other reviews of premises licenses where the Sub-Committee must make a determination within 28 days of the end of the statutory consultation period.

8. Sub-Committee's determination of the hearing:

- 8.1 At the conclusion of the hearing the Sub-Committee will deliberate in private accompanied by the Clerk and the Legal Advisor who will be available to assist the Sub-Committee with any legal problems but will not participate in any decision making of the Sub-Committee.
- 8.2 The Sub-Committee will normally make its determination and announce its decision at the end of the hearing.
- 8.3 Where all parties have notified the Sub-Committee that a hearing is not required the Sub-Committee must make its determination within 10 working days of being given notice that the hearing is not required.

9. Power to exclude people from hearing:

- 9.1 The public are entitled to attend the hearing as spectators. However, the Sub-Committee may exclude any person from the hearing including any person assisting or representing a party where:
 - it considers that the public interest would be best served by excluding the public or the individual person from the hearing; or
 - that person is behaving in a disruptive manner. This may include a
 party who is seeking to be heard at the hearing. In the case where a
 party is to be excluded, the party may submit to the Sub-Committee
 in writing any information which they would have been entitled to
 give orally had they not been required to leave the hearing.

10. Recording of proceedings:

10.1 A written record of the hearing will be produced and kept for 6 years from the date of the determination of the hearing.

11. Power to vary procedure:

11.1 The Sub-committee may depart from following any of the procedures set out in this document if it considers the departure to be necessary in order to consider an application, notice or representation.

This application for a Review of the Premises Licence is made by PC Oisin Daly on behalf of the Metropolitan Police under section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003. The application was received by Havering's Licensing Authority on 21st October 2016.

Geographical description of the area and description of the building

New Tasty Chicken is a take away fast food premises, it is located on the north side of Victoria Road about 25 metres from the junction with South Street Romford and 100 metres walking distance from Romford Rail Station

The premises are within the Romford ring road. This area is therefore subject to a special policy further to cumulative impact.

The immediate vicinity in which the premises reside contains commercial and residential properties.

A map of the area is attached to my report to assist the Sub-Committee..

The Act requires the Licensing Authority to advertise the review, inviting representations to be made by responsible authorities or interested parties. An appropriately worded public notice advertising this application was placed at the premises, at Havering Town Hall and on Havering's website. on 21st and 24th October 2016. (Friday and Monday)

Annex 2 – conditions consistent with the operating schedule

- The CCTV system shall be in operation at the premises at all times when the premises is used for licensable activities. Recorded tapes shall be kept for 31 days and be made available for inspection by Police and Council officers at all reasonable times.
- 2. No alcohol shall be available on the premises.
- 3. All drinks shall be served in plastic bottles or cans.
- 4. Regular checks and maintenance shall be carried out on all equipment, electrical installations, emergency lighting and fire alarms to ensure compliance with current British Standards.
- 5. All fire escapes/escape routes shall be clearly marked and kept free from obstructions at all times.
- 6. All customers shall be asked to respect the surroundings and behave in an orderly manner.
- 7. Signs shall be installed to remind customers to respect neighbours and leave quietly.
- 8. Patrons shall be discouraged from congregating outside the premises.
- 9. Waste generated by the premises shall be dealt with appropriately.
- 10. Regular checks and maintenance shall be carried out on all ventilation, extraction systems and filters to ensure that smells or odours or noise caused in connection with a licensable activity shall not be perceptible at or within the site boundary of any residential property.
- 11. Refuse receptacles shall be cleaned regularly with disinfectant.
- 12. The premises licence holder shall ensure the footpath immediately outside the front of the premises and that of a distance of 50 metres each side of the premises is kept clear of refuse emanating from the premises by regular inspection both during and immediately after the operating hours.
- 13. Staff shall have appropriate instruction, training and supervision to ensure children are protected from harm at all times.
- 14. There shall be enough staff on the premises to ensure the protection of children from any form of harm befalling them.



Annex 3 - conditions attached after a hearing by the Licensing Authority

- 1. A properly specified and fully operational CCTV system shall be installed or the existing system maintained to a satisfactory standard. The system shall incorporate a camera covering each of the entrance doors and be capable of providing an image which is regarded as 'identification standard' of all persons entering and/or leaving the premises. All other areas of risk identified in the operational requirement shall have coverage appropriate to the risk.
- 2. The installation or upgrading of any CCTV system shall comply with current best practice. In addition the documentation listed below shall be included in a system file which should be readily available for inspection by the relevant authority:
 - site plan showing position of cameras and their field of view
 - code of practice
 - performance specification e.g. storage capacity, image file size, IPS for each camera and purpose of each camera position
 - operational requirement
 - incident log
 - maintenance records including weekly visual checks
- 3. To obtain a clear head and shoulders image of every person entering the premises on the CCTV system persons entering the premises should be asked to remove headwear unless worn as part of religious observance.
- 4. The CCTV system shall incorporate a recording facility and all recordings shall be securely stored for a minimum of one calendar month. A system shall be in place to maintain the quality of the recorded image and a complete audit trail maintained. The system shall comply with other essential legislation and all signs as required shall be clearly displayed. The system shall be maintained and fully operational throughout the hours that the premises is open for any licensable activity. For premises using a video recording system the cassette tapes shall be used on no more than 12 occasions to maintain the quality of the recorded image.
- 5. The positions of all CCTV cameras shall be clearly shown on a set of plans which should form part of the system file. Any alteration to the system should only be carried out after consultation with and written approval of Havering Police and the Licensing Authority.
- 6 The premises shall have a waste bin inside and staff shall regularly keep the area within the curtilage of the premises clear of litter and collect any refuse.
- 7. A bi-lingual Turkish/English speaker shall be present at all times the premises is open to the public in order to minimise the risk of misunderstanding due to language difficulties.





Illegal Workers:

On Friday the 12th August 2016 at approx. 23:15hrs police attended the venue along with UKBA

officers to conduct licensing and immigration inspections.

Upon arrival at the venue there were three males behind the counter, all three were preforming the roles expected of workers in a take away, one was at the till and the other two were preparing food. All three were versed in the operation of the variety of equipment available to them. PC South introduced himself to the members of staff and asked to speak to the manager, one of the males behind the counter, a Mr DAR, stated that the manager had been outside smoking a cigarette and must have run away. In the absence of any management at the venue or anyone who admitted to be employed by the venue Immigration officials were unable to gain any implied consent for an inspection. Subsequent checks on Mr Dar reveal that he is an immigrant with no right to work in the UK. No persons at the venue at the time of the inspection were able to operate the CCTV. A phone number was subsequently obtained for the premises licence holder, Mr Amer KHAN, he stated that he was in Manchester and that someone should be at the venue within the next thirty minutes to speak with police. With no definite time for any management arrival officers secured the premises and continued with their duties.

UKBA officers have investigated Mr Dar's employment and immigration status, they have confirmed that he does not and did not at the time of the visit have a right to work in the UK. UKBA are now conducting an investigation into this matter, due to this investigation being sensitive and ongoing it was necessary to delay the submission of review documents.

Illegal working is a serious issue and is highlighted in the case of East Lindsey Council v Abu Hanif T/A Zaras restaurant. In his findings Mr Justice Jay decided that in employing an illegal worker, whether there had been a prosecution or not, the crime prevention objective had been engaged. Mr Jay highlighted that employing illegal workers defrauds HMRC and exploits vulnerable individuals.

CCTV:

On the 19th August 2016 PC Daly emailed Mr Khan having not received any responses to phone calls, Mr Khan then called and stated that he would provide CCTV within four days. On the 24th August PC DALY then requested the CCTV again as well as reminding Mr Khan that he needed to supply training records and staff files.

On the 25th August Mr Khan did provide the CCTV but in the form of the entire hard drive having not been able to extract any footage. Some cleaning records were provided as well as some health and safety and cleaning documentation but no staff training in relation to the protection of children from harm or their employment status or even national insurance numbers. Mr Khan did not give a satisfactory response to the issues raised.

Not being able to operate CCTV has meant that a suspect for a crime has evaded prosecution, CRIS 5411814/16, 12th July 2016 details how a male had his laptop bag containing his laptop, passport and other items stolen whilst he was inside the shop. The value of the property was estimated at £600. Officers viewed CCTV at the time and could see a known gang member who frequents Victoria Road take the bag. In spite of several requests for a copy of the CCTV it was not provided and the footage was erased.

The incident happened at 2100hrs so was outside of licensable hours and the conditions of the licence could not be enforced. The crime does highlight the poor management of the venue and a known gang member has now escaped prosecution and a victim deprived of justice. Page 19

Location

New Tasty Chicken is situated in Victoria Road, this is in the CIZ and has been identified as in need of regeneration. New tasty chicken is currently the only take away open past 11pm in Victoria road and is inevitably a magnet for ASB from the local youths who drug deal in Victoria Rd. The problem of gangs operating their drug supply from the area cannot be underestimated and several gang members were at the venue at the time of the inspection as detailed in the statement of PC South. Kingsmead mansions is opposite the venue and has been identified as the current base of operation for the Station Crew gang. There have been several arrests in October 2016 alone which involve youths in possession of kitchen knives within 100 meteres of the venue, the reports detail links to youths congregating in Victoria Rd.

Below is an extract from Crimint KDRT00324747 from the 13th October which highlights the issues in the area:

Arrested 12/10/2016 at 1730 KING EDWARDS ROAD having been observed purchasing herbal cannabis in VICTORIA ROAD was the following male:



On realising police were on his case he dropped a 6 inch Kitchen Knife on the floor along with a Cannabis Joint which had just been bought in VICTORIA ROAD. Clear indication that there is still real issues of concern relating to ASB and blatant drug dealing taking place despite the increase in police activity in the area. The male has previous for possesion of cannabis and was stopped back in August in suspicous circumstances relating to drug dealing in that area. One to watch out for in that area.

Of obvious concern is how many others down there are tooled up as a matter of routine?

The arrest was made at 1730hrs which is outside licensable hours however it is safe to assume that the problem does not disappear at 11pm. Statements from the Sergeant Ruane from the Romford Town Centre Team further detail the issues in the area.

It is the opinion of the police that the revocation of the licence is the only option available in order to minimise the risk of someone getting seriously harmed at the venue in the future. Police have no faith that the owners of the business will operate in a responsible and legal manner.

This statement relates to a licensing visit.

On Friday 12th August 2016, I was on duty in full uniform, in the company of PC Daly. I was briefed to conduct a licensing visit at New Tasty Chicken, 7 Station Chambers, Victoria Road, alongside immigration officers who will also be conducting their own checks. I was given a copy of the licensing agreement, with the aim to check its conditions were being met. At 2315 hours, I entered the premises, and saw two customers eating at a table, and three males behind the counter. Mr Rameez DAR dob 18/10/1987, was behind the counter serving customers, by the till. Mr DAR was wearing a grey t-shirt. I saw Mr Khuram NAWAZ, dob 13/06/1982 behind the counter, by the ovens. I also saw Mr Hamoud MOHAMMED, dob 01/01/1996, at the back of the kitchen, preparing chicken. Mr MOHAMMED was wearing a white t-shirt. I spoke to Mr DAR, and informed him that I am here conducting a licensing visit, and that immigration officers are also attending with their own checks. Mr DAR immediately said that he does not work there. I asked where the manager was and Mr DAR informed me that he was smoking a cigarette outside and he must have run away. Mr MOHAMMED and Mr NAWAZ both also denied working there. Mr MOHAMMED stated that he was just on work experience for the day, and MR NAWAZ stated he worked in a shop across the road. When questioned why they were behind the till, preparing food and serving customers, they all denied it. Mr NAWAZ called the manager, but when the phone was given to me, he hung up. I began licensing checks, and there was no one on the premises who could speak Turkish and English. There was CCTV in the back room, but no one there who could operate it or tell me if it was working. No licensing agreement was visible on the wall. All three males who were in the kitchen were uncooperative, and could not answer any questions about the licensing agreement. Mr NAWAZ, initially refused to give his details, and Mr MOHAMMED initially provided false details. As I was conducting my checks, I noticed a gathering by the door, of teenagers, some I recognised to be associates of the Station Crew Gang. They were shouting in saying leave them alone and were unhappy that police were in the venue. As an officer on the Romford Town Centre Team, I

carry out regular patrols of Victoria Road, and regularly see members of the Station Crew congregate inside the venue, as well as outside by the doors. I have also seen members charge their phones behind the counter. Due to this, there has been an increase in antisocial behaviour on Victoria Road. There are often groups of approximately 20 youths that congregate around the shop, which seems to be encouraged by the staff, who they regularly talk to on a friendly basis. The station crew are involved in drug supply and other offences linked to this, such as carrying offensive weapons, and robberies. Often as police arrive on Victoria Road, some members of the gang will immediately enter the venue to avoid police. In summary, this venue has been dishonest to police by its staff denying working there despite officers seeing them, and has become a hot bed of anti-social behaviour.

call police and he said it was because he felt threatened. Clearly the youths are causing problems on the street and then going inside the shop to avoid police due to the stores inability to move them on – even after the offer of police assistance. The peak time for the problems in Victoria Road is from about 1700 hrs until 0200 hrs.



Hello Mr Khan,

I can confirm that I have received the DVR and staff training files at the station.

I would like to point out that at no point did I request the entire DVR, in fact the DVR is of no particular use to me as I have no facility to view footage directly from a hard drive. The box will now have to be sent to a laboratory for analysis and data extraction which may take some time.

In the mean time I will point out that you are required to have CCTV as a condition on you licence, should you trade without CCTV you will be breaking the law.

Also, the training records that you provided are inadequate. The majority refer to cleaning schedules. One of the requirements on your licence is that all staff receive training on the protection of children from harm. As yet you have not evidenced that you have such a training schedule in place, in fact you have not provided any records of staff members that are employed by you.

In order to continue to trade past 11pm you must have in place a working CCTV system which you know how to operate and have trained all your staff on how to ensure that children are protected from harm.

I can confirm that I have received the DVR and staff training files at the station.

I would like to point out that at no point did I request the entire DVR, in fact the DVR is of no particular use to me as I have no facility to view footage directly from a hard drive. The box will now have to be sent to a laboratory for analysis and data extraction which may take some time.

In the mean time I will point out that you are required to have CCTV as a condition on you licence, should you trade without CCTV you will be breaking the law.

Also, the training records that you provided are inadequate. The majority refer to cleaning schedules. One of the requirements on your licence is that all staff receive training on the protection of children from harm. As yet you

have not evidenced that you have such a training schedule in place, in fact you have not provided any records of staff members that are employed by you.

In order to continue to trade past 11pm you must have in place a working CCTV system which you know how to operate and have trained all your staff on how to ensure that children are protected from harm.






