To the committee

Enclosed is our evidence in response to the objections to our application for the premises license on the 01/04/2016.

Please see below each response and evidence listed:

1. I have re-attached the notice displayed on the window which was corrected before the 14/06/16 to show the correct times of application. Please see attached copy of previous and second. Our apologies for the poor copy. Numbered 1 & 2
2. The application is clear. We play music all day on our music system for our customers and twice a month we have live music on the decking area. We have been advised by our licensing officer that we need to make all parties aware in our TEN's at all times and within our application of our premises license. This is not confusing as we were advised to make sure we listed this. The confusion lies with the advice we were given by the licensing team. Please see TEN's .
3. Our request of alcohol again was advised by our lensing officer of the time Mr Hunt, to place our opening hours and our request for alcohol. As we explained that we may at times hold private events, such as a wedding and would need this. His advice was to put the hours you would like on the form then it would be agreed or not.
4. We attached two statements as advised by Mr Paul Jones our second licensing officer, on his advice. Please note Mr Hunt & Mr Jones have only tried to help at all times however with the information given and now the statements submitted, we now know that miss information was given to us by some parties. This I will address further.
5. The advice by the responsible bodies has been confusing and at times dictorial on how our business should be run. It came to the point that I was so distressed at the too-ing and throwing of emails that, I was being pushed into making a business decision that would not be our ethos or how we envisioned our business. I tried on may occasions to explain this to all the responsible bodies, and last year was so confused that I withdrew our application, yet some have registered their objections to this and I am again confused as to how no formal application had been made or public notice as to how they are able to do this. This has muddied the waters some what for our current application. I will address this separately as each responsible body has written a statement.
6. We decided that TEN's would help the responsible bodies understand our Ethos and build our reputation as a responsible business within the community impact zone. Showing good

supervision with the kind of customers we attract. Therefore our reputation would be built and the responsible bodies would see how we operate our business.

7. Mr Etherton will be addressing the committee with a statement at close, this will also address the response to the objections made and my responses to them.

To the following objections

Licensing Authority: I was asked by Mr Jones to submit a statement in response to the community impact Zone of our business. I was being hounded by the police authorities to change our business structure and told that I could only serve alcohol with food. And work as a restaurant only. I found myself being bullied to do this. Which surprised me as we always had a good relationship with the Licensing authority and had not received any complaints. The licensing officer's at all times said, write down how you would operate the business and then the application would be considered. In doing this we found it was going to be pulled apart and told what we can and cant do. It was very upsetting, and a surprise. Therefore my last email to Mr Jones highlighted how I felt as by then I has been subjected to so many emails and a call from the Police that made me realize that our application would be objected no matter what we did unless we adhered to their wishes. Please note prior to this we had submitted an application last year which had been withdrawn after a meeting with Mr Hunt and Jones. Therefore as I have mentioned, how could objections be listed for over a year ago when no public application was made, this suggests to me again that our license would have never been granted and would thus have been submitted to a committee regardless. I have attached and updated a photo of our business as the one submitted by the Licensing team is very old. See Evidence photo marked as 3.

TEN's : We have been submitting TEN's for over a year and a half now. We Decided as a business this would show the Responsible Authorities our business ethos and show good name and business practice. So when our full application for a licenses was submitted they would have a clear understanding. The Licenses started on Feb'15 till July'16 I have enclosed a copy of our last application for TEN as evidence on how we supervise. I received a telephone conversation by Belinda Goodwin/Rooney from the MET asking about the event. I will address my first contact with the MET in my statement. See Evidence Marked 4

Metropolitan Police: Enclosed I have highlighted Miss B Goodwin/Rooney statement, I was first contacted and knew that Miss Goodwin/Rooney was our designated officer in June'16. I had no knowledge till that date that she was in fact our officer. You will see from her objection statement that it was written in July 2015. I asked the committee to question this as we had not made any applications for a formal premises license previously to this, and ask how her objection is possible?

I highlighted to Miss Goodwin/Rooney during our telephone conversation as emails where going back and forth, how it was possible that another business named "Delhi Live" had a license with a bar, a new business, also attached is an ice cream parlor on the front and also was also stating events to be held.

Her response was they had the license already. I would like to show the committee evidence attached that this was in fact a new application, with no objections within the Zone, they open till midnight and serve drinks at the bar without food. Marked 5, we are merely showing the inconsistencies with ours and their application and have no issues with our fellow restaurateurs. We ask the committee to note this as an example ONLY. Evidence marked 6 Miss Goodwin/Rooney's statement. The date which is over a year old, and that we do hold a training and refusal book, I highlighted this in my application, also CCTV and the protection of children. I ask the committee the last comment of drug dealers was insulting and unfounded and would they not have the same concerns with our fellow restaurateurs in the Delhi Live with the Ice-cream parlor.

We supervise and train all our staff to a high standard and have never had any issues with the local Met teams who have enjoyed our premises themselves whilst end of shifts and personal visits, having cigars, shisha and coffee. Who also said they had no issues with our business and that it was a pleasure as we were and are far from south street.

Our music is stopped at 22:30 to respect our local residents and not to disturb them further. Miss Goodwin insisted we could not have our live music on the decking, however on evenings particularly Thursdays we can clearly hear live music from inside The Goose Pub (who have recently updated their license) as well as in the past, Bradwells.

Planning Enforcement: Mr Etherton will address this in his statement.

Public Health: We have demonstrated this at all times that we have never had the need to call a public officer to our premises for any reason of crime or disorder. Our application was clear on this and find that they are picking at something that is incorrect. Again Mr Etherton will address this in his statement.

In conclusion we asked the committee to consider our application on merit of the following:

Our operating hours are currently 09:00-22:00 Tuesday-Thursday, 09:00-22:30 Fri & Sat and 10:00-16:00 Sunday. In our license our hours were such as advised by the licensing team and adjustments can be made.


Our request to supply alcohol with food has been twisted, our customers ask for a small dish with alcohol and enjoy a cigar and shisha while listening to the Jazz on specific nights or in general to the

recorded music played. At no time have we solely served alcohol to anyone and again my conversation was twisted. We have events planned and themed, it is our ethos we are not a pub, and our wine tasting was incorporated with our menu as I confirmed this to Miss Goodwin in a call a few days before. Our beer tasting was also incorporated with food and was taken out of contents by the public officers.

We will be covering more of these objections with yourselves through Mr Etherton's statement, this is merely evidence submitted by ourselves to show argument and response to the Objections you had before our hearing with yourselves on the 18/7/16.

We thank the committee again for your patience in this matter and time.

- a. No selling of alcohol to underage people
- b. No drunk and disorderly behavior on the premises area
- c. Vigilance in order to prevent the use and sale of illegal drugs in our premises
- d. No violent and anti-social behaviours to be tolerated
- e. No harm or risk thereof to children

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- * Our Operating Schedule provides the hours of operation and licensable activities during those hours.
 - * We have confirmed that our Designated premises supervisor is obligated to be in day-to-day control of the premises, he would provide good training for staff on the Licensing Act (Training Record), and would make or authorise each sale
 - * Clear "Challenge 25" information to prevent the supply of alcohol to under-age drinkers will be placed visible at the premises
 - * We have CCTV system installed with recording option available
 - * Roller metal exterior window shutter will be fixed to ensure that shop front is safe and secure at all times
- As a licensed premises we know that it is necessary to carry out our functions or operate our businesses with a purpose of promoting these objectives. We promise to support these objectives through our operating schedules and other measures (including staff training and qualifications, policies, and strategic partnerships with other agencies).

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- * CCTV System installed to monitor entrances, exits, and other parts of the premises in order to address the prevention of crime objective.
- * A clear and legible notice outside the premises indicating the normal hours under the terms of the premises licence during which licensable activities are permitted.
- * A clear and conspicuous notices warning of potential criminal activity, such as theft, that may target customers will be displayed.
- * Not selling of alcohol to drunk or intoxicated customers.
- * Custom will not be sought by means of personal solicitation outside or in the vicinity of the premises.
- * Prevention of and vigilance with regards to the sale and use of illegal drug in the premises.
- * Staff will be well trained in asking customers to use premises in an orderly and respectful manner and prevent drinking alcohol outside the premises.

c) Public safety

- * We would have internal and external lighting fixed to promote the public safety objective.
- * We would train our staff to adherence to environmental health requirements.
- * Training and implementation of underage ID checks would be enforced
- * A log book would be kept at the premises in which we would enter particulars of inspections made; those required to be made by statute, and information compiled to comply with any public safety condition attached to the premises licence that requires the recording of such information. The log book would be kept available for inspection when required by persons authorised by the Licensing Act 2003 or associated legislation.
- * All parts of the premises and all fittings and apparatus therein, door fastenings and notices, lighting, heating, electrical, air conditioning, sanitary accommodation and other installations, will be maintained at all times in good order and in a safe condition.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

- * We would put in place noise reduction measures to address the public nuisance objective.
- * Prominent, clear and legible notices will be displayed at the exit requesting the public to respect the needs of nearby residents and/or businesses and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- * Deliveries of goods necessary for the operation of the business will be carried out at such a time or in such a manner as to

prevent nuisance and disturbance to nearby residents and/or businesses.

- * We would ensure that staff who arrive early morning or depart late at night (ex. for unpacking, pricing newly delivered goods) when the business has ceased trading conduct themselves in such a manner to avoid causing disturbance to nearby residents and/or businesses
- * Customers will be asked not to stand around loudly talking in the street outside the premises.
- * Customers will not be admitted to premises above opening hours.
- * The movement of bins and rubbish outside the premises will be kept to a minimum after 11.00pm. This will help to reduce the levels of noise produced by the premises.
- * Any lighting on or outside the premises will be positioned and screened in such a way so as to not cause a disturbance to nearby residents and/or businesses
- * Adequate waste receptacles for use by customers will be provided in the premises.

e) The protection of children from harm

- * We would clearly display the "Challenge 25" sign which is a retailing strategy that encourages anyone who is over 18 but looks under 25 to carry acceptable ID (a card bearing the PASS hologram, a photographic driving license or a passport) if they wish to buy alcohol.
- * our staffs will be well trained about requirement for persons' identification, age establishment and what to do if and when a customer does not wish to provide such identifications.
- * All the details will be provided in Training Record Book which will be available at the premises.
- * the Log Book will be kept at the premises at all times.
