This application for a Temporary Event Notice made by Darren Mills under section 100 of the Licensing Act 2003. The application was received by Havering's Licensing Authority on 17th May 2012.

Geographical description of the area and description of the building

The Temporary Event Notice (TEN) is for Monday 4th June 2012 to cover the hours of 00.00 to 03.00 (Sunday night into Monday morning) for the Sale by Retail of Alcohol, the Provision of Regulated Entertainment and the Provision of Late Night Refreshment for a maximum of 499 people. The TEN apply to the whole premises which are situated in the centre of Romford on the south side of the Market place. A map of the area is attached to assist the sub-committee.

The premises are in the centre of Romford and very close to public transport.

The application forms were received by the licensing office on Thursday 17th May 2012.

I followed the procedure relating to TENs entered it onto our data base and returned a signed copy to the applicant/agent acknowledging the TEN by post.

PC Dave Fern the Havering Police Licensing Officer and Marc Gasson the Environmental Health Noise Specialist made a representation against the Temporary Event Notice on Monday 21st May 2012.

Under the Licensing Act 2003 the police and environmental health have three working days to lodge an objection to a TEN on the grounds relating to one or more of the four licensing objectives (The Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety, the Prevention of Public Nuisance and the Protection of Children from Harm).

A TEN allows the sale of alcohol, regulated entertainment and late night refreshment (hot food and drink 23.00hrs to 05.00hrs) for a limited period to take place without there being a licence but limits the number of people present to 499 (including staff).



Police wish to make representation <u>against</u> the temporary event notice for the EDGE 80 - 84 MARKET PLACE, ROMFORD, RM1.

This event is for the jubilee celebrations on morning of 04/06/2012 licensed from midnight - 0300 hours.

The premises fall within the saturation zone and violent crime is still rising within this zone. Police feel that granting additional hours would have a negative impact on the licensing objectives; Prevention of crime and disorder and public nuisance.

The cumulative impact of granting additional hours will only add to the problems that police are already presented with. The borough of Havering is amongst the top boroughs for alcohol fuelled violence within the Metropolitan police. The borough now targets 60% of its resources to tackle the serious issues or crime and disorder in the town centre. We need to tackle the scourge of violence and we need to do it now.

The licensing act is about prevention and to assist the police and authorities in controlling violence both on and off the premises, along with disorder and public nuisance.

There are also ongoing issues with residents about the noise generated form these premises. At a recent hearing the operator was informed to build a lobbied exit. I believe this work is not yet complete thus creating further public nuisance.

I have taken into account that this event falls over the jubilee celebrations this is a long weekend. The premises do have a sufficient licence to make alternative arrangements for its event.

Police will not support this event and genuinely believed granting of such hours will only have negative effect of crime and disorder along with public nuisance.

Licensing Act 2003-Application for Temporary Event Notice 4/6/2012 The Edge, 82-84 Market Place, Romford, Essex.

I refer to the above application for a T.E.N. for the 4th June 2012 from 00:00-03:00 hours making the following observations and therefore objecting to it being granted.

This Service is currently investigating ongoing complaints received from nearby residents of noise from the Edge. Evidence of noise from the venue has been witnessed by officers from this Service both in terms of the music from inside the venue and the noise from the patrons outside the premises.

The complaints jhave predominantly been associated with functions at the venue where live music is played. This currently is not played through the venue's music system where the noise level is controlled by a noise limiter. As the application relates to a live band playing at the venue and therefore the level of music will not be controlled by their noise limiter. In addition there is currently no lobbied exit at ground floor level from the bar area reducing noise breakout from this area. For these reasons I object to the the Temporary Event Notice, as any extension of hours for licensible activities will increase the likelihood of noise problems witnessed previously being caused to nearby residents at the later hours applied for.
