Part A – Report seeking decision

DETAIL OF THE DECISION REQUESTED AND RECOMMENDED ACTION

To approve the Highways Investment Programme for 2019/20, retrospectively, for carriageway and footways resurfacing works undertaken at the locations detailed in the Appendix to this report.

AUTHORITY UNDER WHICH DECISION IS MADE

Council's Constitution:

Assistant Director, Environment; Part 3, Section 3.8.3,

Paragraph (b)

Other than in those matters delegated to the Lead Member following consideration by the Highways Advisory Committee, to exercise all powers and duties in respect of maintaining and improving highways, providing facilities, and interference with highways arising under Parts IV, V, VII, IX and XIV of the Highways Act 1980.

STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The first phase of the 3 year Highways Investment Programme commenced in April 2019, and has now been completed. Engineers are now preparing to deliver on the 2020/21 phase of the programme thereby ensuring continuation and consistency in the quality of work provided so far.

The length of the highway network in Havering consists of 740km of carriageways (roads) and nearly 1,070km of footways, making it the second largest highway network in London. Havering, in its capacity as the Highway Authority, has a statutory duty to maintain the public highway (Highways Act 1980 s41) but fulfilling that statutory duty with such an extensive highway network can be challenging and expensive. With finite levels of capital funding available, it is critical that any funding is spent in the most effective way possible to get the maximum benefit to the highway network.

Proactive resurfacing not only helps the Council fulfil its statutory duties under the highways Act, it also supports much of the Council's own vision and many of the desired outcomes in its Corporate Plan.

Method of prioritising locations for resurfacing – doing the 'worst-first'

The proposed locations for resurfacing works on borough footways and carriageways set out in the Appendix are identified using a 'worst-first' approach.

The locations identified for resurfacing works are considered to be the most in need of resurfacing based on recent condition United Kingdom Pavement Management System

("UKPMS") surveys undertaken of every road and footway within Havering with the resulting programme lists generated and then verified by qualified highways engineers.

The worst-first lists are checked on site by qualified engineers and amendments are made for reasons such as:

- A different treatment type is needed as the road is low speed, fast breaking etc.;
- The exact extent of the surfacing can be extended or contracted for traffic management, logistical reasons etc.;
- The location may have already been resurfaced since the latest condition survey data

Making use of 'Horizons' to Objectively Deliver the 'worst-first' Strategy

In terms of a policy approach to identifying survey locations, it is appropriate to have an overtly objective approach to identifying and prioritising capital spending. Horizons is the newly objective tool that has been utilised.

The Horizons software identifies and prioritises highway maintenance schemes, and determines the cost implications of various treatments. It allows Havering to use locally defined remedial treatments and also allows users to specify additional criteria and triggers at which these treatments would be invoked should it so wish. UKPMS survey data - collected by Havering in accordance with industry best practice - is entered into Horizons and is the most significant input in terms of generating the works programme.

Condition surveys will be continued on an annual basis, which will further improve modelling of the highway asset in the future. Improving and maintaining survey data of the footway and carriageway will enable the Council to further refine lifecycle planning targets which would serve to better inform the future level of funding required.

For 2020/21 the Highways service are seeking to develop a usage and condition audit to establish the programme.

Delivery of the programme

The full £10.8m allocation was spent during 2019/20 although inclement weather and urgent utility works (e.g. burst water mains) did lead to schedule revisions.

OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED

Preventative ongoing small-scale maintenance works assist in keeping the roads and pavements to a safe and reasonable level, although the programme listed in the Appendix are determined essential based upon the worse first policy. No further capital investment would result in further deterioration of highways assets resulting in more costly repairs, and potential safety implications.

Part B - Assessment of implications and risks

LEGAL IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

Officers are seeking approval for the Highways Investment Programme for 2019/20. The capital value of £10.8m has already been allocated to the 2019/20 programme and does not form part of this decision. The locations at which the capital works are to be undertaken requires an executive decision by the Assistant Director Environment as per the Council's constitution.

The London Borough of Havering as Highway Authority has a statutory duty to maintain the public highway at public expense under the Highways Act 1980 (s41) ensuring it is in a safe and passable condition.

Officers need to ensure that the contractor carrying out the works complies with all statutory notice procedures. The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 govern road traffic signs and road markings.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

A capital allocation was made available for the resurfacing works as part of the 3-year Highways Investment Programme for 2019/2022. The total capital for 2019/20 was \pounds 10.8m

Due to the nature of highways resurfacing works, unforeseen circumstances within the highway construction phase may cause the volume of works to change, along with associated costs. To ensure the budget did not incur any overspend, all costs were strictly monitored and controlled.

Further financial risk is also possible should the overall programme not be delivered as planned, including the risk of accidents occurring in the chosen locations, which the Council could be financially liable in terms of third party claims.

HUMAN RESOURCES IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS (AND ACCOMMODATION IMPLICATIONS WHERE RELEVANT)

There are no implications to note.

EQUALITIES AND SOCIAL INCLUSION IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

This means delivering better access to jobs and key services through an accessible and socially inclusive transport system, by removing the barriers to travel and ensuring that social impacts are addressed in policy development and service delivery.

Therefore, not delivering the Highways Investment Programme will pose a significant equalities and social inclusion risk.

HEALTH AND WELLBEING IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

The Havering Health and Wellbeing Strategy (2015-2019) states that 'everyone in the **borough has a right to enjoy good health and wellbeing'**. It can therefore be argued that adequately maintaining the borough's road and pavement infrastructure can be considered an essential part of this vision by either preserving or enhancing social and public health benefits. This can range from but not limited to noise reduction, improved drainage, improved car journey times, improved parking management, reduced emissions and improved pedestrian facilities.
