Part A - Report seeking decision

DETAIL OF THE DECISION REQUESTED AND RECOMMENDED ACTION

1. This report seeks approval to award a Call-Off Contract for the Supply and Delivery of Fresh and Frozen Meat and Poultry to William White Meat Ltd for a period of up to five years at an estimated cost of £400,000 per annum.

STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR THE DECISION

- This report seeks approval for the London Borough of Havering to enter into a Call-Off contract from the Procurement Across London (PAL) Framework Agreement for the Supply and Delivery of Fresh and Frozen Meat and Poultry.
- 2. The Call-off contract will be for a period of four years with provision for up to a one-year extension.
- 3. The re-commissioning will allow continuity of service to the schools meal and catering services within the London Borough of Havering. The extension will allow a safety net in case there is a delay when the Framework Agreement is re-let, to ensure that schools have a continuing supply of meat, etc.
- 4. The Framework Agreement within the London Borough of Havering will be used mainly by Catering Services as part of the provision of school meals and will be available, as required, across the wider Council.
- 5. The total value of the Call-Off contract over the four-year term is expected to be approximately £1,600,000 if the extension provision is utilised, then at present day prices the value will be circa £2 million.
- 6. This is a direct award to the single supplier appointed to the Procurement Across London Framework Agreement for the Supply and Delivery of Fresh and Frozen Meat and Poultry.

- 7. This framework has been tendered in compliance with UK procurement legislation.
- 8. The Supplier appointed to the framework was assessed during the procurement process for their financial stability, track record, experience and technical and professional ability.
- 9. The Supplier on this Framework has been selected for their experience and ability to provide customers with a comprehensive range of products to specified quality standards and on value.
- 10. The Supplier is required by the Framework Agreement to have environmental considerations embedded into their policies, systems and operations. A particular emphasis is making the most effective use of available resources, conserving energy, re-using materials and minimising and recycling waste and the use of recycled materials in the manufacture of crates, pallets, boxes, cartons, cushioning and forms of packaging.
- 11. In addition, as many deliveries under the Framework are within the proposed wider London ULEZ area bounded by the North and South Circular, there is a requirement that all vehicles used will be compliant within one year of operation. (This means that vehicles must meet the most up-to-date vehicle emission standard: Euro VI). Havering Council, which is outside of the proposed LEZ, will benefit from this requirement.
- 12. The specification provides for Halal meat and so will meet the different requirements of the Catering Service and Schools within Havering Council.
- 13. Costs will be met from the revenue budgets of services and schools utilising the contract.
- 14. A 4% rebate will be paid directly to the Council based on the annual spend and paid yearly.

OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED

Other options considered:

Option 1 -Do nothing

 The current Contract is due to expire on 31st July 2020 and cannot be extended. Therefore doing nothing would result in the end of the Supply and Delivery of Fresh and Frozen Meat for the provision of school meals and Catering Services, within the London Borough of Havering. Therefore, this option was not considered further.

Option 2 Call -Off an established Framework Agreement

This option has been considered; through the Eastern Shires Purchasing Organisation (ESPO) and Yorkshire Purchasing Organisation (YPO) Framework Agreements. This would not give local Suppliers the opportunity to win the contract also the framework expires in August 2021.

Part B - Assessment of implications and risks

LEGAL IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

- (1) This report seeks approval to award a Call-Off Contract for the Supply and Delivery of Fresh and Frozen Meat and Poultry to William White Meat Ltd for a period of four years with an option to renew for 12 months at an estimated cost of £400,000 per annum.
- (2) Service contracts over the value of £189,300 need to comply with the Public Contracts Regulations 2015 ('Regulations'). Compliance with the Regulations can be by appointing a contractor from a Framework established under section 33 of the Regulations, to undertake the work. The report states that William Meat Ltd were the single supplier from the PAL framework established by the Council.
- (3) Legal understands the Framework was set up with the assistance of OneSource Procurement in accordance with section 33 of the Regulations using the open procedure and the William White Meat was selected to be the sole supplier based on the most economically advantageous tender in accordance with the Regulations and the framework permits call off's.
- (4) Legal Services takes the view that the award to can proceed if the Council is otherwise satisfied with the content of the report.
- (5) Contracts with a total value of more than £150,000 has to be executed under seal.
- (6) The award and execution of the framework must take place before the Call Off contract is awarded.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

An Experian Credit check was undertaken on William White Meats Ltd to confirm financial viability and risk on 8th June 2020, and showed a risk score of 99, very low risk. Payment performance of the company has remained stable, with an adequate net worth. Further ratio analysis of company accounts for the last 3 financial years, has confirmed the company has good liquidity and that there is no concern over the ability of its liquid assets covering short term liabilities, therefore confirming financial viability.

There are therefore no immediate financial concerns regarding the award of this contract to William White Meats Ltd.

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HUMAN RESOURCES IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS (AND ACCOMMODATION IMPLICATIONS WHERE RELEVANT)

The recommendations made in this report do not give rise to any identifiable HR risks or implications that would affect either the Council or its workforce.

In addition, the Council is also committed to improving the quality of life and wellbeing for all Havering residents in respect of socio-economics and health determinants.

General equalities considerations are vetted through the use of the standard selection questionnaire. For example, specific standards of meat required for Muslims are catered for within the specification.

The proposed procurement will support the provision of fresh meat and poultry for school meals. This in turn, supports the healthy development of children through the provision of healthy, tasty and nutritious food. The products are ethically sourced and either meet or exceed the minimum food standards required by Government. The Suppliers are required to ensure that their vehicles meet the Ultra-Low Emission Standard for London, which requires that vehicles meet the most recent vehicle emission standard, Euro VI, which contributes to lowering vehicle emissions and improving the air quality around the schools to which deliveries are made. In addition, the Supplier is based just outside the Greater London area in Purfleet, reducing the road miles for delivery.
