Part A - Report seeking decision

DETAIL OF THE DECISION REQUESTED AND RECOMMENDED ACTION

This Executive Decision approves the implementation of the following minor parking scheme which following the close of statutory consultation received objection:

(a) Scheme SCH684 – Westland Avenue / Allenby Drive – installation of 'at any time' waiting restrictions on and opposite the road junction (as shown on drawing reference SCH684)

STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The proposed minor parking scheme (detailed further in the following parts to this report) has been designed to improve road safety, traffic flow and rationalise parking, whilst maintaining access for emergency and Council vehicles. The proposal has been reviewed for 'road safety' implications as well as implications for general accessibility and impact on existing parking provision.

An Executive Decision dated 19th November 2019 authorised commencement of statutory consultation of the minor parking scheme. At the close of consultation on 13th December 2019 two representations in objections to the scheme or elements of the scheme were received by the Council. The following parts of this report detail the objection received and the officer response to the objection resulting in a recommendation to progress with the scheme as originally proposed.

OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED

The option to not progress the scheme was considered but rejected. Officers consider the need to ensure road safety, traffic flow and access around this junction outweigh the loss of the general parking provision.

PRE-DECISION CONSULTATION

The proposals have been publically consulted as per the Council's legal obligations to publicise changes to the traffic orders for a period no less than 21 days commencing 22nd November 2019. This report considers the results of the consultation.

Description:

At any time waiting restrictions proposed on and opposite the junction of Westland Avenue and Allenby Drive, were publicly advertised on the 22nd November 2019. The consultation period ended on the 13th December 2019.

To note, the local authority have followed all statutory measures when formally advertising the proposals, such as the notice published in the ordered papers, notices placed on street furniture at site, and letters sent to those residents deemed affected by the proposals.

Following the consultation, the Council received two responses to the consultation, in objection to the proposals set out in the table below:

Respondent	Summary of comments	
Resident of Westland Avenue	The resident is against the proposals and says that they will cause much inconvenience and disputes between neighbours fighting for parking spaces. The residents goes onto say if the yellow lines are implemented then residents will have to park further away from their home.	
Resident of Allandale	The owner of the flats objects to the proposals and says that the installation of the double yellow lines will impact the residents of the flats who find it very difficult to park	
Road	at the moment due to them not having off street parking	

Officer Comments:

The current problems that exist at this location are that vehicles park on the junction of Westland Avenue and Allenby Drive obscuring sight lines and preventing full access especially for larger vehicles such as Council refuse collection and emergency vehicles. Problems are also caused to sight lines of vehicles accessing and egressing the drive ways of Nos. 133 and 135 Westland Avenue by vehicles parking either side of the dropped kerb.

The Council proposed for at any time waiting restrictions to be installed on and opposite the junction to alleviate the problems currently being experienced at the location. The installation of the at any time waiting restrictions would majorly improve and ultimately maintain full access for both emergency vehicles and also the access and egress of the driveway. This would also increase the sight lines around the junction thus leading to better safety at the location.

Council officers have considered if a safety audit is required for this scheme, however, after determining that the proposals will alleviate the problems being experienced at this present time and improve the access and sight line issues, no safety audit is required.

Having analysed the objections to the consultation and liaised with the local Ward Councillors, two of whom responded stating that they are in favour of the restrictions being installed and the remaining Ward Councillor suggested the restrictions should be abandoned, no amendment to the original proposed design was needed.

Regarding the objector's comments that these restrictions would cause residents inconvenience as they would have to park further away from their home and cause neighbours to fight for parking spaces, according to the Highway Code, motorists should not park opposite or within 10 metres of a junction except in an authorised parking space, therefore these restrictions are reiterating and supporting the Highway Code.

It is recommend to proceed with the proposals as advertised following guidance from the Highway Code, these restrictions will improve road safety, traffic flow, sight lines and maintain access for emergency and Council vehicles.

Member Support:

The St Andrews Ward Councillors have been made aware of the responses, with two Ward Councillors responding saying they are in full support of the proposals. The remaining Ward Councillor was in favour of the scheme being abandoned.

Financial Implications:

The estimated cost of this scheme is £500.00


Recommendation:

Part B - Assessment of implications and risks

LEGAL IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

Here Officers seek approval for the implementation of the 'at any time' waiting restriction parking scheme that pursuant to the Council's Constitution requires an executive decision by the Assistant Director of Environment.

The Council's power to make an order regulating or controlling vehicular traffic on roads is set out in Part I of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("RTRA 1984") with the power to designate parking places set out under part IV of the RTRA 1984.

Before an Order is made, the Council should ensure that the statutory procedures set out in the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Procedure)(England & Wales) Regulations 1996 (SI 1996/2489) are complied with. The Traffic Signs Regulations & General Directions 2016 govern road traffic signs and road markings.

Section 122 RTRA 1984 imposes a general duty on local authorities when exercising functions under the RTRA. It provides, insofar as is material, to secure the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of vehicular and other traffic (including pedestrians) and the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on and off the highway. This statutory duty must be balanced with any concerns received over the implementation of the proposals.

In considering any responses received during consultation, the Council must ensure that full consideration of all representations is given including those which do not accord with the officer's recommendation. The Council must be satisfied that any objections to the proposals were taken into account.

In considering any consultation responses, the Council must balance the concerns of any objectors with the statutory duty under section 122 RTRA 1984.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

The estimated costs of £0.001m which include advertising costs and implementing the proposal as described above and shown on the attached plan will be met from the 2020/21 A26910, Minor Parking Schemes budget which at the time of this report has sufficient available budget.

This is a standard project for Environment and there is no expectation that the works cannot be contained within the cost estimate. In the unlikely event of an overspend, the balance would need to be contained within the overall Environment budget..

Proposed 'At Any Time' waiting restrictions - Westland Avenue & Allenby Drive

I am writing to advise you that the Council are proposing to introduce 'At Any Time' waiting restrictions on the junction of Westland Avenue and Allenby Drive. It is also proposed to introduce 'At Any Time' waiting restrictions opposite the junction outside Nos 129 to 137.

These proposals have been designed to improve road safety, sight lines and also improve access which will assist in reducing disruption to Council and emergency services.
