# Part A – Report seeking decision

#### DETAIL OF THE DECISION REQUESTED AND RECOMMENDED ACTION

This Executive Decision approves the commencement of statutory consultation for the following minor parking schemes as set out in this report:

#### Installation of Disabled Persons Parking Bays:

- a) Scheme SCH1067 Waycross Road installation of a disabled persons parking bay on the carriageway outside flat Nos 45-55 Waycross Road (as shown on drawing reference SCH1067);
- b) Scheme SCH2132 Wembley Close installation of a disabled persons parking bay outside Nos 10 and 11 Wembley Close (as shown on drawing reference SCH2132)
- c) Scheme SCH2136 Dagnam Park Drive installation of a disabled persons parking bay fully on the footway outside No 165 Dagnam Park Drive converting the existing footway parking bay (as shown on drawing reference SCH2136)
- d) Scheme SCH2140 Dagnam Park Drive installation of a disabled persons parking bay fully on the footway converting an existing footway bay outside No 162 Dagnam Park Drive (as shown on drawing reference SCH2140)
- e) Scheme SCH2138 Barnstaple Road installation of disabled persons parking bay in the turning head in Barnstaple Road (as shown on drawing reference SCH2138)
- f) Scheme SCH2163 Aldwych Close installation of disabled persons parking bay outside No 9 Aldwych Close converting an existing footway parking bay (as shown on drawing reference SCH2163/ SCH730)
- g) Scheme SCH2164 Queen Mary Close installation of a disabled persons parking bay converting an existing residents permit parking bay (RO3 zone) (as shown on drawing reference SCH2164)
- h) Scheme SCH2166 Pretoria Road installation of a disabled persons parking bay converting an existing residents permit parking bay (RO2B zone) (as shown on drawing reference SCH2166)
- i) Scheme SCH2170 Tuck Road installation of a disabled persons parking bay outside No 24 partially on the footway (as shown on drawing reference SCH2170)

#### Change from Dedicated Disabled Persons Parking Bay to Disabled Persons Parking Bay

 j) Scheme SCH1069 – Playfield Avenue – removal of dedicated disabled persons parking bay and change into a disabled persons parking bay (as shown on drawing reference SCH1069).

#### Removal of Disabled Persons Parking Bay

- k) Scheme SCH2126 22 St Neots Road removal of disabled persons parking bay outside No 22 St Neots Road (as shown on drawing reference SCH2126)
- Scheme SCH2128 Cromer Road removal of disabled persons parking bay outside No 16 Cromer Road (as shown on drawing reference SCH2128)

#### Installation / Extension of No Waiting At Any Time Restrictions:

m) Scheme SCH963 – Mashiters Hill / Lawns Way – extension of existing no waiting at any time restrictions on Mashiters Hill from its junction with Lawns Way. Also installation of no

waiting at any time restrictions on Mashiters Hill opposite its junction with Lawns Way (as shown on drawing reference SCH963)

- n) Scheme SCH730 Aldwych Close / Adelphi Cresent installation of no waiting at any time restrictions on the junction of Aldwych Close and Adelphi Cresent. Also in Aldwych Close around the junction outside Nos 58, Nos 21 and 23. (as shown on drawing reference SCH2163/ SCH730)
- o) Scheme SCH962 Heaton Avenue installation of no waiting at any time restrictions on the bend in Heaton Avenue from the vehicular crossover of No 30 to the vehicular crossover to No 36 (as shown on drawing reference SCH962)
- p) Scheme SCH583 Norman Road / Southdown Road installation of no waiting at any time restrictions on the junction of Norman Road with Southdown Road (as shown on drawing reference SCH583)

and if at the close of consultation no objections are received to the individual schemes that they proceed to full implementation.

(u) To authorise the creation, amendment and removal of disabled persons' parking bays and footway parking bays and at any time waiting restrictions at bends and road junctions

#### STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The proposed minor parking schemes (detailed previously and drawings shown in the following parts to this report) have been designed to improve road safety, traffic flow and rationalise parking, whilst maintaining access for emergency and Council vehicles. The proposals have been reviewed for 'road safety' implications as well as implications for general accessibility and impact on existing parking provision.

#### Installation of Disabled Persons Parking Bays

Requests have been received by local residents supported by Occupational Therapy for the installation of Disabled Persons Parking Bays at the following locations:

- (a) Scheme SCH1067– Waycross Road (as shown on drawing reference SCH1067)
- (b) Scheme SCH2132– Wembley Close (as shown on drawing reference SCH2132)
- (c) Scheme SCH2136 Dagnam Park Drive (as shown on drawing reference SCH2136)
- (d) Scheme SCH2140 Dagnam Park Drive (as shown on drawing reference SCH2140)
- (e) Scheme SCH2138 Barnstaple Road (as shown on drawing reference SCH2138)
- (f) Scheme SCH2163 Aldwych Close (as shown on drawing reference SCH2163)
- (g) Scheme SCH2164 Queen Mary Close (as shown on drawing reference SCH2164)
- (h) Scheme SCH2166 Pretoria Road (as shown on drawing reference SCH2166)
- (i) Scheme SCH2170 Tuck Road (as shown on drawing reference SCH2170)

Schemes officers have assessed and explored all options to locate a disabled persons parking bay facility in support of the requests. As it has not been possible to provide a parking facility within the

confines of the respective properties, therefore it has been decided that the introduction of a disabled parking bay fully on the footway or carriageway, partly on the footway/ carriageway or converting an existing footway parking bay or converting an existing residents permit parking bay (shown on the respective drawings) would be justified.

Officers recommend the installation of a Disabled Persons Parking Bay at each location as referenced above.

#### Change from Dedicated Disabled Persons Parking Bay to Disabled Persons Parking Bay

#### j) Scheme SCH1069 – Playfield Avenue – (as shown on drawing reference SCH1069)

A request has been received from the resident for whom the dedicated disabled persons parking bay was for to remove this bay, as it was no longer required. We then had a request from the nearby Chiropody Clinic to ask if this bay could be changed into a disabled persons parking bay for use by all blue badge holders especially those visiting the clinic.

Officers recommend changing the dedicated disabled persons parking bay into a disabled persons parking bay as per the request.

#### Removal of Disabled Persons Parking Bay

#### k) Scheme SCH2126 – 22 St Neots Road (as shown on drawing reference SCH2126)

A request has been received from Occupational Therapy to remove the disabled persons parking bay outside No 22 St Neots Road and return this section of road to part of the residents permit parking area as it is no longer required.

Officers recommend removing the disabled persons parking bay and returning this section of road to part of the residents permit parking area.

#### I) Scheme SCH2128 16 Cromer Road (as shown on drawing reference SCH2128)

A request has been received from Occupational Therapy to remove the disabled persons parking bay outside No 16 Cromer Road and return this section of the road to be part of the existing residents permit parking bay as it is no longer required.

Officers recommend removing the disabled persons parking bay and returning this section of the road to part of the residents permit parking area.

#### Installation/ Extension of No Waiting At Any Time Restrictions

m) Scheme SCH963 – Mashiters Hill / Lawns Way – extension of existing no waiting at any time restrictions on Mashiters Hill from its junction with Lawns Way. Also installation of no waiting at any time restrictions on Mashiters Hill opposite its junction with Lawns Way (as shown on drawing reference SCH963)

A request has been received from a Resident and Officer to extend the existing no waiting at any time restrictions on Mashiters Hill with its junction with Lawns Way to the side vehicular access to No 2 Lawns Way. Also introduce no waiting at any time restrictions on Mashiters Hill between the vehicular crossovers of Nos 66 and 72

Officers have assessed this location and it was felt that action needs to be taken to alleviate the parking problems being experienced with vehicles causing an obstruction and improve sight lines.

Officers recommend extending the no waiting at any time restrictions on the junction of Mashiters Hill and Lawns Way, also introducing no waiting at any time restrictions opposite the junction to improve sight lines, traffic flow and improve access for emergency and Council vehicles.

n) Scheme SCH730 – Aldwych Close/ Adelphi Crescent– installation of no waiting at any time restrictions on the junction of Aldwych Close and Adelphi Crescent. Also on the junction in Aldwych Close (as shown on drawing reference SCH2163/ SCH730)

Requests have been received from residents to deal with obstructive parking and sight line issues at the junctions in Aldwych Close.

Officers have assessed this location and it was felt that action needed to be taken to alleviate the obstruction and sight line issues and have been designed to improve road safety, sight lines and improve access around the junctions.

Officers recommend the installation of no waiting at any time restrictions around the junction of Aldwych Close and Adelphi Crescent. Also in Aldwych Close on the junction outside Nos 58, 21 and 23.

# o) Scheme SCH962 – Heaton Avenue- installation of no waiting at any time restrictions on the bend in Heaton Avenue (as shown on drawing reference SCH962)

A request has been received from a resident to install no waiting at any time restrictions around the bend in Heaton Avenue to improve sight lines, traffic flow and prevent obstructive parking.

Officers have assessed this location and it was felt action needed to be taken to alleviate the parking problems being experienced with vehicles parking on the bend.

Officers recommend to install no waiting at any time restrictions around the bend in Heaton Avenue from the vehicular crossover to No 30 to the vehicular crossover to No 36, as these restrictions will assist with sight lines, traffic flow and prevent obstructive parking.

# p) Scheme SCH583 – Norman Road / Southdown Road – installation of no waiting at any time restrictions on the junction of Norman Road with Southdown Road (as shown on drawing reference SCH583)

A request has been received from Ward Councillors to install no waiting at any time restrictions on the junction to improve sight lines and prevent obstructive parking.

Officers have assessed this location and it was felt that action needed to be taken to alleviate the issues being experienced with vehicles parking on the junction.

Officers recommend to install no waiting at any time restrictions on the junction of Norman Road with Southdown Road to assist sight lines, traffic flow and improve road safety.

Officers have assessed all the locations listed and considered if a safety audit was required for these schemes, however, after determining that the schemes detailed above pose no risk to other road users, conclude that a safety audit is not required. The schemes have been designed to improve road safety, traffic flow, enhance sight lines and maintain accessibility for the emergency services and Council vehicles at all times.























# Part B - Assessment of implications and risks

#### LEGAL IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

Here Officers seek approval for various schemes that include the installation of disabled persons parking provision; removal of a disabled persons parking provision; and installation/ extension of junction protections or waiting restrictions on a bend that pursuant to the Council's Constitution requires an executive decision by the Assistant Director of Environment.

The Council's power to make an order regulating or controlling vehicular traffic on roads is set out in Part I of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("RTRA 1984") with the power to designate parking places set out under part IV of the RTRA 1984.

Before an Order is made, the Council should ensure that the statutory procedures set out in the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Procedure)(England & Wales) Regulations 1996 (SI 1996/2489) are complied with. The Traffic Signs Regulations & General Directions 2016 govern road traffic signs and road markings.

Section 122 RTRA 1984 imposes a general duty on local authorities when exercising functions under the RTRA. It provides, insofar as is material, to secure the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of vehicular and other traffic (including pedestrians) and the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on and off the highway. This statutory duty must be balanced with any concerns received over the implementation of the proposals.

In considering any responses received during consultation, the Council must ensure that full consideration of all representations is given including those which do not accord with the officer's recommendation. The Council must be satisfied that any objections to the proposals were taken into account.

In considering any consultation responses, the Council must balance the concerns of any objectors with the statutory duty under section 122 RTRA 1984.

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

The estimated costs of £0.008m which include advertising costs and implementing the proposal as described above and shown on the attached plan will be met from the 2021/22 A26910, Schemes budget which at the time of this report has sufficient available budget.

This is a standard project for Highways, Traffic and Parking (HTP) and there is no expectation that the works cannot be contained within the cost estimate. In the unlikely event of an overspend, the balance would need to be contained within the overall Public Realm budget.

# 1. The EqHIA – How will the strategy, policy, plan, procedure and/or service impact on people?

#### **Background/context:**

The following schemes are designed to provide a disabled persons parking bay for the resident of the property, following an assessment of their needs by Occupational Therapy in;

Waycross Road Wembley Close Dagnam Park Drive Dagnam Park Drive Barnstaple Road Aldwych Close Queen Mary Close Pretoria Road Tuck Road

The following scheme is designed to amend a dedicated disabled persons parking bay to a disabled persons parking bay in;

Playfield Avenue

The following schemes are designed to remove a disabled persons parking bay which is no longer needed in;

St Neots Road Cromer Road

The following schemes are designed to improve sight lines, traffic flow, road safety, prevent obstruction and access for the emergency services and Council vehicles in;

Mashiters Hill / Lawns Way Aldwych Close / Adelphi Crescent Heaton Avenue Norman Road / Southdown Road

#### Who will be affected by the activity?

The resident whom the disabled bay is meant for should have the benefit of have a parking space close to their property after an assessment by Occupational Therapy. Further to this, other Blue Badge Holders can also use the bay, if it is available.

Residents of the road might be disadvantaged by the introduction of the Disabled Parking Bay, as its installation will reduce the amount of available parking space in the road by one space, for them and their visitors.

The change of a dedicated disabled persons parking bay to a disabled persons parking bay will mean blue badge holders can park in this location especially those needing to use the Chiropody Clinic in Playfield Avenue, rather than just one dedicated blue badge holder.

The removal of a disabled persons parking bay may mean that blue badge holders may have to find alternative parking but the return of the bay to a residents permit parking area would be of an advantage to all residents and it would increase parking capacity for all residents not just blue badge holders. Blue badge holders can park in a residents permit parking zone without needing to purchase a permit for an unlimited time.

The installation/ extension of the no waiting at any time restrictions around junctions, opposite junctions and on bends would improve road safety, traffic flow, sight lines and access for the emergency services which will be of benefit to all residents.

These restrictions will impact on the parking capacity for residents and their visitors but blue badge holders can park on the no waiting at any time restrictions for up to three hours.

The installation of no waiting at any time restrictions will aid larger vehicles (emergency services and Council vehicles) and have street cleaning benefits.
