Part A – Report seeking decision

DETAIL OF THE DECISION REQUESTED AND RECOMMENDED ACTION

This Executive Decision approves the commencement of statutory consultation for the following minor parking schemes as set out in this report:

Installation of Disabled Persons Parking Bays:

- a) Scheme SCH2187 Roseberry Gardens installation of a disabled persons parking bay partially on the footway /carriageway outside Nos 58/60 Roseberry Gardens (as shown on drawing reference SCH2187)
- b) **Scheme SCH2248 Brookway** installation of a disabled persons parking bay outside No 3 Boorkway in the carriageway (as shown on drawing reference SCH2248).
- c) Scheme SCH2138 Barnstaple Road installation of disabled persons parking bay in the turning head in Barnstaple Road. Previously advertised and the traffic order made in a different location within the turning head but this was not suitable for the resident and they have asked for its location to be moved (as shown on drawing reference SCH2138).
- d) Scheme SCH2186 Rodney Way installation of a disabled persons parking bay converting an existing footway parking bay (as shown on drawing reference SCH2186).
- e) Scheme SCH2262 Queen Mary Close installation of a disabled persons parking bay converting an existing residents permit parking bay (RO3 zone) (as shown on drawing reference SCH2262) this request was previously advertised in a different bay in the close but the resident has requested this bay as being more suitable.
- f) Scheme SCH2215 Victoria Road installation of a disabled persons parking bay converting an existing residents permit parking bay (RO3 zone) outside Victoria Court in Victoria Road (as shown on drawing reference SCH2215).

<u>Installation of Disabled Persons Parking Bay and Extension of No Waiting At Any Time</u> <u>Restrictions</u>

g) Scheme SCH1049 – Devonshire Road – installation of a dedicated disabled persons parking bay on Devonshire Road for a resident on Abbs Cross Lane and an extension of the no waiting at any time restrictions from the junction with Abbs Cross Lane (as shown on drawing reference SCH1049)

<u>Installation / Extension of No Waiting At Any Time Restrictions</u>

- h) Scheme SCH555 Ingrebourne Road and East Close installation of no waiting at any time restrictions on Ingrebourne Road and East Close (as shown on drawing reference SCH555).
- i) Scheme SCH2168 St Clements Avenue extension of existing no waiting at any time restrictions to protect both sides of the pedestrian crossing. (as shown on drawing reference SCH2168)
- j) Scheme SCH353 Sunnyside Gardens installation of no waiting at any time restrictions on the bends in Sunnyside Gardens, removing the waiting restriction and replacing with a parking bay outside Nos 9/11 (as shown on drawing reference SCH353)
- k) Scheme SCH925 Nelmes Close / Nelmes Crescent installation of no waiting at any time restrictions on the junction of Nelmes Closes with Nelmes Crescent (as shown on drawing reference SCH925).

- I) Scheme SCH750 Worcester Avenue / Lichfield Terrace installation of no waiting at any time restrictions on the junction of Worcester Avenue / Lichfield Terrace (as shown on drawing reference SCH750).
- m) **Scheme SCH747 Avon Road** extension of no waiting at any time restrictions on Avon Road from its junction with Blyth Walk and opposite the junction on Avon Road (as shown on drawing reference SCH747).
- n) Scheme SCH490 Eyhurst Avenue extension of no waiting at any time restrictions on Eyhurst Avenue from its junction with St Nicholas Avenue (as shown on drawing reference SCH490)
- o) **Scheme SCH693 Globe Road** extension of the no waiting at any time restrictions on Globe Road at the pedestrian refuges, either side of its junction with Hillcrest Road (as shown on drawing reference SCH693).
- p) Scheme SCH785 Thorogood Way / Rainham Road / Dagenham Road installation of no waiting at any time restrictions on the junctions of Thorogood Way with Dagenham Road, also on its junction with Rainham Road (as shown on drawing reference SCH785).
- q) Scheme SCH698 Hubert Road / Stanley Road South installation of no waiting at any time restrictions on the junction of Hubert Road and Stanley Road South (as shown on drawing reference SCH698).

and if at the close of consultation no objections are received to the individual schemes that they proceed to full implementation.

STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The proposed minor parking schemes (detailed previously and drawings shown in the following parts to this report) have been designed to improve road safety, traffic flow and rationalise parking, whilst maintaining access for emergency and Council vehicles. The proposals have been reviewed for 'road safety' implications as well as implications for general accessibility and impact on existing parking provision.

Installation of Disabled Persons Parking Bays

Requests have been received by local residents supported by Occupational Therapy for the installation of Disabled Persons Parking Bays at the following locations:

- (a) Scheme SCH2187 Roseberry Gardens (as shown on drawing reference SCH2187)
- (b) Scheme SCH2248 Brookway (as shown on drawing reference SCH2248)
- (c) Scheme SCH2138 Barnstaple Road (as shown on drawing reference SCH2138)
- (d) Scheme SCH2186 Rodney Way (as shown on drawing reference SCH2186)
- (e) Scheme SCH2262 Queen Mary Close (as shown on drawing reference SCH2262)
- (f) Scheme SCH2215 Victoria Road (as shown on drawing reference SCH2215)

<u>Installation of a dedicated Disabled Persons Parking Bay and an Extension of No Waiting At Any Time Restrictions</u>

(g) Scheme SCH1049 – Devonshire Road (as shown on drawing reference SCH1049)

A request has been received from Occupational Therapy to install a disabled persons parking bay for a resident in Abbs Cross Lane. Unfortunately, it was not possible to find a suitable nearby location in Abbs Cross Lane, therefore Officers are proposing to install a dedicated disabled persons parking bay in nearby Devonshire Road. The proposed bay is next to shops and a restaurant and therefore Officers propose a dedicated disabled persons parking bay in order to prevent other blue badge holders using this facility that has been requested for this resident. Ward Councillors have requested that the existing no waiting at any time restrictions from the junction are also extended on the opposite side to the proposed bay in order to improve traffic flow in this location (as shown on drawing reference SCH1049).

Schemes officers have assessed and explored all options to locate a disabled persons parking bay facility in support of the requests. As it has not been possible to provide a parking facility within the confines of the respective properties, therefore it has been decided that the introduction of a disabled persons parking bay fully on the footway or carriageway, partly on the footway/ carriageway or converting an existing footway parking bay or conversion of an existing permit parking bay (shown on the respective drawings) would be justified.

Officers recommend the installation of a Disabled Persons Parking Bay at each location as referenced above.

<u>Installation / Extension of No Waiting At Any Time Restrictions</u>

(h) Scheme SCH555 - Ingrebourne Road and East Close - installation of no waiting at any time restrictions on the junction of Ingrebourne Road and East Close (as shown on drawing reference SCH555)

A request has been received from a Ward Councillor and a resident to deal with obstructive parking around the junction of Ingrebourne Road and East Close.

Officers have assessed this location and it was felt that action needed to be taken to alleviate the issues being experienced with vehicles parking on the junction.

Officers recommend to install no waiting at any time restrictions on the junction of with Ingrebourne Road and East Close to assist sight lines, traffic flow and improve road safety.

(i) Scheme SCH2168 – St Clements Avenue – installation/ extension of no waiting at any time restrictions on St Clements Avenue (as shown on drawing reference SCH2168)

A request has been received from a Ward Councillor to increase the parking restrictions on the road. This is due to vehicles obstructing the pedestrian crossing area, which in turn restricts the view of oncoming vehicles and therefore jeopardises road safety. This also makes the crossing area ineffective for disabled pedestrians trying to cross.

Officers have assessed the location and it was felt that action should be taken to protect the crossing area and enhance pedestrian safety by the extension of the no waiting at any time restrictions. This proposal would also assist with traffic flow and prevent obstructive parking.

The extension of the existing restrictions are designed to improve road safety and increase sight lines for both pedestrians and road users.

This section of road from Gubbins Lane to Wessex Lane has recently been adopted by the Council and there are existing no waiting at any time restrictions around the junction which will be consulted on/updated on the traffic order at the same time as this extension proposal.

(j) Scheme SCH353 – Sunnyside Gardens – installation of no waiting at any time restrictions on the bends in Sunnyside Gardens. Removal of the existing waiting restriction and replace with the installation of a free bay outside Nos 9/11 (as on drawing reference SCH353)

A request has been received from Ward Councillors to review the parking around the bends to improve road safety.

Officers have assessed this location and it was felt that action needed to be taken to alleviate the issues being experienced with vehicles parking on the bends.

Officers recommend the installation of no waiting at any time restrictions on the bends outside Nos 11/13/15/17/19 (removing an unrestricted free parking bay) and outside Nos 24/26/28/30/32 Sunnyside Gardens. Installation of an unrestricted free parking bay outside Nos 9/11 removing the existing waiting restriction Monday to Saturday 8am to 6.30pm. These restrictions will improve road safety and sight lines on the bends.

(k) Scheme SCH925 - Nelmes Close and Nelmes Crescent – installation of no waiting at any time restrictions on the junction of Nelmes Close and Nelmes Crescent (as shown on drawing reference SCH925)

A request has been received from a the Waste team and a resident, to deal with obstructive parking that is taking place at the junction of Nelmes Close & Nelmes Crescent.

Officers have assessed this location and recommend introducing no waiting at any time restrictions on the junction of Nelmes Close and Nelmes Crescent.

These proposals have been designed to improve road safety, sight lines and maintain access at all times which will assist in reducing disruption to Council and emergency services.

(I) Scheme SCH750 - Worcester Avenue and Lichfield Terrace – installation of no waiting at any time restrictions on the junction of Worcester Avenue and Lichfield Terrace (as shown on drawing reference SCH750).

A request has been received from Ward Councillors to improve road safety and sight lines around the junction of Worcester Avenue and Lichfield Terrace.

Officers have assessed this location and recommend introducing no waiting at any time restrictions on the junction.

These proposals have been designed to improve road safety, sight lines and maintain access at all times which will assist in reducing disruption to Council and emergency services.

(m) Scheme SCH747 – Avon Road – extension of no waiting at any time restrictions on Avon Road from its junction with Blyth Walk and opposite the junction (as shown on drawing reference SCH747)

A request has been received from Ward Councillors to prevent obstructive parking and improve traffic flow around this part of Avon Road.

A site visit took place where it was apparent that when vehicles park opposite each other and opposite the junction of Blyth Walk obstruction issues and the flow of the traffic is affected.

Officers recommend extending the no waiting at any time restrictions on both sides of Avon Road from its junction with Blyth Walk, outside Nos 93,95,97,99 and opposite the junction on Avon Road to prevent obstructive parking.

(n) Scheme SCH490 – Eyhurst Avenue – extension of no waiting at any time restrictions on Eyhurst Avenue from its junction with St Nicholas Avenue and installation of a footway parking bay

A request has been received from Ward Councillors to prevent obstructive parking and improve road safety around Eyhurst Avenue and its junction with St Nicholas Avenue.

Officers have assessed this location and recommend extending the no waiting at any time restrictions on the junction and proposing the installation of a footway parking bay.

These proposals have been designed to improve road safety, sight lines and maintain access at all times which will assist in reducing disruption to Council and emergency services around this junction.

(o) Scheme SCH693 – Globe Road – extension of no waiting at any time restrictions at the pedestrian refuges on Globe Road, either side of its junction with Hillcrest Road.

A request has been received from a Former Ward Councillor, to extend the no waiting at any time restrictions at the pedestrian refuges on Globe Road, either side of its junction with Hillcrest Road, to prevent obstructive parking and ease traffic flow.

Officers have assessed this location at propose to extend the no waiting at any time restrictions in Globe Road, to cover the central hatched markings of the pedestrian refuges to the north and south of its junction with Hillcrest Road and remove the existing footway parking bays in this area.

These proposals have been designed to improve road safety, sight lines and maintain access at all times which will assist in reducing disruption to Council and emergency services.

(p) Scheme SCH785 – Thorogood Way – installation of no waiting at any time restrictions on its junctions with Rainham Road and Dagenham Road

Requests have been received from a resident and an Officer to prevent traffic flow issues around the junctions on Thorogood Way.

Officer have assessed this location and recommend the installation of no waiting at any time restrictions on the north-western side of Thorogood Way between its junction with Dagenham Road and the common boundary of Nos 33 and 34. On the south-western side between its junction with Dagenham Road and the common boundary of Nos 31 and 32. Introduce no waiting at any time

restrictions on the south eastern side of Thorogood Way between its junction with Rainham Road and common boundary of Nos 1a and 1, on the north eastern side between its junction with Rainham Road and common boundary of Nos 1 and 2.

These proposals have been designed to improve road safety, sight lines, traffic flow and maintain access at all times which will assist in reducing disruption to Council and emergency services around this junction.

(q) Scheme SCH698 Hubert Road and Stanley Road South – installation of no waiting at any time restrictions on the junction

A request has been received from Ward Councillors to introduce no waiting at any time restrictions on the junction of Hubert Road and Stanley Road South to improve road safety and sight lines.

Officers recommend introducing the no waiting at any time restrictions in Hubert Road with its junction with Stanley Road South.

These proposals will improve road safety, sight lines and maintain access at all times around the junction which will assist in reducing disruption to Council and emergency services.

Officers have assessed all the locations listed and considered if a safety audit was required for these schemes, however, after determining that the schemes detailed above pose no risk to other road users, conclude that a safety audit is not required. The schemes have been designed to improve road safety, traffic flow, enhance sight lines and maintain accessibility for the emergency services and Council vehicles at all times.

OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED

No other options.

 - All three Councillors have been made aware of the proposals. One Councillor was in support, one Councillor raised concerns regarding the grass verge and the remaining Councillor did not respond.

 - All three Councillors have been made aware of the proposals with all three in support.
- e) Scheme SCH2262 Queen Mary Close Romford Town Ward
 - All three Ward Councillors have been made aware of the proposals, with two Councillors in support and the remaining Councillor did not respond.
- f) Scheme SCH2215 Victoria Road Romford Town Ward

- All three Ward Councillors have been made aware of the proposals, with one Councillor in support and the remaining two Councillors did not respond.
- g) Scheme SCH1049 Devonshire Road St Andrews Ward
 All three Ward Councillors have been made aware of the proposals, with two Ward
 Councillors in support and the remaining Councillor did not respond.
- h) Scheme SCH555 Ingrebourne Road and East Close Rainham & Wennington Ward All three Ward Councillors were made aware of the proposals, two Councillors are in support the proposals and the remaining Councillor did not respond.
- i) Scheme SCH2168 St Clements Avenue Harold Wood Ward
 All three Ward Councillors were made aware of the proposals and all three are in support of the proposals.
- j) Scheme SCH353– Sunnyside Gardens Upminster Ward All three Ward Councillors have been made aware of the proposals and all three Councillors are in support of the proposals.
- k) Scheme SCH925 Nelmes Close and Nelmes Crescent Emerson Park Ward All three Ward Councillors have been made aware of the proposals, two Ward Councillors are in support and the remaining Councillor did not respond.
- Scheme SCH750 Worcester Avenue and Lichfield Terrace Upminster Ward All three Ward Councillors have been made aware of the proposals, two Ward Councillors are in support and the remaining Councillor did not respond.
- m) Scheme SCH747 Avon Road Cranham Ward
 All three Ward Councillors were made aware of the proposals and all three are in support.
- n) Scheme SCH490 Eyhurst Avenue Saints Andrews Ward
 All three Ward Councillors were made aware of the proposals and two Councillors are in support the remaining Councillor did not respond.
- o) Scheme SCH693 Globe Road Hylands Ward and Romford Town Ward All Ward Councillors in both wards were made aware of the proposals, one Hylands Ward Councillor was in support, we did not receive a response from the remaining Councillors. One Romford Town Councillor raised concerns over loss of parking spaces and the other Ward Councillors did not respond.
- p) Scheme SCH785 Thorogood Way South Hornchurch Ward
 All three Ward Councillors were made aware of the proposals, two Ward Councillors are in support and the remaining Councillor did not respond.
- q) Scheme SCH698 Hubert Road / Stanley Road South South Hornchurch Ward All three Ward Councillors were made aware of the proposals, two Ward Councillors are in support and the remaining Councillor did not respond.






Drawing reference SCH2248 Brookway




Drawing reference SCH2138 Barnstaple Road






Drawing reference SCH2262 Queen Mary Close










Drawing reference SCH353 Sunnyside Gardens




Drawing reference SCH925 Nelmes Close / Nelmes Crescent




Drawing reference SCH750 Worcester Avenue and Lichfield Terrace





Part B - Assessment of implications and risks

LEGAL IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

Here Officers seek approval for various schemes that include the installation of a disabled persons parking provision, installation/ extension of no waiting at any time restrictions, removal of waiting restrictions and installation of parking bays that pursuant to the Council's Constitution requires an executive decision by the Assistant Director for Public Realm.

The Council's power to make an order regulating or controlling vehicular traffic on roads is set out in Part I of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("RTRA 1984") with the power to designate parking places set out under part IV of the RTRA 1984.

Before an Order is made, the Council should ensure that the statutory procedures set out in the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Procedure)(England & Wales) Regulations 1996 (SI 1996/2489) are complied with. The Traffic Signs Regulations & General Directions 2016 govern road traffic signs and road markings.

Section 122 RTRA 1984 imposes a general duty on local authorities when exercising functions under the RTRA. It provides, insofar as is material, to secure the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of vehicular and other traffic (including pedestrians) and the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on and off the highway. This statutory duty must be balanced with any concerns received over the implementation of the proposals.

In considering any responses received during consultation, the Council must ensure that full consideration of all representations is given including those which do not accord with the officer's recommendation. The Council must be satisfied that any objections to the proposals were taken into account.

In considering any consultation responses, the Council must balance the concerns of any objectors with the statutory duty under section 122 RTRA 1984.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

The estimated costs of £0.009m which include advertising costs and implementing the proposal as described above and shown on the attached plan will be met from the 2022/23 A26910, Schemes budget which at the time of this report has sufficient available budget.

This is a standard project for Schemes and there is no expectation that the works cannot be contained within the cost estimate. In the unlikely event of an overspend, the balance would need to be contained within the overall Public Realm budget.

Who will be affected by the activity?

The resident whom the disabled bay is meant for should have the benefit of have a parking space close to their property after an assessment by Occupational Therapy. Further to this, other Blue Badge Holders can also use the bay, if it is available.

Residents of the road might be disadvantaged by the introduction of the Disabled Parking Bay, as its installation will reduce the amount of available parking space in the road by one space, for them and their visitors.

A dedicated disabled persons parking bay rather than a disabled persons parking bay will mean the applicant will get sole use of this bay and other blue badge holders will be unable to use this bay.

The removal of a disabled persons parking bay may mean that blue badge holders may have to find alternative parking but this resident the bay was originally installed for has applied for a vehicle crossover to their property.

Blue badge holders can park in a residents permit parking zone without needing to purchase a permit for an unlimited time.

The installation/ extension of the no waiting at any time restrictions around junctions, opposite junctions and on bends would improve road safety, traffic flow, sight lines and access for the emergency services which will be of benefit to all residents.

These restrictions will impact on the parking capacity for residents and their visitors but blue badge holders can park on the no waiting at any time restrictions for up to three hours.

The installation of no waiting at any time restrictions will aid larger vehicles (emergency services and Council vehicles) and have street cleaning benefits.

Vehicles will not be able to park on the no waiting at any time restrictions, however they can still load and unload goods and alight passengers.

The removal of the waiting restriction and replacement with a parking bay will increase parking capacity.

		The introduction / extension of at any time waiting restrictions will increase road safety, sight lines and increase access for the emergency and Council vehicles, which would reduce accidents and worry for residents / visitors using the public carriageways and footways. Although this may increase their stress level as the amount of available parking space would be reduced and they would have to find alternative parking for themselves and their visitors.
