This application for a variation to a premises licence is made by Stonegate Pub Company Limited under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003. The application was received by Havering's Licensing Authority on 5<sup>th</sup> December 2012.

## Geographical description of the area and description of the building

The premises are a large end of terrace public house with licensable activity taking place on the ground floor with living accommodation above. The premises has a large car park to the rear.

The premises are situated on the east side of South Street about 25 metres south of Romford Train Station. The surrounding premises are shops and commercial premises on the ground floor including a number of pubs, bars and restaurants there are some residential properties nearby.

A map of the area is attached to assist the committee.

#### Details of the application

The application to vary the premises licence does not effect the hours of licensable activity.

The application is

- 1. To alter the opening hours on the Premises Licence so that breakfasts can be served at the venue (licensable activity will not take place at the earlier time). This activity is not licensable under the Licensing Act 2003 but if granted by the Sub-Committee would tidy the licence and make matters clear for any future enforcement.
- 2. To remove conditions and replace them with others these are listed on page 8 of the application.

A copy of the premises licence is attached to my report to assist the Cub-Committee.

The conditions that are requested to be varied were imposed on the premises licence at a review hearing before the Havering Licensing Sub-Committee on 8<sup>th</sup> June 2009. This review was brought by Trading Standards following a failed under age test purchases made at the premises. The Sub-Committee decision was appealed by the Goose, the matter did not go before the magistrates as an agreement between the Goose and the Licensing Sub-Committee was reached over the details of the wording and conditions. This was produced into the licence you have with my report.

The premises have not had any Temporary Event Notices since the review hearing which would allow them to operate without door staff and allow children into the premises.

I have inspected the premises on many occasions since 2009 they have always had door staff and no children were on the premises.

### Seasonal variations & Non-standard timings

There are no seasonal variations or non-standard timings attached to this application.

## Comments and observations on the application

The applicant acted in accordance with premises licence regulations 25 and 26 relating to the advertising of the application. The required newspaper advertisement was installed in the Yellow Advertiser on Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> December 2012.



#### The Goose PH 143 South Street, Romford.

I wish to object to the application to vary the Premises Licence for The Goose 143 South Street, Romford.

I am writing as a resident of Romford, a frequent user of the station, a frequent visitor to Romford Town Centre and a person who conducts business within the Town Centre.

I object under all four of the Licensing Objectives and due to the fact that the premises is located within the Romford Town Centre Special Policy Area.

Firstly I would state that having personally checked the display of the application on the Councils website that it did not appear until Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> December as confirmed by Cllr Thompson.

The premise is near Liquid and Envy, is close to the marshalled taxi rank and opposite Romford Station. There are seven public houses, two nightclubs and a number of off licences and late night takeaways including Wacky Bagels nearby and neither the venue or its operation qualify as exceptional to justify the Sub Committee granting this application or again setting aside the cumulative impact policy.

The Goose was and still is regarded as a largely young person's venue especially at weekends.

I have no objection to the earlier opening for breakfast as long as alcohol is not for sale.

The Goose was subject to a Review 2/3 years ago following a number of failed test purchases in which alcohol was sold to underage volunteers. Given that it is generally accepted that a failed test purchase is indicative of further undetected underage sales this is a serious issue when a Town Centre public house is involved.

The sale of alcohol to underage persons is a matter of serious concern in England and we frequently read the alarming figures involving teenagers with serious alcohol related problems including dependency and illnesses including cirrhosis of the liver a usually fatal illness. To have had a major pub operator involved in a Town Centre pub was appalling. It was largely due to the ineptitude of the then Manager in failing to control his pub and the Company for failing to monitor the situation, I suggest a case of profits before responsible retailing and promotion of the Licensing Objectives.

The seriousness with which the Government take the situation is reflected in the fact that the penalty for persistent selling of alcohol to underage persons is now a £20000 fine (persistent selling being defined as 2 offences within 3 months) and that the Section 182 Guidance

under the Licensing Act says some matters are so serious that on a Review serious consideration should be given to revocation even on a first occasion.

The Licensing Sub Committee found the case substantiated and imposed two conditions that SIA licensed Door Supervisors should be on duty from 12 noon till close and that under 18's should not be allowed in The Goose. These were sensible and proportionate measures imposed on the Premises Licence to ensure the robust promotion of the Licensing Objectives of Prevention of Harm to Children and Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

Stonegate Pub Co propose to ease these conditions no doubt to reduce their costs and increase their profitability and the attraction of the pub. This attraction will no doubt include young people and sure as night follows day a percentage will be underage and get served. The vicious circle restarts.

Stonegate offer no measures to replace the successful presence of the current Door Supervisors Team who have done a lot to maintain order and deter underage persons.

Given the past history of The Goose regarding irresponsible even incompetent management and the recurrent underage sales I urge the Licensing Sub Committee to reject the removal of these conditions and maintain the presence of the Door Supervisors and outright ban on under 18's in the venue

I urge the Licensing Sub Committee to reject the application in its entirety for the reasons given. This is not a case I would be prepared to consider mediation for as it is totally inappropriate application and in a Special Policy Area so I would ask the Panel to reject it.

In relation to the application to vary the above mentioned premise licence this Service would make the following representations:

The Trading Standards Service bought the Goose before the licensing committee in 2009. The premise was bought to review following 3 underage sales in May 2007, March 2008 and December 2008. The Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) at the time was a Jonathan Davies and the premise licence holder was Mitchels and Butler Leisure and Retail Ltd.

At the hearing the licensing committee imposed a number of conditions including one requiring that an SIA registered member of staff be at the premises from 12 noon until close on every day.

Since the condition was imposed test purchases have been carried out at the venue on 16<sup>th</sup> December 2010, 25<sup>th</sup> February 2012 and most recently on 7<sup>th</sup> December 2012.

On each of these occasions the volunteer was challenged by the member of door staff and has been unable to even get to the bar to attempt to order a drink. Therefore the condition that was imposed by the committee has been successful in preventing further underage sales at the venue.

The trading standards service is therefore concerned that the removal of this condition may directly affect the licensing objection of the protection of children from harm.

In order to address these concerns the applicant has given the following assurances:

That all staff will be fully retrained if the variation is successful,

That door staff will be present from 7 o'clock at night

That the company will conduct it own regular test purchasing if the condition is removed.

We appreciate that the original offending is quite historical and would request that the licensing committee consider whether the assurances offered by the applicant give sufficient confidence that the condition can now be removed from the licence.

The trading standards service is also concerned with the proposed second condition amendment which states:

Persons under the age of 18 shall be prohibited from entering the premises after 7pm.

We are concerned with the wording of this condition and would suggest that if it is to be agreed it should be better quantified. Firstly that under 18's should only be permitted on the premises when accompanied by a person over 18 and taking a meal.

Secondly we think that in its current format it would allow for persons under 18 to remain in the premises potentially to closing time if they entered prior to 7pm. It would be more satisfactory if the condition was to state that no persons under 18 are to remain in the premises after 7pm.
