Part A – Report seeking decision

DETAIL OF THE DECISION REQUESTED AND RECOMMENDED ACTION

The Council is seeking to procure a supplier for the contract for the Borough Christmas Trees by inviting suppliers to quote via the Request for Quotations process. The supplier will provide Christmas Trees in specified locations within the borough for Christmas 2022. This would be a one-year contract at a value of approximately £35 000 excluding VAT per year with an option to extend for one year to also provide the provision for 2023 totalling approximately £70 000 excluding VAT over two years.

AUTHORITY UNDER WHICH DECISION IS MADE

3.3 Powers of Members of the Senior Leadership Team

Contract powers

(a) To approve commencement of a tendering process for, and to award all contracts below a total contract value of £500,000 but above the EU Threshold for Supplies and Services.

STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The Council does not currently have a contract in place for Christmas Trees. The contract will be in place from September 1 2022 for a period of one year with an option to extend for a further 12 months for the 2023 provision.

The council has been providing Christmas trees within the town centres for many years. The trees are a focal point for individual town centre events organised by Community Groups and local Councillors – where the lights on the trees are switched on as part of these events.

The Council is open to reputational risk if the decision to cancel the installation is made. The budget to pay for the installation is already earmarked within the events budget for 2022/2023.

It was agreed at Theme Board on 25.07.2022 that the procurement for installation for the borough Christmas tree procurement 2022/2023 should go ahead.

OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED

The alternative option is to have no Christmas Trees in the borough. This option has been rejected due to the fact that the Christmas Trees compliment the borough's Town Centres for the duration of the Christmas period.

The Council has been providing Christmas trees around Christmas in the town centre every year for more than the last 10 years. Therefore, there is a general expectation among the Borough's residents that the Council will provide Christmas trees and the Council is open to reputational risk if the decision to cancel the installation is made.

Part B - Assessment of implications and risks

LEGAL IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

Section 19(1) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 allows local authorities to provide such recreational facilities as it thinks fit. The provision of Christmas trees is a recreational facility allowed by that provision.

The Council has a power to make a contract for the provision of Christmas trees through section 111 of the Local Government Act 1972, which allows the Council to do anything which is calculated to facilitate, or is conducive or incidental to, the discharge of any of its functions, or through its general power of competence under section 1 of the Localism Act 2011 to do anything that individuals generally may do. There are limitations on the general power of competence, but the limitations do not apply to this decision.

The contract value is below the applicable public procurement threshold for supply contracts stipulated in the Public Contracts Regulations 2015 ("PCR") of £213 477. Therefore, it is not subject to the full PCR regime.

For the reasons set out above, the Council can invite suppliers to provide quotes.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

The net cost to the Council for the Christmas Trees contract is £70,000 excluding VAT for two years (assuming twelve months extension), which will be funded and contained from the existing Marketing and Events budget (A22035).

The spend is deemed justifiable because creating a festive atmosphere will be appreciated by residents, market holders and shop owners alike which in turn is beneficial for the Council's commercial property income.

The specification for the festive trees and decorative lights advises that all trees must be sourced from an FSC (Forestry Commission Certified) or equivalent and certificate of proof provided. Following the de-installation of the trees, they are disposed of at one of the Council's recycling sites. All lights used on the trees must contain low energy bulbs. The evaluation criteria accompanying the specification will request the supplier to evidence how they will meet the specification requirements.
