Part A - Report seeking decision

DETAIL OF THE DECISION REQUESTED AND RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approval to award a contract to FilmFixer Ltd to provide a film service to the borough.

It is recommended that a decision to award the contract is approved.

(b) To award all contracts with a total contract value of between £500,000 and £5,000,000 other than contracts covered by Contract procedure Rule 16.3.

STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR THE DECISION

Havering receives a number requests to film in the borough each year requiring resources needed to manage these requests in line with the council's policies and statutory requirements. Fees and charges are applicable providing the ability for the council to generate income and market the borough for inclusion in a range commercial filming requirements.

In Havering filming has included The BBC Christmas special, A Christmas Carol which was filmed in April and May 2019, a Christmas M and S advert, which was filmed for 3 days and scenes from The Netflix drama Top Boy.

Filming can add social value to the borough as it can create employment and educational opportunities. (A local cohort of school children visited A Christmas Carol set in Rainham, covered in snow and set in Dickensian times.) As well as maximising income for Havering these are fantastic opportunities for the local community.

In line with council rules and procedures we invited three suppliers to tender to provide the film service for the borough and evaluated based on 70 per cent price, 30 per cent quality.

FilmFixer scored 51.75 out of 70 for price and 27.6 out of 30 for quality and represents best value to the council.

In terms of price FilmFixer have guaranteed an income of at least £8,000 per annum to Havering, which is a £3,000 increase from the past five years.

This will provide Havering Council with £24,000 over the three year contract and £40,000 over the five years in contrast to £25,000 that Havering received over the past five years.

FilmFixer is the leading supplier of film services to London councils. During the contract they will actively promote Havering for filming, and deal all aspects for filming including dealing with all services, health and safety requirements and contact with stakeholders.

The supplier is also active with a range of corporate social responsibility initiatives including employment possibilities for residents within the film industry and visits for Havering schoolchildren.

OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED

The option to provide the service in house was considered and rejected on the grounds that it does not represent best value to the council.

Part B - Assessment of implications and risks

LEGAL IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

The council is a contracting authority which has the power to award a concession contract within the meaning of regulation 4 of the Concession Contracts Regulations 2016. The council also has the power to award contracts through section 111 of the Local Government Act 1972, which allows the council to do anything which is calculated to facilitate, or is conducive or incidental to, the discharge of any of its functions, or through its general power of competence under section 1 of the Localism Act 2011 to do anything that individuals generally may do. There are limitations on the general power of competence, but the limitations do not apply to this decision.

This arrangement will generate a minimum of £8,000 of income per year for the council. Over the course of a five year contract, the minimum total income will be £40,000. The concessionaire's total turnover will be significantly higher than that figure, but it will be below the applicable threshold for concessions contracts stipulated in the Concessions Contracts Regulations 2016 ("CCR") of £5,336,937. Therefore, the proposed contract value is below the applicable threshold in the CCR and consequently it is not subject to the full CCR regime.

For the reasons set out above, the council can award the contract.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

The decision to award the contract to FilmFixer will result in an annual guaranteed revenue/income to the council of £8,000 per year (an increase of £3,000 on the £5,000 per year delivered by the previous contract) which will be credited to the relevant communications and marketing cost centre.

In addition to the annual income of £8,000 the council will receive 60% of any fee paid by film/production companies to Film Fixer for filming in the borough. This amount will vary each year depending on the number of value of arrangements entered into.

Having gone through the relevant procurement processes, FilmFixer are deemed best placed to maximise the amount of income for the council and it is expected that outsourcing in this way will garner better results than managing the service in-house.
