DETAIL OF THE DECISION REQUESTED AND RECOMMENDED ACTION

This report seeks authority from the Assistant Director for Public Realm to:

(1) award the Chewing Gum Taskforce contract to Total Surface Solutions Limited (Company No. 05278639) to commence in October 2022 for a duration of at least 10 days, at a total cost of £34,894.44.

AUTHORITY UNDER WHICH DECISION IS MADE

Part 3 Responsibility for Functions of the Council's Constitution 3.4 Powers of Second Tier Managers

Contract Powers

(a) To award all contracts below a total contract value of £500,000 but above the EU Threshold for Supplies and Services.

General Powers

(a) To take any steps necessary for proper management and administration for their allocated portfolios.

STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR THE DECISION

Havering and Barking & Dagenham Councils have been awarded funding to deep clean pavements on Romford's South Street and the station forecourts of five District Line Stations in Barking and Dagenham.

A previous Executive Decision, published on 14 September 2022 and entitled: "Keep Britain Tidy: Chewing Gum Task Force", agreed to accept the funding and commence a tendering process for this contract.

Havering invited existing contractors in Fusion to provide quotes for the Chewing Gum Task Force project. The service recommends awarding the Chewing Gum Task Force contract to Total Surface Solutions.

Total Surface Solutions offered not only the best value for money for the Council but also offered to perform extra services free of charge. The quality of Total Surface Solutions' bid met the Council's quality requirements. They also offered to clean all road and street signs and street furniture adjacent to their work sites.

Both project managers from Havering and Barking and Dagenham assessed all bids thoroughly and both parties came to the same conclusion that Total Surface Solutions should be awarded the contract. Cost of the contract was the major criteria in the decision given the requirement to stick to the grant funding provided by Keep Britain Tidy.

OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED

Do nothing – the Council would lose the funding and it would not be possible to deep clean the area.

Carry out cleaning in house - Due to resource constraints at LBH in terms of staffing and equipment, LBH is unable to deep clean pavements and remove chewing gum staining with in-house teams. Should the situation have been different, officers would have sought to purchase further equipment for in-house street care teams rather than seeking to instruct a contractor to complete the works.

PRE-DECISION CONSULTATION

Councillor Mugglestone, Cabinet Member for Neighbourhoods, has been made aware of this project and is fully supportive.

Part B - Assessment of implications and risks

LEGAL IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

The Council has a statutory duty under Section 89 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 in respect of any relevant highway, to ensure that the land is kept clear of litter and refuse and that the highway or road is kept clean. Section 62 of the Highways Act 1980 also provides for a general power of improvement of streets and highways. The recommendations within this report are compatible with the above statutory duties.

The Council is a contracting authority for the purposes of the Public Contracts Regulations 2015 (as amended) (PCR). The value of the contract is below the services contracts threshold of £213,447 and therefore is not subject to the full rigours of the PCR.

Officers have undertaken a procurement process in accordance with Havering's Contract Procedure Rules (CPR) and CPR 9.8 by obtaining three comparable written quotations using the Council's e-tendering suite, Fusion. The preferred Supplier was Total Surface Solutions Limited. Officers have satisfied themselves that Total Surface Solutions' bid represented the most economically advantageous tender for the Council overall.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

The entire project will be funded via the grant funding awarded by Keep Britain Tidy (KBT). London Borough of Havering (LBH) and London Borough of Barking & Dagenham (LBBD) will not exceed the £70,000 (£0.070m) awarded for this project. The value of this contract is £34,894.44 (0.035m).

This figure breaks down as £18,545.10 (£0.019m) for deep cleaning South Street in Romford and £16,349.34 (£0.016m) for deep cleaning five District Line station forecourts in Barking and Dagenham. Total: £34,894.44 (£0.035m).

Havering will act as the lead authority and receive all funds from the grant funding provider before any works are carried out. Each Local authority will be responsible for

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Payment of invoices and retention of evidence documentation specific to their borough. As lead authority Havering will provide evidence of spend to the grant funding provider.

The deep cleaning of Romford Town Centre alongside the purchase of recyclable chewing gum bins will allow for the proper disposal of chewing gum alongside providing a clean environment for residents.

The benefits of this project are environmental and will have no positive or negative effect on climate change.
