Part A – Report seeking decision

DETAIL OF THE DECISION REQUESTED AND RECOMMENDED ACTION

For the reasons set out in the report, the Director of Legal and Governance is recommended to agree to:

- a) the award of a contract for an online legal research platform to Thomson Reuters Solutions on behalf of the London Borough of Havering for a period of three years commencing on 1 November 2022.
- b) the award of a contract for an online legal research platform to Thomson Reuters Solutions on behalf of the London Borough of Newham for a period of three years commencing on 1 November 2022.

STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The legal teams require access to an online legal platform for research purposes to assist it in effectively and accurately advising and drafting documents for departments within the Council. The legal teams advise on all areas of law including property, planning, enforcement, contracts, procurements, company law, children social care, adult social care and litigation. All teams use online legal research platforms.

The London Boroughs of Havering and Newham each have current contracts with Thomson Reuters which expires on 31 October 2022.

The London Boroughs of Havering and Newham are both members of the London Borough Legal Alliance (LBLA). The procurement was carried out by the LBLA inviting Thomson Reuters and Lexis Nexis, the only two viable providers in the market that the LBLA are aware of having carried out market research, to provide competitive pricing based on members' stated user numbers, and on the historic discounts provided to LBLA members under two previous procurement processes 3 years and 6 years ago.

The LBLA core packages were designed to include those products required by the majority of LBLA members, as agreed with the members.

Due to the proprietary nature of the service being procured the market is very limited. The publishing houses own the products and the rights to use them, so the councils have to buy the products directly from them. The councils are purchasing off the shelf products which include packages that the councils require to effectively deliver legal advice in services within both boroughs.

Officers in both councils have undertaken a demo of the Lexis Nexis product over a period of 2 months. However, feedback from officers is that the product does not have the same precedents or the full range of legal research books that officers use.

The London Borough of Havering current has 26 users a year subscribing to the service and the total spend over 3 years is anticipated to be £78,223. However, this may fluctuate if the number of users changes.

OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED

- 1. Not purchase an online legal platform officers in the legal teams need access to this to provide up to date advice and draft documents.
- 2. Undertake an in house procurement as members of the LBLA the boroughs benefit from economies of scale when the LBLA conducts a procurement on behalf of its members. If the Councils carried out their own procurement it is likely that the charges would be higher.

Part B - Assessment of implications and risks

LEGAL IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

The Council has the power to enter into contracts under the general power of competence contained in section 1 of the Localism Act 2011 which allows the Council to do anything that an individual may do subject to any statutory constraints on the Council's powers.

The Council has the power under this section to agree to the proposals in the recommendations.

The value of the proposed contracts are £78K for London Borough of Havering and £93K for London Borough of Newham over 3 years.

The Local Authorities are each a Contracting Authority for the purposes of the Public Contract Regulations 2015 (as amended) (PCR). The value of the contract is below the threshold for services of £213,477, therefore this Contract is not subject to the full rigours of the Regulations.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

The total charges will be £171,636 for both Councils over 3 years. This will be paid by oneSource and recharged to each Council. London Borough of Havering's share will be £78,223 over 3 years based on 26 users. London Borough of Newham's share over three years will be £93,413 based on 52 users.
