# Part A – Report seeking decision

#### DETAIL OF THE DECISION REQUESTED AND RECOMMENDED ACTION

Further to the cabinet decision in March 2021, the Council is progressing the scheme for the Family Welcome Centre project. The site requires demolition and security in order to progress delivery. The demolished buildings will include disused library and boxing club as well as vacated hostel building Aberombie House.

For the reasons provided in this report the Director of Housing Services is asked to approve the below threshold tendering of a demolition contractor for the Family Welcome Centre project.

## AUTHORITY UNDER WHICH DECISION IS MADE

Pursuant to Part 3.4 of the Council's Constitution, Second Tier Managers are permitted under

Contract powers

(a) To approve commencement of a tendering process for, and to award all contracts below a total contract value of £500,000.

### STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR THE DECISION

This report seeks permission to commence tender for a demolition contractor. Following consultation with procurement the tendering will be done through Havering approved supplier list using the quick quote system in line with the Contract Procedure Rules. A soft market testing was carried out to identify five potential suppliers. A further executive decision will be completed following the evaluation and completion of the tendering process.

### OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED

Rejected – To instruct a Supplier via the Bloom platform- This was rejected as this option is not available.

Rejected – Going through full tender process this would create a significant delay and is not required under procurement regulations.

# LEGAL IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

The Council has a statutory duty under Section 8 of the Housing Act 1985 to consider housing conditions in its district and the needs of the district with respect to the provision of further housing accommodation. Further section 111 of the Local Government Act 1972 permits the Council as "a local authority shall have power to do anything (whether or not involving the expenditure, borrowing or lending of money or the acquisition or disposal of any property or rights) which is calculated to facilitate, or is conducive or incidental to, the discharge of any of their functions". Section 1 of the Localism Act 2011 gives the Council a general power of competence to do anything an individual can do, subject to any statutory constraints on the Council's powers. The recommendations in this report are in keeping with these powers and duties.

The value of this tender falls below threshold for full advertisement and therefore the tender process will be compliant with the Council's Contract Procedure Rules as contained in the Council's Constituion.
