

SHOUT about the money

Havering Council Budget Consultation with Children and Young People

November 2023 - January 2024



This survey consulted children and young people in Havering about ideas to improve the Council's financial situation. The questions and answers used throughout the survey were developed from the Budget Consultation for adults. This consultation was live for public access between the 27th November 2023 and the 2nd January 2024.

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
#### Key Findings

This survey showed a significant amount of push back against the idea of increasing Council Tax. When asked directly, 75% of respondents did not think it should increase. This sentiment was reflected in other questions, and a large proportion of written responses signalled that Council Tax was already too high.

Respondents to this survey indicated a desire for greater community engagement. 'Hosting big public events' was the most popular suggestion to increase revenue for the Council. Written answers suggested raising money through community donations and volunteering, as well as calling for more consultations with the public.


When asked about the best idea to save money, the option with the most responses was 'Reduce street lighting between midnight and 5am'. Responses to the same question showed that 'Collecting bins less often' was the least popular suggestion.






### Which of the following do you think the Council should do to make money?




### Which of the following community services should the Council review its spending on?


#### Havering are considering increasing Council Tax, how much do you think they should increase it by?




#### If the Council started charging people for parking a car at local Parks, would this affect you?





Higher council tax will be detrimental to all families especially those who are struggling during Christmas and high price times. Especially since some people may not be able to afford both council tax and weekly food shopping. If the council need more money, they should hold more festivals and markets as these raise lots of money and people enjoy them, so this would boost tourism, the economy and the general feel about the council. Additionally, higher car park fees affect my family greatly and many others, and if we are not parking in Havering because of the cost, we shall go somewhere else, and this would reduce the amount of money coming into the council primarily, causing them to lose money.

I believe that the Council should not support the elderly with transport deductions as most have their own cars and instead it should help building more playgrounds for existing children. Also, local pubs should be charged more, as this is not a necessity and spend on necessities for the community. Also some money could be gained from renting venues, which could be increased.
