Policy context: Education outcomes

SUMMARY

This report updates members of the Committee on the provisional outcomes of the 2023 statutory assessments within the primary and secondary sectors. It includes headline figures for:

- Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS);
- Year 1 Phonics Check:
- Key Stage 1 results;
- Key Stage 2 results;
- Key Stage 4 results;
- Key Stage 5 results.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Members should note the content of the report and the performance of Havering schools and academies in relation to national standards, outcomes across London, and in comparison to statistical neighbours.

REPORT DETAIL

Note: 152 Local Authorities nationally; 33 London boroughs; 11 statistical neighbours

Havering: 10 Infant, 10 Junior and 39 Primary Schools, 18 Secondary Academies, 6 Academy Sixth Forms, 3 Special Schools

It should be noted that achievement across all key stages decreased in 2022 and 2023 compared to pre-Covid examinations. This is a national picture that also affects Havering.

1. The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)

1.1 Standards in the EYFS in Havering are broadly at the national average – see Table 1. The proportion of children achieving a Good Level of Development (GLD) in Havering remained at 65% in 2023, national did increase by 2 percentage points.

2. Year 1 Phonics Check

2.1 Similar to Early years the percentage of Year 1 pupils meeting the required standard remained at 77% in 2023, standards in Havering remain roughly inline with the national average and are generally in line with our neighbouring London boroughs and our statistical neighbours – see Table2 with the percentage of pupils having become static nationally and in London in recent years.

3. Key Stage 1 (KS1)

3.1 Overall, standards at Key Stage 1 remain above the national average in all subjects, being top 3 amongst statistical neighbours and in the top quintile for Writing and top 40% for Reading and Maths.

4. Key Stage 2 (KS2) - Attainment

- 4.1 Standards at Key Stage 2 in all subjects (and when combined) are above the national average, and better that the outcomes achieved by other London boroughs and our statistical neighbours.
- 4.2 The proportion of pupils achieving the Expected Standard in Reading, Writing and Mathematics combined increased by 1 percentage point in 2023, following the decline in 2022 after examinations resumed. Havering is 3%pts above the national average see Table 4.

4.3 Standards attained are also above our London neighbours, significantly higher than our statistical neighbours placing Havering in the second quintile of Local Authorities.

5. Key Stage 2 (KS2) - Progress

- 5.1 The DfE has yet to produce/publish progress measures for 2023.
- 5.2 Due to the pandemic, pupils in year 2 in 2019/20 and during 2020/21 did not get assessed at Key Stage 1 (at least not as a statutory assessment). This means that those pupils have no KS1 start point for their KS1 to KS2 progress measures as they reach the end of year six in 2024 and 2025 respectively.

6. Key Stage 4 (GCSE's) - Attainment

- 6.1 Standards in the GCSEs in Havering are above national. The average Attainment 8 score in 2023 was 47.3 above the national average of 46.3. This places Havering in the second quintile nationally and above the majority of its statistical neighbours.
- 6.2 Outcomes have fluctuated over the last few years, with the ongoing changes in exams and methodology however it has remained consistently above national.

6.3 Havering performs extremely well in terms of entry into the Ebacc, being more than 22.3%pts higher than national resulting being in the top quintile nationally for the last five years and 1st amongst Statistical Neighbours.

6.4 The percentage of pupils achieving an Ebacc decreased 4.7%pts in 2023 however Havering remains 8.2%pts above national and ranked in the top quintile.

6.5 Havering had a 2.4%pts decrease on 2022 but remains 4.1%pts above National. This results in Havering moving to the top 40% nationally, 1st amongst its Statistical Neighbours.

7. Key Stage 4 (GCSE's) - Progress

- 7.1 Progress nationally will always remain static with state-funded schools being marginally below 0. The DfE did not publish Progress 8 for 2020 and 2021 during the COVID period as grades were teacher assessed.
- 7.2 Progress 8 in Havering increased 0.08pts from 2022 to be broadly in line with national in 2023. Historically Havering has always been in the middle quintile at the end of Key stage 4 this is regarded due to high prior attainment at Key Stage 2 this remains true.

8. Key Stage 5 (A-Level's) - Attainment

A/AS levels in 2020 and 2021 were awarded predominately through centre-assessment grades (what a school or college believed a student would most likely have achieved had exams gone ahead); for vocational and technical qualifications (VTQs) awarding organisations were often able to use evidence of work already completed for CAGs. For other VTQ qualifications adapted assessment meant calculation was not needed at all. There was no national standardisation/moderation and some boroughs increased their attainment by significantly large percentages.

For all indicators both national and local authority the attainment trend increases and peaks in 2021 which was the second year of teacher assessed grades. Both then declined in 2022 and 2023 with examinations resuming reflecting the national trends.

8.1 Outcomes have fluctuated over the last few years, with the ongoing changes in exams and methodology calculations. The six academy sixth forms have remained above national and has resulted in Havering now being ranked 2nd amongst statistical neighbours and 58th nationally, placing in the top 40%. Havering schools decreased by 5.0 percentage points in 2023 marginally above national.

8.3 Outcomes for the best 3 A-Levels have fluctuated over the last few years, with the ongoing changes in exams and methodology calculations however they have not improved as rapidly as elsewhere nationally or as swiftly as other London boroughs. Nevertheless, this year we have consistently outperformed our statistical neighbours currently ranked 6th and 72nd nationally. Havering schools decreased by 3%pts in 2023.

8.4 The percentage of pupils achieving grades AAB or better at A-level for the last 5 years have remained below that of national, rank against statistical neighbours has declined steadily. Havering dropped 10%pts to 9.7% in 2023. It's uncertain whether this is due to a drop in children eligible having selected at least two facilitating subjects at A-Levels or equivalent (there is no obligation to do so) and this was true in all sixth-forms.
