### Part A - Report seeking decision

### DETAIL OF THE DECISION REQUESTED AND RECOMMENDED ACTION

This report recommends that the Director of Environment:

- Notes the procurement process conducted through the Council's approved consultancy framework Matrix; and
- Approves the award of a contract to MP Smarter Travel Limited (Company number 12937092) at the cost of £0.076m using the DEFRA Air Quality Grant fund to deliver agreed projects to Havering Schools six walking buses, five cycling buses, eleven Breathe Clean workshops and walking maps and eleven anti-idling workshops.

### STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR THE DECISION

### **Background**

- In July 2022, the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA) published a new funding opportunity available to all Local Authorities in England. Funding was made available through a competitive bidding process to help with local authorities' efforts in improving air quality, in order to meet their statutory duties under the Environmental Act 1995 as amended by the Environment Act 2021.
- 2. Funding was specifically made available to help local authorities work towards government targets for fine particulate matter, which presents the greatest risks to public health. In addition, funding was made available for boroughs to deliver initiatives that help with communicating effectively about air quality, particularly to vulnerable groups.
- 3. The aforementioned DEFRA funding needs to have been spent in either the 2023/24 or 2024/25 financial years (or across both) with funding having to be spent and projects delivered by March 2025.

### **Policy Context**

- 4. At national level the government's Clean Air Strategy recognises that transport, "...has a key role to play in reducing emissions and meeting the government's objectives on the environment and public health". Promoting cycling and walking helps reduce emissions and encourages an active lifestyle.
- 5. At a regional level, the Mayor's Transport Strategy sets out the Mayor's vision and objectives for developing the transport network across London up to 2041. This includes a London wide target of 80% of Londoners to be walking, cycling and using public transport by 2041. The Mayor's Transport Strategy also includes targets for reducing particulate matter (PM) and nitrogen oxides (NOx).
- 6. Havering's Local Implementation Plan (LIP) sets out how the borough will deliver the Mayor's Transport Strategy at a local level. This includes Havering specific targets to improve air quality, encourage alternative options to travel other than the car and a target for 65% of residents to be walking, cycling or using public transport by 2041.
- 7. The Council adopted an Air Quality Plan in 2018. More recently, Havering updated its adopted Climate Change Action Plan setting out how the Council will become a carbon neutral authority by 2040 or sooner.

### **Funding Award**

- 8. Following a funding application process, the Council was awarded £100,266 funding from DEFRA. This funding was allocated for a number of initiatives including:
  - Delivery of walking and cycling busses for schools
  - School Breath Clean Workshops
  - Walking zone maps
  - Anti-Idling workshops
  - Air Quality Theatre in Education
- 9. The funds are to be spent in their entirety on the projects described in the project plan contained in Havering's funding application. The Council has the discretion to distribute

the funding received to the projects contained within the project plan. Funding can also be "lifted and shifted" between projects during the financial year. Any changes to those projects would require prior agreement from the Air Quality and Industrial Emissions teams at DEFRA.

10. The funding award was accepted through a Non Key Executive Decision signed by the Director of Neighbourhoods (now referred to as Place Environment) in March 2023.

### **Delivery Timescales**

11. The awarded funding has to be spent, and associated projects delivered by March 2025.

### **Procurement Process**

- 12. A number of projects require an external resource in order to be delivered by the end of March 2025. A request was submitted to the Council's Recruitment Panel to seek approval to undertake a procurement process to deliver air quality projects on the Council's behalf.
- 13. Officers undertook a mini tender competition through the online procurement platform Matrix MM, inviting four reputable companies to submit tenders for the project. Out of the four companies invited to bid, only one tender was received.
- 14. Officers undertook a full evaluation of the tender using the Council's corporate evaluation process with a 70% Price and 30% Quality ratio.
- 15. Officers completed the procurement exercise to appoint a capable consultant to deliver the projects set out in the funding award. This involved undertaking a Tender Evaluation of the scores for Quality and Price on Matrix MM.
- 16. The successful supplier is MP Smarter Travel, a company with twelve years of school engagement projects regarding transport, active travel, road safety, air quality, school travel plans, healthy route creation, theatre in schools, breathe clean assemblies and idling action events. MP Smarter Travel's experience includes Idling Action London, Brent Breathe Clean, Towers Hamlets School Travel Plan support, Westminster Air Quality Monitoring, Camden School Superzone.
- 17. The Council have worked with MP Smarter Travel in the past on a number of projects including Ant-Idling workshops, the development and delivery Walking Maps and Travel Surveys.

### **Next Steps**

18. Subject to this Non-Key Executive Decision being signed by the Director of Environment MP Smarter Travel will be appointed via the Matrix MM framework.

### OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED

19. The option of not appointing MP Smarter Travel has been rejected at this would mean the Council would be unable to deliver the Air Quality improvement projects as agreed with the grant provider. The Council also has air quality reduction targets it needs to work towards which are contained within the Council's approved Local Implementation Plan (LIP3).

### Part B - Assessment of implications and risks

### **LEGAL IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS**

- 20. The Environmental Act 1995 (the Act) requires local authorities to undertake periodic assessments and reviews of current and future air quality in their borough, and to produce an Air Quality Action Plan once an Air Quality Management Area has been declared within a Local Authority's boundaries. The recommendation within this report seeks to meet the objectives within the Council's Air Quality Action Plan.
- 21. The value of the proposed award is estimated to be £76,000 which is below the threshold for services the Public Contracts Regulations 2015 (PCR) (as amended) and was therefore not subject to the full rigours of the Regulations.
- 22. The procurement process followed is set out in the body of this report. In accordance with Contract Procedure Rule 17.5, Officers sourced the proposed consultant via the approved consultant framework (currently Matrix Managed Marketplace portal).

### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS AND RISKS

- 23. The total cost of this appointment (£0.076m) will be funded via the Department of Environment and Rural Affairs (DEFRA) grant.
- 24. The projects must be delivered by March 2025 in order to make full use of the grant.
- 25. The grant will be used solely for the projects described in the project plan contained in Havering's funding application. Any changes to those projects would require prior agreement from the Air Quality and Industrial Emissions teams at DEFRA.
- 26. Budget and contract monitoring will be regularly carried out by officers throughout delivery to ensure the project is completed within the approved grant Project Expectations.

27. The recommendations made in this report do not appear to give rise to any identifiable HR risks or implications that would affect either the Council or its workforce.
