You have me trapped in unsuitable housing where I can not shower or go out. I am getting worse with everything and you do not care. I have and am experiencing negligence from you and various support teams. So I have no doubt that you will fail others too. Access to mental health care is a huge problem- waiting lists are so long that by the time a child accesses support their access to education has been affected for literally years. That in turn affects their ability to contribute to society as adults. It's a terrible scandal, not just in Havering but across the country. As for 'promises' by the council, what is the consequence of breaking the promise? A promise is just words if there is no legal duty (and of course there already is a legal duty to ensure disabilities, including mental healthcare, don't affect access to education, and yet the council is currently failing miserably at this, with no consequences.) As a headteacher, I believe that this aim is firmly left to schools to fulfil. From experience, Social Care do not always have the manpower and time to deliver this consistently enough for the children, often advocating apps to use rather than face to face conversations. The role of a school has changed dramatically over the last 10 years, with them becoming hubs rather than a place of learning where the emotional needs of children and their adults is taking more and more time away from their education. The lack of outside agencies to provide this service has also had a major impact with parents struggling to cope.	I agree that schools do this, but am unclear as to how other services promote the life choices of the children.	As a DSL in a junior school, I have mixed experiences with this. We are rarely updated as to the actions of Social Care outside of meetings, and when incidents have happened which may impact the child who we welcome into school.
